



#### FROM FR DAVID



Dear friends,

This weekend is Deacon Kevin Hale's final weekend with us on his formal appointment as Deacon to the Parish. We hasten to add, however, that Deacon Kevin will remain very much associated with our parish and, after a holiday with his wife Lois during May, we will certainly see him again. For Deacon Kevin our parish is his spiritual home so we will continue to see him each weekend, and he will continue to be involved pastorally with us even if without formal appointment.

Deacon Kevin has served our community on appointment by the Bishop for the past six years. He has done so always with generosity, commitment and pastoral love – and of course, with a wicked laugh! We

are very grateful to him for his remarkable contribution over these years, knowing that he has touched the lives and hearts of many in our parish family. As we moves into retirement from appointment, we wish him abundant blessings and remain grateful that he remains very much part of our parish family. So this is not a goodbye! But it is a mighty chance to say thank you for six years of unstinting ministry for us.

I am very pleased to share with you the news of the appointment of our new Parish Director of Music, Titus Grenyer. Titus comes to us with considerable experience in church music, with a BMusic (Hons) from Sydney Conservatorium of Music and a LMusA in Pipe Organ also from the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. He has been an Assistant Organist at St Mary's Cathedral and St Andrew's College from 2019 and has been involved with the St Mary's Singers at the Cathedral, too. He is a skilled organist, conductor, and composer, and even has his own YouTube channel, "Pep Organ". Titus commences with us this coming week but then will take a very short break to celebrate overseas his recent wedding. We are confident that Titus will build on the great foundation that our outgoing Director, Patrick Harrison has developed.

Again, thank you to everyone for the amazing participation in our recent exercise developing our Parish Mission. We have had nearly 600 responses which is nothing other than phenomenal. A number of our ministry leaders gathered together last Thursday, 27 April to reflect on the volume of contributions and to progress the formulation of our Parish Mission statement. IN the coming weeks we will all be asked again for our feedback and participation. In this way we will be able to publish our Parish Mission on Pentecost Sunday (28 May) confident that this has been what the Spirit has brought into being through us all. A very special thank you to Brendan Tertini and Anthony Seeto from our Parish Pastoral and Missionary Council for their extraordinary work to enable us to journey forward together.

This weekend, we might notice some new devices in our church: there is one on the choir loft rail and two more in the transepts of the church. These are state of the art cameras that, once operational, will provide us with the capacity for livestreaming. We will be looking soon for some

volunteers to operate the system which will take place from the choir loft. If there is any budding camera person in our midst who would enjoy operating the controls do let us know! It might be something for which our young people might have a keen interest!

Warm congratulations to Fr Agustinus Handoko MSC, our chaplain to the Sydney Catholic Indonesian Community. Fr Agustinus celebrates his Silver Anniversary of Ordination with a special Mass in our parish on Saturday 29 April. A very large congregation from across Sydney joins us for this special occasion.

We have some wonderful opportunities for our formation in faith through the coming month of May: our annual May tribute to Our Lady, a parish pilgrimage to the Central Coast on Saturday 20 May, and then our Men Alive Conference on the weekend of 27/28 May at Harrington Hall. The details of all these are in our parish bulletin. Always an exciting read!

#### Free Your Grief

"The great challenge is <u>living</u> your wounds through instead of thinking them through. It is better to cry than to worry, better to feel your wounds deeply than to understand them, better to let them enter into your silence than to talk about them. The choice you face constantly is whether you are taking your hurts to your head or to your heart. In your head you can analyze them, find their causes and consequences, and coin words to speak and write about them. But no final healing is likely to come from that source. You need to let your wounds go down into your heart. Then you can live them through and discover that they will not destroy you. Your heart is greater than your wounds." - Henri Nouwen


#### GOSPEL REFLECTION

Have you noticed how some of our Scripture readings throughout the weeks of this Easter season are set on the day of Easter? And how some, like today's first reading from Acts of the Apostles, are set on the day of Pentecost? This is a powerful reminder to us that what we celebrate during this season is not the chronological unfolding of a story but various reflections upon the one mystery: Easter and Pentecost are interwoven realities and we celebrate both together each day of our fifty-day season.

