Dear friends,

As we enter the second last Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Gospel places us before the mystery of the "end times"—not to frighten us, but to remind us of what truly endures. Jesus invites us to live with **eschatological hope**: to look toward the final fulfilment of God's Kingdom (the *eschaton*) while remaining steadfast and faithful in the present moment.

This spirit of hope has been beautifully alive in our parish during the Jubilee Year of 2025. Currently, Fr David is leading our pilgrims through the eternal city of Rome, walking through the Holy Doors of the basilicas and praying at sacred sites.

Here at our local church, Our Lady of Dolours Chatswood, we have been blessed to welcome many pilgrims here at our **Shrine of Hope**, from within our Diocese of Broken Bay and beyond. It is such a joy to see hearts drawn to prayer: to adore the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, to venerate the relics, learn about the saints, pray, and feel welcomed. This has inspired countless others who visit our shrine. As we look to the year ahead—and towards 2028 and the Eucharistic Congress—we are discerning new pathways and possibilities to deepen this spirit of pilgrimage and make our Shrine a true home of encounter and hope.

Our community's heart for mission continues. This weekend's **Cebu Fundraising Dinner** will gather us in generosity to support those in need—an expression of our belief that the Church is truly universal, and that even small acts of charity ripple far beyond our borders.

This week on Tuesday, we also commend to the Lord the soul of **Gerard Say**—a man faithful to God, who poured out his life in service to our parish community. Let us hold his family in our prayers, grateful for his presence among us and the witness of his faith.

Looking ahead, it is an honour for our parish to host **Red Wednesday** once again. It is a privilege to unite in prayer with Bishop Anthony, remembering and supporting our brothers and sisters around the world who are persecuted for their faith in Jesus. May our solidarity bring comfort, and may our prayers bring hope. This week's usual Wednesday evening Mass will be celebrated as Red Wednesday at 7:00 pm.

Next Sunday, the **Solemnity of Christ the King**, we will begin the **reintroduction of the Chalice** at Mass—both weekday and weekend. Our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will receive a refresher to ensure that the beautiful gift of the Precious Blood is offered and received with dignity and reverence.

Finally, over the next three weekends we will be running our **Parish Pulse Survey**. This is an opportunity for us to listen to one another—to understand what we are doing well and where we can grow as a parish family. You can complete the survey online using the link or QR code provided, or in print during Mass. Teens aged 12–18 will have their own survey available in print. This will become a regular part of our parish life each November, giving us a chance to reflect on how we are growing as a parish family. Your voice is a gift— and thank you for sharing it with us!



May the Lord strengthen us to persevere in faith, to stand firm in hope, and to walk together as one parish family.



Gerard Say RIP



With deep sadness, we share the news of the recent passing of our long-standing parishioner, Gerard Say. Gerard was a beloved and faithful member of our community for many decades. His life of service, prayer, and friendship leaves a lasting legacy among us.

Below is a reflection on Gerard's life and his generous contribution to our parish, written by Professor Gerard Ryan.



"We were saddened to learn of the recent death of long-standing parishioner Gerard Say, following a fall at home. Gerard was born in Sydney and his family spent some time in Wagga Wagga. He had one sister (now deceased). After his father's passing in the 1970s, Gerard and his mother Marie moved to Chatswood and they became well-known figures in our parish community. Marie (now deceased) was very involved the Catholic Women's League (among other things).

Gerard was equally involved in our parish. He was an Acolyte (serving on the Altar for many years), Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (who never actually retired), Reader (who was still in fine voice reading at 10:30 am Mass the weekend before his fall and sad passing) and Singer. Gerard was an outstanding Reader. A tall man with a big chest, he had a wonderful ability to project his voice. His mastery of the English language and ability to put the emphasis, modulation and pauses in all the right places meant that he truly did effectively proclaim God's word (rather than just read it). He was a regular Reader at the Sunday 10:30 am Mass and at the Easter Vigil. He was also a Narrator in the famous Passion Play which ran in the parish each Easter from the 1970s to the 1990s. Gerard also had an excellent singing voice. You could hear him from the other side of the church, carrying the congregation most enthusiastically and mastering a diverse range of hymns. Gerard was also an enthusiastic and long-standing member of our Family Groups.

Gerard was a man who was genuinely interested in others and took the time to stop and ask you how you were. He remembered the fine details of any problem you had previously disclosed. Those who had experience of Gerard as a School Principal always spoke highly of him and the time he devoted to meet with families who needed his time. Outside of the Church, Gerard was involved in Rotary. In his retirement, you would often find him doing his shopping or having coffee in Chatswood Chase. He was only too happy to stop and chat.

We have lost a giant of our parish family. So next time you come to Mass, sing that little louder in memory of Gerard. We give thanks for his life and his enormous contribution both to our parish family over 5 decades and to Catholic education in Wagga Wagga and Broken Bay. We extend our condolences to his niece Louisa and her family.

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."

