Dear friends,

We are trialing a slightly different format of our bulletin this week! As you will see the ordering of the sections is different under the three banners: Come and See!—Come and Grow!—Come and Serve! This is to align with your mission: We Love, We Grow, We Serve. Let us know if this be a helpful way for us to navigate all the many activities and programs we are blessed to have in our parish. We will continue to refine the presentation in the weeks ahead.

On this Mission Sunday weekend we welcome Lawrence Gigliotti from Catholic Missions for our annual Catholic Missions Appeal. This is an appeal that assists the Church in developing contexts, and Lawrence will share with us the work that Catholic Missions undertakes and invite us to assist in this endeavour.

On Monday 20 October, the Jubilee Migrant Cross will be at our church. This is a special initiative of the Australian Bishops Commission for Evangelisation, Laity and Ministry. "As we celebrate the Jubilee Year 2025, the Jubilee Cross stands before us as a sacred and deeply moving sign of God's love for all people, especially those who journey in search of safety, belonging and peace. Created from Australian timber and set upon a boat-shaped base, the Jubilee Cross speaks to the heart of the migrant experience and the call of the Church to be a refuge and a home for all." From October 2025 to October 2026 more than 28 dioceses and eparchies are expected to host the Cross. We will celebrate our 12.30pm Mass on Monday 20 October with the Cross.

On Monday 27 October at our 12.30pm Mass we will be joined by relatives of Minnie Walshe, recently departed. Our Mass on that day will be a Memorial Mass for Minnie.

It is now not too long before the month of November during which we remember all those who have gone before us. This year we will commemorate those who have died in a slightly different . We will have a choice to purchase a battery operated candle OR to bring along a framed photograph of the one we are remembering. The battery operated candle will avoid people having to look for their candle and to light the candle when they come to Mass, and all candles can be switched on and off remotely. If we wish to bring along a photo, the frame must be no bigger than A5 size, and we do so at our own risk.

This Wednesday evening there is a special rally to be held outside NSW Parliament in Macquarie Street on Wednesday, 22 October at 5.30pm to support the introduction of MLC John Ruddick's Bill to ban sex-selection abortion in the State We are encouraged to attend to send a clear message to Parliament that every baby deserves a chance at life – no matter their gender.






# Pilgrimage of the Migrant Jubilee Cross 2025-2026 Monday 20 October at our 12.30pm Mass

This vision of St John in the Book of Revelation is not only wishful thinking. It is God's dream for our approaching future: a gathering of people of all cultural backgrounds and languages praising God with one voice. And that is one that we can start to live here on earth. As Pope Leo says, in the face of so much global disruption, "it is important that there be a growing desire in people's hearts for a future of peace and of respect for the dignity of all. Such a future is essential to God's plan for humanity and the rest of creation."\*

Later on in St John's vision, one of the elders explains that these people have gone "out of the great ordeal" and have been made new in Christ. When we have been through suffering and tragedy, such as those who have faced religious persecution, exile or the trauma of dislocation, we share our common dependence and vulnerability under the cross of Christ. We learn to appreciate the gifts of life, safety and freedom, and grow in compassion for others.

So this reminds us to value the faith and resilience of migrants; they help us to sing even stronger together in praise and trust of our God. This is symbolised in so many ways by this Migrant Cross.

The Australian wood and Southern Cross deepen our connection with this land, which has been blessed by God. After a long journey through many ordeals, the stars guide the way as they shine with the light of Christ.

The relics are markers of faithfulness. The first is from the Holy Family. As they were forced to flee to Egypt, Jesus walks in understanding and solidarity with all migrants. The second is from St Mary of the Cross MacKillop. She helped shape a society of refuge and welcome, where we live the values of God's kingdom.



# October—The Month of the Rosary

Our Blessed Mother in her apparitions at Fatima in 1917 identified herself as The Lady of the Rosary. She appeared to three shepherd children Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco and repeatedly exhorted them to pray the rosary for world peace and the salvation of souls, to do penance and make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. At that time the Great War was raging across Europe and she foretold that a greater war would follow during the reign of Pope Pius XI if mankind did not listen to her advice and repent. World War II as predicted by Our Lady has come and gone and it appears that mankind has not adhered to Our Lady's request to pray the rosary daily for peace.

According to pious tradition, the idea of the Rosary was given to Saint Dominic when the Virgin Mary appeared to him in an apparition in the year 1214. This Marian apparition is given the title of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Dominican priest and theologian Blessed Alan de la Roche promoted the practice of the Rosary by establishing the "fifteen rosary promises" and founding several rosary confraternities.