The first letter of Peter sums up this Easter mystery, saying that Christ died 'so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness'. Easter is about living the new life of conversion. It echoes Peter's address in Acts of the Apostles about repentance: baptism is for the forgiveness of sins and receiving the Spirit. It is not a one-off event, but something that is lived out day by day. Just as Easter is the victory of life over death in the person of Jesus, it is the victory of belonging and purpose over being lost and alone. The first letter of Peter describes this new reality with a metaphor: 'You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd'.

The shepherd image is, of course, the constant and powerful image for this Sunday in Easter. Today's particular extract from chapter 10 of John speaks more about the pen or enclosure, and Jesus speaks of himself as the gate of the pen. The proper way in or out is through him.

In early Christian catacomb art in Rome, the image of the shepherd with a sheep slung over his neck was a popular one. It was probably even a pre-Christian image that Christians adopted. Its use in funerary art is easy to explain. The last lines of the psalm say: 'In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever and ever'. The idea of the shepherd leading us into eternity is clear. In chapter 10 of John the idea of eternal life was also found by early Christians. In one of his homilies on this gospel, St Augustine of Hippo noted some sixteen hundred years ago that the gospel says that Jesus leads the sheep in and out through the gate and that he has come to say that people may have life and have it to the full. Augustine could see two realities here. Coming into the gate was baptism and the pen was life in the church. Coming out of the gate was death and entry to the pastures of eternity, and the fullness of life. This is what Augustine said: 'For he seems to me to have meant that they may have life going in, and have it more abundantly going out. For no one can go out through the gate—that is by Christ—to that eternal life which shall be face to face, unless by the same gate—that is, by the same Christ—he has entered his church, which is his fold, to the temporal life, which is lived in faith' (In Euangelium Iohannis Tractatus 45).



So today we are thankful that God has called us to join this flock; we are thankful that, through baptism and the gift of the Spirit, we belong. We are thankful that Jesus is our shepherd who comforts us with crook and staff. We are thankful that the shepherd will one day lead us out into the eternity of the Lord's house. We are thankful to share in this meal of bread and wine, which is a foretaste of the banquet prepared for us in the sight of our foes. We are an Easter people and alleluia is our song.

#### What is God calling us to focus on?

As part of our discernment to discover what God may be calling us to focus on as our parish mission, we asked parishioners, what is the primary purpose God is calling us to focus on as a parish mission?

#### Here is a further selection of our responses...

"Developing more people, especially young people to grow in faith and practice within the Christian tradition - even if initially in a predominately social sense."

"To spread Good News and the message God has sent us."

"Togetherness, nurture each other for friendship, support and faith development as a church family and community. We walk the faith journey together in the parish, through friendship, support and togetherness."

"It is spreading the love and the teaching of our Holy Catholic Church."

"To praise God, be true to his word in the Bible and promote his saving message - not beholden to popular, secular campaigns, despite the pressures to do so."

"To make a big effort to get all those Catholics who live in our parish but no longer come to Mass."

"To foster love, kindness and support amongst the parish community."

"To establish a culture that welcomes and appeals to the youth in our community to keep the Catholic faith alive and thriving."

"To reach out to others who may feel God's calling to join in worship. To keep hold of those already in our parish family."

"To give thanks to God, spread the good news, apply God's teachings and help others in need."

"Participate and contribute as a community to grow together as a parish."

"To be more open to the ideas of the youth as the world changes, we should also strive to change our mindsets regarding certain viewpoints without fault. Otherwise, we will be left behind as others strive ahead. As a big parish we can set an example for others to change. And lead the change for others to see."

"To be humble, diverse, inclusive. Especially women and those on the margins. To have more organisation among the youth and include proper communication."

"The primary thing God is calling us to focus on is to spread His word to everyone in our community."

"To serve our God by doing something for the church and community."

