FROM FR DAVID



Dear friends

This week our children, having been confirmed by Bishop Anthony last September, begin their preparation for their reception of the Eucharist for the first time which will occur in June. They prepare in a very special way by learning and celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation which will occur towards the end of the Season of Lent. We will present our children preparing

for the sacraments at different times over the coming weeks. May their example of preparation lead each of us to re-consider how we ourselves might celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. During this Lenten season of reflection and renewal we are praying for a deeper conversion of heart. We seek to turn from those ways centred on ourselves and we week to turn to those way centered on others. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a beautiful way to mark this conversion and to receive the forgiving, healing love of Christ. The Sacrament is available in our church each Thursday evening from 7pm to 8pm and then again each Saturday morning from 9.30am. On the evening of Thursday 30 March we will also celebrate the Sacrament in its Second Form – within the context of a communal celebration of mercy. This is very powerful way given us in our journey to Easter.

This coming Wednesday, 8 March, is International Women's Day. It is an opportune time to acknowledge the women of our parish community and in particular the leadership that so many demonstrate for us. We give thanks for their presence, their commitment, their generosity, their creativity. And we ask the Lord's deepest blessings upon them on this day that celebrates the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women.

Last Friday 3 March was the 111th anniversary of the opening of the building which now serves as our Parish Office. In 1912 it was opened as the Parish's presbytery. We are going to celebrate this anniversary this year with the commencement of an interior makeover! From 13 March the painters will arrive to re-paint the ground floor and stairwell. After the painters, we will then consider updating the flooring. There will be some considerable disruption for several weeks but it will be wonderful to be able to welcome our many visitors to a much refreshed space.


Requests for Mass Intentions:

GOSPEL REFLECTION

'At the end of the fourth block of narrative material in Matthew's Gospel, we find the story of the transfiguration of Jesus. It is a moment of divine revelation about Jesus' identity—just as, at his baptism, the heavenly voice confirms Jesus as the beloved Son. To this is added the instruction that disciples are to listen to him.

Here they are up a high mountain alone, away from everyone and everything. It is easy to find God in the peace and quiet, it is easy to appreciate God surrounded by a majestic mountain-top view. St Augustine of Hippo, in one of his homilies in the fifth century, focused on this reaction from Peter: *Saint Peter was delighted with the solitude; he had grown tired of the turbulent, troublesome human race. He saw the mountain, he saw the Lord, he saw Moses and Elijah ... He was delighted with this quiet, leisurely, blissful life, and said to the Lord: 'Lord, it is good for us to be here.' Why go down the mountain to be subjected to all that turbulence? Why not rather decide to enjoy ourselves here? It is good for us to be here. (Sermo 79A.)*

The story of the transfiguration of Jesus is one rich in symbolism. Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets, the summary of the Jewish faith. As Augustine said in that same homily: 'In Moses we have the law, in Elijah the prophets. When we put forward anything from the gospel, we back it up from the law and prophets'. The transfiguration shows us a moment of glory, it shows us our destination. Like any kid in the back of a car, our question during this season of Lent is 'are we there yet?' The answer is that, although we can experience a part of that glory, although we get a taste of it every time we share in the eucharist, we are not there yet.

In Matthew's account of the transfiguration, what we find before this story is the first prediction of the suffering and resurrection of Jesus (Matt 16:21-23), and the doctrine of the cross (Matt 16:24-28): 'If a man wishes to come after me, he must deny his very self, take up his cross, and begin to follow in my footsteps'. Shortly after the transfiguration story we have the second prediction of the passion (Matt 17:22-23). The structure of the story is not accidental: the only way to glory is through the cross.

The author of the second letter to Timothy captures this reality: 'bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us and called us to be holy'. Abraham's call led him to hardship, but he trusted in that call, even in dark and difficult days. Yes, Jesus has abolished death; yes, Jesus has proclaimed life and immortality; yes, the Lord will rescue our souls from death. However, the only way to life is through death. In the unintentionally profound words of the 1970s' musical, Jesus Christ Superstar, 'to conquer death you only have to die'.

Lent is our season of death. We must die to sin. We die to selfishness every time we tell the truth; we die to selfishness every time we forgive someone who hurts us; we die to selfishness every time we offer a helping hand to anyone in need; we die to selfishness every time we reach out in love. Lent is our season of dying to sin so that we can rise to the new life of Easter.

We are thankful today for the faithfulness of Abraham, who went as the Lord told him. We are thankful today for Moses and Elijah pointing the way to Jesus. We are thankful today for Jesus, who showed us the way to life through overcoming sin and death. We are thankful today for our sisters and brothers who die to sin by listening and trusting in the faithfulness of God's Word.



Human Rights (Children Born Alive Protection) Act 2022 Bill

The Human Rights (Children Born Alive Protection) Act 2022 Bill is currently before a Senate Committee which will consider submissions from the public by 10 March 2023. This Bill clarifies that children born alive are persons; requires health practitioners to provide medical care, treatment and statistics on children born alive as a result of terminations; and provides that the mother of a child born alive is not liable to prosecution for an offence in respect of that child.

We all have the opportunity to express our view in defence of the most innocent and defenceless amongst us to ensure that they receive the care proper to their dignity as a human being.

Please write a submission for your support for the Born Alive Bill. Your submission should be as concise as possible while still expressing clearly your views on this issue. When writing your submission please state what do you want the government to do? e.g. providing crisis counselling for mothers who want a late-term abortion.
