



Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

Luke 12:13-21

The question that opens this Sunday's Gospel has to do with inheritance. Jewish inheritance customs are legislated in Deuteronomy 21:15–17 and in Numbers 27:1–11. The foundation of Jewish inheritance law is that sons are their father's heirs. The eldest son receives a double share of his father's goods. If no sons survive the father, then the inheritance passes to the father's daughters. If no children survive the father, the inheritance goes to the closest male kinsmen on the father's side.

The person questioning Jesus in Luke's parable is likely not the eldest son but someone who disagrees with the traditional Jewish inheritance laws. Jesus responds with this question: "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" (21:14). Disputes over inheritance require that an arbitrator be chosen, usually a distant relative whose decision the parties will honor. The person's request then does not meet the usual criteria for an arbitrator. From Jesus's response, we can assume that Jesus is suspicious that the man's motive is greed.

Jesus uses this situation to address the human struggle with greed. Greed is the vice that incites a person to continually seek more possessions for the sake of having more. Jesus then shares with the crowd the parable of the foolish, rich man. After having an overabundance of produce grown in one year, the rich man ponders what he should do with the excess because he does not have barns large enough to store the harvest. He comes to this conclusion: "I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods" (21:18). The man puts his security in possessing a lot of material things, which, in the end, is a false security. He imagines that he can control his life. Having possessions creates an illusion of being secure into the future This is the proverbial expression of the hedonist, someone who does not believe in life after death, or judgment. The rich man in the parable never considers sharing his abundance with others. In 12:29, Luke condemns a life devoted to such pursuits. In the end, the wealth and possessions this rich man had worked for are divided among his heirs. All his earthly possessions did not help him.

In our parish there are so many opportunities for the nourishment of our faith. In our bulletin this week, we show some photos of the wonderful series of seminars provided by the Sydney apologist, Robert Haddad in our Harrington Hall last Saturday. A special thank you to the team that made the day, also hosted by the Legion of Mary, as effective for all those participating.

Coming up we have a great series on the Gospels by Bishop Emeritus David Walker (starting 13 August). On 15 August, a new series of Alpha commences. And then, towards the end of August, a new series of Exploring the Faith commences. These are in addition to the number of prayer and study groups we have occurring every month. Hopefully, one or more of these opportunities will be of personal benefit to different people.

Next Saturday evening, 6 August, we will be joined at our 5.30pm Mass by students from Mercy College assisting with music and ministry. Our practice of having students from Pius X College and Mercy College lead us at a monthly Sunday evening Mass has been severely disrupted over the past couple of years by COVID. However, with the start of Term 3 this year we are hoping to reinstate it. The thought however was to experiment with this Mass on a Saturday evening rather than a Sunday.

We have a very special event on the following Saturday—13 August. As we can see on page 11, we are having a parish community dinner to assist awareness of the 7 men who are preparing for priesthood for our Diocese. It will be a wonderful occasion for us to come together as a parish community in Harrington Hall, to meet the men, and to demonstrate our support of them. Please do register your interest through the details in the promotion later in the bulletin.

We are continuing to work to improve our facilities. We now have a wonderful new storage shed at the back of the parish office-car park. With this now complete we will be able to make the area immediately behind the parish office more hospitable. We have also begun work refurbishing the Sacristy of our church: with the installation of a new toilet, and work benches. A new fence has gone up on the northern boundary of the presbytery, and soon we will commence work on renovating the downstairs, at least, of the parish office—well in need of a make-over! All of this has been made possible through the generosity of our people.

Our Parish Pastoral and Missionary Council meets again this coming Tuesday evening. We will reflect further on Being Church in the City: We Journey Together. We are considering how best to make available the wonderful dreams we shared from Stage 2, What are our dreams? We are now at Stage 3 of the Journey: Where are we Today? This has been informed by the National Church Life Survey we undertook in February and our Parish Census from May, as well as additional surveys undertaken recently at Our Lady of Dolours Primary School. On one of the weekends in August our PPMC will provide an update to our parish on the journey at the service of entering our Stage 4: What is our Mission?

One advance notice. Monday 15 August is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses on the day will be at 10am for Mercy College (all welcome), 12.30pm and at 8.00pm.