"Show God's love by helping those in need in and around our Parish."

"Continue to spread God's word. To be a help to those who are needy. Note: To hear and clearly understand God's teaching's during readings and homily."

"To make everyone feel welcome and find peace and feel love and support."

"To spread the belief to others. To help strengthen our faith."

"To spread the Word. To build a community of faith."

#### OUR MISSION

"Is to spread the Good News to the World, to encourage others to live life with God."

"Love God who is within each of us and in all generations."

"To encourage people to strengthen their faith and maintain their Godly values."

"To be kind to our neighbours, to believe in Him."

"To evangelise through volunteering, reaching out and sharing."

"Being in community with the faithful. To support one another and service in the parish and in the outer community."

"May God give us the courage to reach out to parishioners we don't know - especially if they are of another ethnic community, to break down those barriers that inhibit a free sense of community for all parishioners. "Receive God's love here and live God's will where we are."

"God is calling is to focus on promoting a church community that is united and that nurtures each other spiritually."

"To know, love, serve God."

"Love one another and be there for each other with the help of the parish to stay close to God."

"Helping local community."

"To help those less fortunate in the immediate area and then the Diocese of Broken Bay through fundraising or by spreading the word of Christ."

"Welcome new members as Chatswood grows."

"To glorify God and to share his love to others by giving testimony of Him saving us from the most difficult situation when it's all helpless and desperate - he would be there to save us."

"To spread the teaching of why God exists to those who are not yet with God."

"To help those in need by putting others first."

"Be kind and love one another."

"To pray with others, to refresh our minds on rules for life."

"To be a place which attracts people to Mass and the other sacraments including giving people who no longer come to Mass or go to other parishes a reason to return."

"Need to build a sense of Christian Community (hospitality). More than individualistic spiritual life. Greater sense of belonging/identity. Faith formation. Family/fellowship groups/youth. Get this right and there will be something vibrant to draw people into. Out of this will flow works of mercy and evangelisation, greater engagement with local broader community."

"Our ultimate mission is to spread the goodness of God and let Jesus Christ be the centre of our lives. To live a Christ like life."

"To spread His word through prayer and good deeds. Never stop helping where you can."

"Be an example, so we encourage more people to go to church services and especially and most importantly, attend 'mass'. ultimately spread the word of God, through short courses, faith formation, various Bible studies and similar courses."

"To bring other people who do not know God. To help the brothers and sisters."

#### MAY: THE MONTH OF MARY



Many might see Mary as just another character in the Bible, one who was given a particular task, and when God was finished with her, she faded into the background with the rest of the crowd. But Mary was chosen by God Almighty, long before He spoke this world into existence, long before the fall of Adam and Eve, long before she gave birth to Christ, to be the immaculate vessel through which God would enter our world. She dedicated her entire life and all that she was, to the glory of the Father.

May is Mary's Month. This has been a custom in the Church dating back many centuries. In this special month, in which we will celebrate Christ's Ascension into Heaven and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (the birthday of the Church), it would be great to deepen our devotion to Mary. In the Acts of the Apostles, we see the beautiful image of the early Church united in prayer around "Mary, the mother of Jesus." That was what Jesus wanted as his last wish - that his mother should become our mother. He told the apostle St. John and each one of us: "Behold, your mother!"

If we love Jesus we should make sure that Mary always has an important place in our lives. The Gospel of John says John took Mary into his "own home." We need to do the same. We need to develop a deep personal relationship with Mary - one of love, affection, devotion and trust. We grow in faith and holiness if we stay close to Mary and if we listen to her words and learn from her example. At the Annunciation, Mary told the angel, "Let it be done to me according to your word". She entrusted herself totally to God's will for her life. She made a commitment to cooperate with His will, to be a "handmaid" to His plan of salvation.

Mary teaches us to always look to Jesus. Her last words in the Gospels, at the wedding at Cana, should be the first words that define how we live: "Do whatever he tells you". She welcomed Jesus into her life and gave him to the world. That should also be an example for us. We should be ready always to bring the gift of Jesus to others. Know Mary, know Jesus. No Mary, no Jesus.

