### FROM FR DAVID



Dear friends

It is with great sadness that we share the death of Anthony Mustaca OAM. Surrounded in his final moments by Heather, his wife, and six daughters and loving siblings, Anthony passed away peacefully on 11 June 2023. Anthony was born in Calabria, Italy on 1 September 1944 and migrated to Sydney, Australia in 1956. He was a dedicated educator, a long-serving Councillor and Deputy Mayor of Willoughby City Council, and a highly respected community leader. His involvement in the Chatswood Parish was extensive. In recognition of his great achievements, he was awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia in 2013 and an Italian Knighthood in 2017. His memory and legacy will live on through his loving family. We extend our deepest sympathy to Heather and to all of Anthony's family. Anthony will be farewelled from our

church on Tuesday 20 June 2023 cat 10am, followed by the burial at Field of Mars Cemetery, Ryde. A Celebration of Life and light refreshments will be held at Doltone House Jones Bay Wharf after the burial. We extend to Heather and all of Anthony's large family our deepest sympathy. Eternal rest grant unto Anthony, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace.

Anthony's funeral will be very large, and therefore we will not be able to hold our usual devotions after our 9am Mass on Tuesday. Guests for the funeral will be arriving from 9.30am.



Thank you to all those who assisted in maintaining the opening of our church through last week while the clergy of the parish were at the annual diocesan clergy conference. The Conference was a wonderful experience with much nourishment through the presentations, liturgies and fellowship. Dr Peter Holmes lead us through a beautiful reflection on spiritual fatherhood, Patrick Fox on the experience of acculturation, and time was spent, too, developing awareness of those gifts we personally bring to ministry. On Wednesday evening we celebrated Mass together with Bishop Anthony at St John's Woy Woy and then enjoyed dinner at Mary Macs, a kitchen for homeless on the Central Coast. The eminent journalist, Greg Sheridan and his wife joined us for our final dinner on Thursday evening, encouraging us to be the 'bold minority." It truly was a very good week.

I have now left for Rome, returning on 18 July. The first week will be representing our diocese at an international conference on Safeguarding. But the remainder will be annual holiday leave. Do keep me in your prayer as you will all be in mine. I very much look forward to being back with you all!

Therefore, it may not be possible to have a Mass offered on a specific day and time, given that the priest may already have allocated an intention for the Mass. Do be assured that if a Mass cannot be offered on a specific occasion it will be offered by a priest at the first available opportunity. Notwithstanding, if you would like a Mass for a specific purpose at a particular time, please contact a priest directly to seek to arrange this.

### GOSPEL REFLECTION

### Context Connection

This Sunday's Gospel speaks of Jesus's sharing his mission with the Apostles and the need for this work to continue. Matthew's Gospel specifically addresses Jesus's mission to the Jewish people: "When [Jesus] saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd" (9:36). Throughout the Old Testament, the Jewish people are often referred to as being like a flock of sheep. Jesus comments on the state of health of the flock of his day: "They were harassed and helpless" (9:36). Because the needs of the lost sheep are so great, Jesus prepares the disciples to understand that God's plan to restore the health of Israel includes them: "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest" (9:37). The Lord of the harvest is God, and God is in need of co-laborers. Jesus equips the disciples to do God's work by sharing his authority with them: "Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness" (10:1). Jesus commissions the Twelve to do the same work he has been doing-healing the physical and spiritual illnesses of the Jewish people. Matthew lists the names of the Apostles, grouping them in six sets of two each. (These are also listed in Mark 3:16-19, Luke 6:14-16, and the Acts of the Apostles 1:13.) The focus for the missionary work of the Apostles at this particular time in Jesus's ministry is the Jews. However, in Jesus's final commission of the disciples after his Resurrection, he expands that mission beyond Israel to include Samaria and even the ends of the earth: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" (28:19).

Jesus's instructions to the disciples are clear: "Proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons" (10:7–8). God freely gives them the authority to do these things, and they are to freely share these gifts with others. This leaves the disciples totally dependent on God rather than dependent on others to repay them.