This week, on Thursday afternoon, we welcomed parishioners led by Fr Richard from **Pittwater parish**.



To donate to ACN:



The persecution of Christians throughout the world remains a constant, and in some cases, growing threat. In countries like Nigeria, Christians face systemic discrimination, violence, and persecution every day.

The situation has become increasingly unliveable for many because of the terrorist group Boko Haram, whose insurgency has displaced nearly 2.9 million people. Priests have been kidnapped or murdered and the Christian population is being treated as second-class citizens.

While we can often feel far removed from these conflicts, they affect the body of Christ and demand a response.

Red November is a global movement led by Catholic charity Aid to the Church in Need (ACN), uniting tens of thousands of people to shine a spotlight on Christian persecution. Cathedrals and churches across Australia and New Zealand will be lit in red, to symbolise the blood of the martyrs, including in Chatswood.

Red Wednesday is a chance to unite in prayer to show solidarity with persecuted Christians suffering increased violence, persecution and human rights abuses worldwide.

Cardinal Mykola Bychok, Australia's first official Ambassador for Red November, encouraged all Catholics to pray and offer Masses this Red November.

"Through Red Wednesday and Red November, we shine a light into places of darkness. We remind the world that behind statistics are real people: fathers and mothers, children and grandparents, whose only "crime" is the courage to believe, to pray, to live their faith," said the cardinal.

"It is not just about remembering distant lands. It is about remembering that the freedom we enjoy today was purchased by the courage and sacrifice of those who came before us. ...Their witness strengthens our faith, their sacrifice calls forth our love."

Bishop Anthony Randazzo will celebrate Mass to pray for persecuted Christians on Wednesday, 19 November at Our Lady of Dolours Church, Chatswood at 7:00pm. All are welcome to join.

THE END IS NOT SO SOON. Members of the early Church expected the Lord to return in glory very soon. Some people even stopped working in the belief that the end was nigh. St Paul, however, urged the members of the community to go on working, quietly earning their food. And in today's Gospel, Jesus stresses that the end is not so soon. We, his followers, will first have to persevere faithfully through many trials.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

GOD'S PROTECTIVE PROMISE

Last Sunday we commemorated the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. The Gospel then was from John with Jesus cleansing the Temple and its precincts, restoring it as the rightful abode of God's presence and holiness. Today's Gospel, continuing our liturgical journey with Luke, touches again on the theme of the Temple. But this time, Jesus anticipates its destruction and then springboards Gospel listeners into a sermon on the endtime. The Gospel theme prepares us for the final Sundays of the year before the new liturgical year, Year A and Matthew's Gospel, commences in two weeks' time with the beginning of Advent.

Today's Gospel is complex and often misunderstood. It requires careful explanation. Our selection comes from Luke's 'apocalyptic' chapter. Here the evangelist draws on Mk 13 but reshapes it in the light of the audience's experience and memory of Jerusalem's destruction by Rome in 70 CE. This experience is retrojected on to Jesus' teaching seeming to prophesy its destruction. In Jesus' day the Temple was still standing; by the time Luke writes, Jerusalem and its Temple are already destroyed.

Luke's apocalyptic teaching acknowledges the struggle of Jesus' faithful followers living generations after Jesus public ministry, assuring them of God's comforting presence, warning them not to be carried away by messianic pretenders, and encouraging their patient endurance in all that unfolds. The last words of the Gospel contain the essence of God's protective promise: '...not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.' We, too, lean into these words amid our struggles today.





Our St Vincent de Paul October Report

OLOD Vinnies received 18 requests for help during October. Four were from families (one new) whose heads we are trying to keep above water whilst seeking more permanent solutions. Four others suffer from mental problems which affect coping abilities. Medical expenses, some associated with children with disorders, accounted for two others (in one of these we are assisting Catholic Care). One other sought furniture help to accommodate an unexpected return home of an adult child. The others were of a more usual nature for food, furnishing, clothing, and help with bills. Some \$2,700 was expended. We sometimes get asked by those we assist why we do this work—our responses give us the opportunity to practise some evangelising.

As you can see, there is a constant drain on available resources. Our Summer Appeal will be on 6/7 December. We hope that again you will be generous to the needs of our neighbours seeking help.

Did you know?

Did you know that if you wish to cut down a tree on your property you would need to seek approval from your local council and pay a fee? Even then your request would likely be refused under tree preservation provisions.

However, if a woman chooses to have an abortion, there are currently no restrictions on doing so. This is a deeply troubling reality that overlooks the sacred, God-given dignity of every human person—both before and after birth.

In NSW we have laws against cruelty to animals which attract a maximum penalty of \$22,000 or a maximum of 5 years jail in prison. But a doctor who dismembers an unborn baby in the process of abortion faces no legal penalty but is in fact financially rewarded for his/her action. The Animal Justice Party attracts sufficient support to have an elected representative in Parliament. But there is no one elected to speak for the innocent babies who are brutally killed in the process of abortion.