The rosary is the favorite prayer of heaven and earth. No other prayer has been recommended by Our Lady in her visitations from heaven to earth like the rosary. No other prayer has been so frequently praised, commended and even commanded by the Popes, or enriched by them with such great indulgences as the rosary.

Devotion to the Rosary is one of the most distinguishable features of popular Catholic spirituality. The Rosary inspires us to meditate on the mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary. Meditation is an important part of our lives as Catholics. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, meditation "engages thought, imagination, emotion and desire. This mobilization of faculties is necessary in order to deepen our convictions of faith, prompt the conversion of our heart and strengthen our will to follow Christ." It makes sense to recommend the rosary especially given that Our Lady herself has asked us to pray it assuring us, that said with faith, it will bring us spiritual benefits, be an effective instrument in changing hearts and help to promote peace in our troubled world.

We have the Marian Movement of Priests (MMP) Rosary (also known as the Cenacle) every Monday at 11.45 am (MMP Cenacle)

**Daily rosary** is prayed every Tuesday to Saturday following the 9 am Mass and after the 12.30 pm Mass every Monday to Friday.

# **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

## HOPEFUL EXPECTATION

'What is the good of praying if wars and evil things continue to exist? Prayer seems to have no effect.' A similar concern existed in Luke's day: why pray if it seems ineffectual? Today's Gospel speaks to the heart of this. It takes the form of a parable, encouraging constant prayer. The parable concerns an unjust judge ignoring a troubling and annoying widow who seeks justice against an adversary—even though one translation inaccurately describes her antagonist as an 'enemy'. The widow needs help, and the judge refuses her request. That is, until she continues to badger him; finally, he relinquishes.

Luke's Jesus uses the story as a classical way of describing God: if the judge finally relents through persistent pleading how much more quickly will God respond to those who cry out for help. Prayer opens the one praying to God's presence, allowing God to act within the one praying for what is needed. This deeply religious perspective affects the pray-er in daily life. This in turn shapes wider social contact, which effects relationships and, eventually, global change. Local personal prayer has, though imperceptibly, universal influence.

The last sentence of the Gospel speaks into this global perspective: 'When the Son of Man comes will he find faith on earth?' In other words, in the eschaton, at the definitive coming of Christ at the end of time, will people have given up conviction that prayer is effective and that God responds to the cry of the needy? Today's Gospel encourages us to pray, constantly and with hopeful expectation.





# **Our St Vincent de Paul Conference September Report**

Through your support for our appeals and poor box donations Chatswood was able to respond to a record 22 requests for help in September expending over \$2000. It never ceases to amaze us how difficult it is for some people to manage to live. Five of the requests came from people with mental difficulties, 2 from families of Asian background ineligible or Centrelink benefits one of whom is an asylum seeker. Sickness was the reason for another request, one elderly person sought companionship as much as anything else. Most of the others came from people weighed down with difficulties without the life skills to cope which most of us take for granted. A homeless lass advised of having a very tough upbringing and family being in jail. She confessed of drug addiction but that she was currently clean. She said she had unhappy recent relationships including DV. She had very few belongings. We helped her with food, clothing, Opal top up and told her about places where she could do washing. We are looking for more volunteers to help meet the high demand for help. # An Appeal from Mariza Sollano (a Filipino parishioner) whose hometown in Cebu was affected by the recent earthquakes.

Dear friends,

My hometown of Bogo City was the epicentre of the 6.9 magnitude earthquake that hit the Philippines on 30 Sept. To date, the aftershocks are relentless and there had been over 8,000 recorded already with many over 5.0 magnitude.

I have been coordinating with my friends from uni to support activities on the ground such as the supply of water filters and aid packages in various towns. The road to rehabilitation is a long one. In fact I refused to see what is left of our family home. I am fundraising to support the earthquake survivors.

On 15 November, we are holding a fundraising dinner at Harrington Hall at Chatswood Parish. It will be an all-Cebuano fare.

We are home cooks who cook from the heart. We will treat you to a culinary journey of foods from our childhood: salads from the land and from the sea. Mains that features tomato-based sour fish soup from our island, 3-hr slow cooked pork, goat casserole with meat that in rich sauce and meat that falls off the bone, vegetable dishes enriched with the creaminess of coconuts. Desserts that will remind you of Mexico as you relish on "pintos" — a sweet young corn dessert akin to tamales. Enjoy the mochi-like peanut-filled glutinous dumplings, and our sticky rice, mango and hot chocolate made of 100% cacao drink offering as to mention a few.