### **Tradition Connection**

Jesus calls the Apostles to help him in his missionary outreach—to invite everyone into the Kingdom of God. The baptized are called to extend this same invitation today (see CCC, number 543). In the Nicene Creed, prayed during Mass, we speak of the Church as apostolic, which means that the Church exists to bring others into the Kingdom of heaven.

As members of this Church, we are sent into the world to be Christ's presence, making believable the incredible love of God for all people. This is the Christian vocation—to be apostolic, doing the work of Jesus in this time and place in history (see CCC, number 863).

We are all called to the missionary vocation of the Church, to be about building God's Kingdom on earth. It is important to remember that Jesus is the source of our strength and that each of us lives out the missionary call in unique ways consistent with our particular lifestyle. Whether as a layperson or as an ordained person, we are asked to partake equally in the missionary work of the Church.

Each baptised follower of Jesus is asked to have an open heart to do the will of the Father in building the Kingdom. It is the duty of each Christian to prepare their heart, through prayer, to hear and then do the will of God.

### Wisdom Connection

Matthew is very clear with his community that as they go forth and actively engage in the missionary work of the Church, they are to share freely with others the gift God has freely bestowed on them—to rely on God only. Jesus's followers are to cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, and cast out demons. The authority to do so comes directly from Jesus. Jesus came to proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom but now requires workers to help him in his mission. In naming the Twelve, which include a tax collector and a traitor (individuals shunned in Jewish culture), Jesus lets the Christian community know that God can work through anyone. When our own imperfections and failings prevent us from responding to our Christian vocation to bring the Good News to others, we need to remember, good sometimes comes from the most unexpected places.



# FEAST DAY OF OUR LADY of Perpetual Help



June 27 is the feast day of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, who is known for miracles and answers to prayer. The tradition of Our Lady of Perpetual Help is traced back to 1495. Stolen from a Cretan monastery by a wine merchant a few years after its creation, it was brought to the church of St. Matthew in Rome. For 300 years, it resided at the church, and even survived the church's destruction by Napoleon's army in 1798. Eighty-eight years later in 1886, Pope Pius IX gave the icon to the Redemptorist Congregation at the Church of Saint Alphonsus, where it remains today. Tradition says he told the Redemptorist Superior General, "Make her known throughout the world."

To honour Our Lady of Perpetual Help, parishioners are invited to light a candle on <u>Tuesday 27 June</u> before her image in the church. Each candle represents the faith of the supplicants and their fervent prayers entrusted to the intercession of the Blessed Mother.

Here in our parish we have a weekly devotion to Our Lady of Perpetual Help every Saturday morning at 10 am. Everyone is welcome to participate. There is a petition/thanksgiving box in the church foyer (just outside the door of the Piety Stall) for anyone who wishes to place his/her prayer intentions and these will be included in our prayer devotion every Saturday morning.

Next Saturday 24 June following the OLPH prayer devotion, we will have morning tea in the Magnificat Room at around 10.45 am to commemorate the feast day Our Lady of Perpetual Help and for fellowship with those who regularly attend this devotion. Everyone is invited to join in this event. Please bring a plate to share if you can.

A 22 minute audio/video on the history of Our Lady of Perpetual Help (Succour) and explanation of the Icon will be shown during the course of the morning tea.




### Planned Giving Envelopes

### VINNIES MAY REPORT



During May the Chatswood Conference of the St Vincent de Paul received 11 requests for help; 7 of these were from people previously unknown to the Conference. The most urgent was from a well educated asylum seeker, ineligible for Centre Link Benefits, who had lost his job, fallen behind in rent and was not eating regularly. We assisted with rent and provided funds for food and job seeking. Two others were Job Seekers whose benefits had been suspended; we helped with food to cover the period till pensions were restored. Two others had to change their accommodation; we helped these with food, appliances, clothing and bedding. The other requests involved food, medical treatment and transport. Over \$1800 of assistance was given.
