Dear friends.

A very happy Mother's Day! We pray for all those entrusted with this vocation and responsibility and pray God's richest blessings upon them and their families. May this day be a very special one for our mothers!

This weekend, we develop further our Parish Mission. As will be explained at our Masses, we will be invited to make a choice out of three examples that have been developed from everyone's contribution since last November. We have been so encouraged by everyone's participation. Now, we come to the finalisation of formulating as a community of faith our Mission. It is our Mission that will then underpin all that we do going forward and hopefully become that by which we are known. Again, a very special thank you to Brendan Tertini and Anthony Seeto for their magnificent work on this. Upon everyone's engagement

this weekend, we will then be able to share the Mission on Pentecost Sunday in a special letter that I shall write to our community for the occasion.

As you appreciate, since last September 2022, we have actively been considering a new structure for our Parish Office that might best support us as we move forward into what is a very exciting and energetic period for us. To this end, we created the roles of Parish Services Officer, Administration Assistant and Director of Music, and proposed the role of Business Manager. We have been able to implement most of these new roles, notwithstanding already a change in our Director of Music. However, the benefit of time has enabled us to reflect further on the proposed role of Business Manager and to consider that there may be different way into the future. Consequently, the current role of Finance and Facilities Officer which Michael Mercer has exercised so well over the last five vears will come to its conclusion. Michael will conclude his employment with us on Wednesday 17 May 2023. I wish to record my deepest appreciation to Michael for his wonderful service to the parish and to us as a team over the last five years. Michael has been always the most professional in the exercise of his duties. He has also been entirely gracious and unstintingly generous. His gentle and calm manner has ensured we have come through a number of challenges in one piece! When we look back at all that has been achieved over the last five years, we can but be filled with hearts of immense gratitude to Michael for his remarkable dedication and contribution. We have come to this point in our journey with such health, vibrancy, and potential in no small way due to Michael's presence and engagement with us. He has unfailingly been a trusted and loyal support and encouragement to me in my own role for which I will be forever grateful. Though the future might suggest a new configuration of roles and staffing in our parish office, I have assured Michael that he remains a most valued member of our parish family, and that though his professional relationship may be changing our friendship with him does not. We look forward to continuing to see Michael and to enjoying his company. He is always welcome to call in, enjoy the PEW café, participate in the many ministries of our community. So, this is not entirely a goodbye but hopefully a hello in a new way. Please join with me in expressing gratitude to Michael for this time with us and his wonderful contribution.

Recently, we have had cameras and systems installed in our church to provide us with a very professional capacity for live-streaming. Though most people have now re-joined us (last weekend we had over 1200 people join us for our Masses), our capacity to broadcast will ensure our outreach even further – across the world! The capacity gives us opportunity, especially, for significant events – such as School Graduations – and also for weddings and funerals. The equipment, software, and systems now installed are 'state-of-the-art' with remarkable functionality to make the experience of watching what is livestreamed very professional and first class. The operating system is now in the corner of the choir loft. And now we are looking for operators! Might there be people who would be interested in becoming first class operators of the cameras and film makers? This is something open to people of all ages! It may be, however that some senior students, in particular, would really enjoy engaging this ministry? If anyone is excited and interested by this possibility, do let me or Olivia in our parish office know, and we will arrange training with Ben Thrum, our sound engineer who has installed the system for us and to whom we are very grateful.

This weekend we also conduct again our Pastoral Works Broken Bay Appeal, the pastoral charity of our Diocese of Broken Bay. Our Pastoral works are at the forefront of our community, serving those in need, helping to rebuild and renew families and parish communities and introducing our children in state schools to the wonder and beauty of our faith. The appeal mainly supports two key Diocesan ministries which get little or no government funding. They are:


• The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) – around 650 volunteer catechists taking the Gospel to approximately 14,000 state school children during the school terms. CCD provides a large range of online resources for the students plus newsletters, training, and workshops for the volunteers.

• Hospital Chaplaincy & Pastoral Care Program – again Chaplain and care practitioners visit more than 3,000 individual hospital patients each year. Some are end-of-life patients, many may feel isolated, lonely or fearful; others will recover but are grateful to receive the sacraments; while some are parents trying to come to terms with very sick children or babies. There are probably many amongst us who have or are facing similar circumstances and are very aware of the time, care and attention offered by this ministry.

Funds raised during the appeal go directly to these ministries. It is a difficult time to be asking people to be generous. We are all facing cost-of-living challenges in many ways. However, our support and generosity are vitally important. It has made a huge difference in the past to many people. All donations over \$2 are tax deductable. These donations contribute to our Parish target. Our own Parish is committed to raising some \$70,000 annually for the Appeal, and by the end of June we have some \$40,000 remaining to raise. Everyone's gift makes a difference.