Mary is the Queen of Peace, so throughout this month of May and throughout the year let us offer prayers for peace for Australia and in the world. Let us ask Mary's intercession to help us love her as Jesus loved her.

So in this month of Mary, as we pray for one another, let's all try to take some practical steps to deepen our devotion to Mary. Maybe that means praying the Rosary more regularly and with more devotion and affection. Perhaps consider joining the rosary group in praying the rosary before/after Mass (see details below). Mary has asked us to pray the rosary daily during all her six apparitions at Fatima between May and October 1917 for peace. Are we listening to her?



#### Employment Opportunity: Diocesan Pastoral Discernment Project Facilitator

As part of the 35th anniversary of the Diocese of Broken Bay, in August 2021, Bishop Anthony Randazzo invited the Diocesan region of the Central Coast to participate in a project of pastoral discernment. The Central Coast region was identified as the first of the three geographic regions to undertake this project which was undertaken in 2022. As part of this discernment, now completed for the Central coast and envisaged for the Northern Beaches and North Shore of the Diocese, of paramount importance is to recognise the each of the local region's particular pastoral circumstances, opportunities, and challenges.

The process of pastoral discernment envisages a sustained and prayerful study of the various factors which give our three geographic regions (Central Coast, Northern Beaches and North Shore) its unique character. The aim of this initiative is to renew the life of the Church in each of these regions of the Diocese, ensuring a sustainable and thriving ecclesial community.

You may be aware that in December 2022 the Central Coast pastoral discernment was completed with the Final Report and Executive Summary publicly available. Having considered the findings of the Central Coast project, Bishop Anthony has appointed a Task Group to consider the Central Coast Report and to make recommendations to him with respect to the implementation of the findings of the Report. The work of the Task Group will be undertaken throughout 2023.

Concurrently to discerning the recommendations of the Central Coast Pastoral Discernment Project, the Diocese is now also turning its focus to implementing the discernment project and process for the Northern Beaches region.

In respect of both the work of the Central Coast Implementation Task Group and launching the discernment project for the Northern Beaches region, we are recruiting for a Diocesan Pastoral Discernment Project Facilitator.

The appointment of the Diocesan Pastoral Discernment Project Facilitator will:

1.act as an Executive Officer, assisting the newly appointed Pastoral Discernment Central Coast Implementation Task Group in the formulation and implementation of the recommendations from the Central Coast Discernment Project; and

2.coordinate and facilitate strategic planning in preparation for the Northern Beaches Pastoral Discernment Project.

This is a full-time position for a maximum term of two years.

The role requires a candidate with tertiary qualifications in theology, ministry, social science or a related discipline, supported by at least five years in pastoral planning and/or project management in a Church context and experience in planning of evangelisation practices in diocesan and parish contexts. You will have an understanding that this is integral to ministry in a Catholic setting and experience working in close collaboration with parishes and agencies of the Catholic Church, notably clergy and community consultation and the facilitation of large and small groups. Your proven record in project-based research and business case methodology will speak to your high-level organisational skills and the ability to collate and distil large volumes of complex information.

With consideration of the unique characteristics of the Northern Beaches region it is important that the successful candidate has a strong familiarity, identification or presence from within the northern beaches area.

# The Good Shepherd

The readings in today's Mass talk about Jesus the Good Shepherd.

In Jesus' time, and still in some parts of the world today, there would be flocks of sheep grazing

in the pastures. The shepherds were the people who looked after the flocks and made sure none of the sheep got lost or hurt or attacked by wild animals.

The Church is the flock of Jesus, and He is the Good Shepherd. He guides the people in the Church so that their souls will not be hungry- He gives us grace, just like a shepherd makes sure his sheep have lots of grass to eat!

Like the shepherd protects the sheep from danger, Our Lord also protects us from harm. In the "Our Father" we ask God to deliver us from evil. When our souls are hurt by sin, the Good Shepherd heals us with forgiveness in Confession.
