Dear friends,

November is the month during which we remember all those who have gone before us. This year we will commemorate those who have died in a slightly different way. We will have a choice to purchase a battery operated candle OR to bring along a framed photograph of the one we are remembering. The battery operated candle will avoid people having to look for their candle and to light the candle when they come to Mass, and all candles can be switched on and off remotely. If we wish to bring along a photo, the frame must be no bigger than A5 size, and we do so at our own risk.

We also have a **Remembrance Book available at the corner of the sanctuary** where we can record the names of those we wished to be remembered in our prayer through the coming month.

Envelopes for November Masses for the Dead are also available at the entrances to our church. Please note that for these particular Masses it is not possible to nominate a particular day or time. Our priests will offer the Mass in the coming year for the loved one we wished to be remembered in this way.

This Monday 3 November a number of our parishioners depart for a Year of Jubilee Pilgrimage to Rome, Assisi and Medjugorje. We have 35 in our band of pilgrims mostly from our own parish but also with others joining us from various parts of the diocese and across Australia. We arrive in Rome on 4 November and through the days following will visit the four papal basilicas each with their Jubilee Holy Door that is opened every 25 years. On Sunday 9 November we travel to Assisi for several days. Some will then return to Sydney, and others of us will travel on to have some days in Medjugorje. Most of us will arrive home on the evening of Tuesday 18 November. Please keep us all in prayer. Might you have a petition you would like us to carry to Assisi and the tomb of Carlo Acutis? If so please write your petition and place in the box in the foyer of the church.

I am very grateful to Fr Anselam and to Fr Hien and our parish team for all they will do over the coming weeks in my absence.

Through the month of **November we undertake a count of Mass attendees**. This will take place by our Welcomers at the time of the Offertory at each Mass. These statistics are very helpful to understand our community growth.

And also through November we conduct a segment of our annual Pastoral Works Fund Appeal that supports the wonderful work of our parish catechists. This financial year our parish is obligated to raise \$92,000 for this Fund. Our generosity to meet our target will be very appreciated! Thank you!





It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die – but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

After the priest raises the paten with the bread and prays, and then the chalice, we respond to each prayer:

P. Pray, brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

R. May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

OUR BELOVED DEAD

Today we remember our Beloved Dead. We also carry them into today's liturgy, just as the widow's son in today's Gospel is carried into the presence of Jesus. The story begins with Jesus gathering near the gate of Nain with his disciples and others. This happens at the same time as a 'the only son of his mother' is being carried out on a bier for burial. We note two things about the situation: The deceased is an only son and she is widowed. These two facts elevate the story's tragedy. The woman is domestically and economically abandoned; her tears palpable. At the gate of the town, life and death meet.

Jesus, the agent of healing and life, responds to her: 'When the Lord saw her he felt sorry for her.' Jesus' seeing impels him to act. In an earlier Lukan parable (Lk 10), a Samaritan 'sees' a half-dead robbery victim. Unlike the other characters in the parable who pass by and look sideways, the Samaritan is impelled to act. In today's Gospel, Jesus responds similarly.

The title 'Lord' suggests that this is the act of God's emissary. The translation, 'felt sorry', robs the power of the Greek which literally means, 'felt his innards respond'. This visceral response brings Jesus to restore the young man to life, an act acclaimed as God's 'visitation' of the people. Like the woman, we carry our dead before Jesus today. He responds deeply to our sadness. Through him God also 'visits' us.



Our St Vincent de Paul Conference September Report


Through your support for our appeals and poor box donations Chatswood was able to respond to a record 22 requests for help in September expending over \$2000. It never ceases to amaze us how difficult it is for some people to manage to live. Five of the requests came from people with mental difficulties, 2 from families of Asian background ineligible or Centrelink benefits one of whom is an asylum seeker. Sickness was the reason for another request, one elderly person sought companionship as much as anything else. Most of the others came from people weighed down with difficulties without the life skills to cope which most of us take for granted. A homeless lass advised of having a very tough upbringing and family being in jail. She confessed of drug addiction but that she was currently clean. She said she had unhappy recent relationships including DV. She had very few belongings. We helped her with food, clothing, Opal top up and told her about places where she could do washing. We are looking for more volunteers to help meet the high demand for help. If you can spare 1 or 2 half days a week and have some admin and computer skills, and willingness to do home visitations please get in touch with El at el.herlianto@vinnies.org.au or call John on 0439783956