Thank you for your time and generosity and for all the many, many ways you make our parish so welcoming and alive.

Lord Jesus Christ, You chose to put yourself—tiny, needy and helpless—into the nurturing and watchful hands of a human mother. Since then, every act of mothering, both physical and spiritual, in every time and every corner of the world recollects Mary's. Inspired by this example, we, too, honour our mothers and mother figures today. Bless these women, that they may be strengthened as Christian mothers and nurturers. Let the example of their faith and love shine forth. Grant that we, their sons and daughters, honour them always with a spirit of profound respect.



Did you know: the House of Loreto refers to the building that is believed to be the house of Our Lady, where Jesus was made flesh in her womb.


May: The Month of Mary

The attitude of Mary of Nazareth shows us that being comes before doing, and to leave the doing to God in order to be truly as he wants us. It is He who works so many marvels in us.

Not one of us can buy salvation! Salvation is a free gift of the Lord, a free gift of God that comes within us and dwells in us. As we have received freely, so are we called to give freely (cf. In March last year we embarked on a journey together, guided by the Holy Spirit, to discover what it means to truly be Church in the city.

Over the past year, we have...

- Shared our hopes and dreams for our church, parish community and precinct
- Developed a clear understanding of where we are today, through the National Church Life Survey, Parish Census and school surveys
- Formed ten Ministry Circles, each offering opportunities for people of all ages and groups to come together as a community of faith

Most recently, we began to discern as a parish through Mass worksheets, parishioner workshops and small group activities - what God may be calling us to focus on as a parish, our mission.

A parish mission or purpose statement is a short statement that defines the parish's primary purpose, its reason for being - why it exists and what we are called by God to do.

We firstly asked all parishioners "what is the primary thing God is calling us to focus on as a parish purpose, our mission?" From the 239 parishioner responses received, our top five discerned purposes were...

Love, kindness and compassion towards others

Parishioners discerned the importance of loving God, loving one another, being a good example and serving others with kindness and humility.

Evangelisation, spreading God's Word and love

Parishioners discerned that we should focus on spreading the word of God and evangelising to those who may have lapsed or who are not yet familiar with the teachings of Jesus - making disciples by helping others in their journey of knowing God and his love.

Growing together in Faith

Parishioners discerned the need for us all to grow together in faith, deepen our relationship with God and find greater meaning and purpose in our lives.

Helping those in need and serving others

Parishioners discerned the importance of serving others in the community and helping those in need acts of compassion and action - a strong charitable presence in our community.

Community building and supporting each other

Parishioners discerned the need for us all to come together as a parish community to support and nurture one another spiritually, act as a source of good in the community, and help those in need.

We then asked parishioners to rank these five purposes in order of importance. We received a fantastic 590 responses, which were analysed and through further discernment, a shortlist of three potential parish mission statements developed.

Parish mission statement shortlist

This weekend during Mass, we are inviting all parishioners to discern which mission statement, from the shortlist of three, we adopt as our parish mission statement.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today, on our thirty-sixth day of the Easter season, our attention shifts from the risen Lord to the promised Spirit. We are thankful today because we are people of hope. What is the basis of that hope? One of the grounds for our hope is the fact that all the earth can cry out to God with joy. The purpose of Acts of the Apostles is to show that the good news brought by Jesus is not limited or restricted in any way: it does not belong to one people but to all people. The author outlines how the gospel reaches to the ends of the earth.

We hear about the first step in that expansionary process in chapter 8 of Acts. We met Philip last week, like Stephen, one of the seven chosen to help with the distribution of food to the widows among the Hellenists in the Jerusalem community. These Hellenists were Greek-speaking Christian Jews who seem to have been discriminated against on cultural grounds. The ministry of service exercised by the seven would later be seen as the basis for the ministerial order of deacons. Philip is to be distinguished from Philip who was one of the Twelve. Interestingly, while chapter 6 of Acts presents the seven being chosen so that the Twelve could devote themselves to preaching, here in chapter 8 we find Philip also engaged in preaching.

He is in Samaria. We know that, after the death of Solomon, according to the biblical accounts, the kingdom had been split into two: the kingdom of Israel in the north and the kingdom of Judah in the south. Two hundred years later (720 BC), the Assyrians destroyed the northern kingdom and some of the people were taken away in captivity. The land later became known as Samaria and the people living there regarded as foreigners, even though they worshipped the same God as the Jews.

Philip baptised, but the author of Acts says that the people did not receive the Spirit until Peter and John laid hands on them. This is a little odd, since elsewhere we are told that baptism conferred the Spirit. It seems that what the author wanted to emphasise is that Philip's practice of taking the Good News outside the borders of Judaea was confirmed by the Twelve. It is a statement about the unity of the followers of Jesus, whatever their background. This piece of Scripture would become the later justification for the separation of baptism and confirmation in our western tradition.

What happens to the person who receives the Spirit? John's Gospel, recounting the words of Jesus in the discourse at the Last Supper, says that such a one is united in truth and united in Christ. The indwelling of the Spirit is the indwelling of the Trinity and the unity of the community. To have the Spirit is to be driven towards unity; it is to be impelled towards care for others, all others. In the fifth century, Augustine told the newly baptised what it meant for them to be filled with the Spirit in loving God and keeping God's commandments. 'Thus, before all else, Christ came so that they might learn how much God loves them, and might learn this so that they would catch fire with love for him who first loved them, and so that they would also love their neighbour as he commanded and showed by his example—he who made himself their neighbour by loving them when they were not close to him but were wandering far from him.'

Let us give thanks to the Lord for that Spirit who makes us one. We are an Easter people and alleluia is our song.



This week we meet Karen - our newly appointed CCD Catechist Coordinator who also looks after the catechists at the Lindfield-Killara. Karen's ideal holiday destinations range from everything from Europe where she once backpacked with a friend, to local gems like Port Macquarie, the Hastings River waterfront walk; Koala Hospital & the Hello Koalas Sculpture trail just to name a few. This adventurous spirit makes it very clear then, why Karen's favourite saint is St Mary of the Cross MacKillop - our first Saint whose advenutures were pushed the spiritual norms of faith. Karen admires how St Mary had complete confidence in God's providence and spent her life helping children and the poor; so visiting the Mary MacKillop Memorial Chapel and Museum in North Sydney is always a special trip for her.

What inspires you to do what you do for the church?

I grew up in Chatswood with my family, attending St Thomas' Willoughby Primary School. As an enthusiastic student, I enjoyed learning and playing a variety of sports including netball and tennis. My family and I attended Mass weekly at St. Thomas' Catholic church.

In late 2016 while attending a Sunday Mass at St Augustine's Church in the inner west, I was 'tapped on the shoulder' by the parish Scripture/Catechist Co-ordinator, who enquired if I would consider assisting a Scripture teacher at a class in a public school in the area. My journey as a Scripture teacher commenced, initially as an Assistant teacher in the Kindergarten class. My confidence and enjoyment increased and I eventually took on a combined class of my own, with an Assistant in my class.

I'm very much looking forward working as part of the Chatswood parish team, providing support to our dedicated Chatswood Catechists at five public Primary schools and one High School.

What has been your biggest challenge?

Losing half my immediate family: the illnesses and deaths of my parents, and the unexpected death of my eldest sister from a rare illness a few years ago. My sister's two beautiful daughters – my nieces, give me a huge amount comfort and joy, along with my two nephews and two other nieces - they are all gorgeous!

What does Our Lady of Sorrows symbolise for you?

Our Lady of Sorrows symbolises the sacrifices Jesus made for all of us, that we are to remember.

While experiences of grief and sorrow can occasionally be overwhelming, we are reminded that grief is temporary and we will eventually be released from our sorrows. Hope is eternal!

The ongoing expansion of urban areas disproportionally impact Indigenous people's sense of cultural connection and identity through the disruption and destruction of culturally significant places and landscapes.


Urban fringe areas tend to have poorer access to services and longer commute times.

Nowadays, for example, we are conscious of the disproportionate and unruly growth of many cities, which have become unhealthy to live in, not only because of pollution caused by toxic emissions but also as a result of urban chaos, poor transportation, and visual pollution and noise. Many cities are huge, inefficient structures, excessively wasteful of energy and water. Neighbourhoods, even those recently built, are congested, chaotic and lacking in sufficient green space. We were not meant to be inundated by cement, asphalt, glass and metal, and deprived of physical contact with nature.







This week the children and their families from our parish have commenced their preparation for the Sacrament of First Holy Communion.

As they prepare to join the community around the table of the Lord for the first time, the children with their parents will listen to the story of God in Scripture and in our church. We now reach a new phase of our journey. I am inviting all the people of God in the Diocese of Broken Bay to join the conversation.

The Diocesan-wide consultation will begin with Mass as we celebrate our Patronal feast, Mary Star of the Sea.

I encourage you to join me at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral for Vigil Mass at 5.30pm on Tuesday, 30 May 2023 before we move to The Light of Christ Centre for a light supper and conversation as we continue our Cathedral Precinct journey together. A formal invitation will be sent out in the coming days and will detail further how clergy and parishioners are able to confirm their attendance.

I ask that you pray for this journey as it continues to unfold and for which I am sure, will be the source of many new blessings for our Diocese.






