FROM FR JOEY



Fr Joey Frez Acting Parish Priest

I have been a part of Our Lady of Dolours Parish for almost three years now, and I'm often asked what it is that I like most about our parish.Of course, since we are the 'Church in the City' of Chatswood, there is so much to like. For a start, it's dynamic and all of you take part in its wonderful dynamism. But one aspect that is closest to my heart is our Thursday night Adoration.

Before going to the Seminary, I entered the Capuchins in Denver for two and a half years. There, as a novice, I was trained to offer thirty minutes of silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the morning, and again in the evening. And ever since leaving the Capuchins, and especially after becoming a priest, there is always that longing in my heart for this type of silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.Oftentimes as Catholics, we are asked if we have a personal relationship with our Lord.

Our relationship with Him is much more than personal; we have intimacy with Him, especially in the Eucharist. When we receive Holy Communion, there is a merging that happens between us and God. There is a mystical or divine union! And because we have tasted the sweetness of our Lord in the Eucharist, we have that longing to be intimate with Him. And this is where our devotion to the Blessed Sacrament comes in. A week is too long to not be in the bosom of our Lord. Our Thursday night Adoration satisfies that longing for intimacy and reinforces our affection towards our Lord as we look forward to receiving him on the weekend in Holy Communion.

On the practical side, our world is so fast paced nowadays that we need some time to just slow down, recollect ourselves, and do nothing. Having an hour before the Lord in silence, and resting on Him, will surely lower our stress levels. Oftentimes in the middle of the week, we become easily irritated because of the many demands upon us. Just coming before the Lord before the Blessed Sacrament and offering all our concerns and worries to Him, will make our "yoke easy and our burden light" (Matthew 11:30).

The ambience of our Adoration night is so appropriate for meditation since we dim the church and place candles on the sanctuary. There is a time during Adoration that we offer candles at the foot of the altar as a symbol of our prayers, and especially our petitions, to God. We use incense, and the priest also gives the Benediction at the end. And as far as unburdening is concerned, there are also two priests who listen to Confession for the whole duration of the Adoration.

If you feel exhausted in the middle of the week, or if you feel you are drifting in life, I invite you to come and attend our Thursday night Adoration, even once, and see if it works for you. The Lord says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28). Our Lord is waiting for you in the Blessed Sacrament and He wants you to rest in Him.

THIS WEEK'S BULLETIN COVER PICTURE: THE MARTYRS OF CHINA

This Sunday's Gospel highlights to us the importance of taking up our cross to be worthy of Jesus:

Anyone who does not accept his cross is not worthy of me. Anyone who welcomes you, welcomes me.

When I prepare the bulletin, I try to have an image on the front that captures the essence of the message of the week's Gospel, but it can get difficult - there's only so many images of Jesus preaching to people that I can put in before the message itself gets lost in the repetitiveness of the images.

So in the weeks where the images are scarce, I look to the lives of the saints, because with over 10 000 saints recognised formally, there will always be someone who has proclaimed the message of the Gospel through their life.

For this week's image I've chosen an icon of the 120 Martyrs of China. These women and men were killed because they refused to renounce their faith during the Boxer Rebellion. Their lives stand as a profound testament to the Gospel's call to take up our cross and follow Jesus.

Their sacrifice challenges us to reflect on our own commitment to Christ. Are we willing to bear the hardships and challenges that may arise as a result of our faith? Are we prepared to set aside our personal comfort and convenience for the sake of the Gospel? The example of these martyrs compels us to examine our own hearts and to recommit ourselves to live wholeheartedly for Jesus.

May their lives continue to shine as a beacon of hope and inspiration, urging us to live out the Gospel in every aspect of our lives, and reminding us that to be worthy of Jesus means to take up our cross and follow Him, regardless of the cost.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

We think of a cost-benefit analysis as being such a feature of modern business practice, yet here in Matthew we find a basic form of the same thing. You do not need to spend years at university studying business administration or marketing to know that if the benefits outweigh costs then an enterprise is worth undertaking.

What does it cost being a disciple of Jesus? It costs us everything. It costs us our time and effort. Well, anything worth having does! It costs us our freedom and our families. Well, that happens to some in business and we are warned that is too high a cost to pay for anything! It costs us our lives. Well, hang on a minute! The last level was already too high a price; how can we be expected to give even more commitment? Can anything be worth giving up our very lives?

To be worth it, the benefits have to outweigh the costs, right? If we have already paid everything, what benefit can there be that makes having surrendered everything worthwhile? The cost is too high, the benefits seem to have evaporated. Where is the return on our investments? If we are put to the sword, if we take up our cross and follow him, what do we get in return? Here we must factor in the kingdom of heaven, for without it the cost-benefit analysis Jesus provides makes no sense at all. Being a Christian is not about profit-taking and short-term returns. Being a Christian is about believing that a stock market crash is about the best thing that can happen to us. This is simply crazy! If we operated like that in the business world we would soon be out of business. No wonder so many people back out of being Christian when they discover what it will cost them, and if we are not paying that price then we are not being Christian. What makes it even more crazy is that when we pay that price we do not earn anything. What we get from God is a gift, and we get that gift before we pay.

Now, just as our heads stop spinning from all this craziness, we can add in the paradoxes from Matthew's Gospel. In order to live in peace Jesus does not tell us to take up the sword but to suffer the sword. Jesus does not tell us to hate father and mother and children (at least not in Matthew's version); we are to love our family, but to love God even more. Augustine of Hippo says, in one of his homilies: 'Love your father, but not above your Lord; love the one who begot you, but not above the one who created you ... Love your mother, but not above the Church, who bore you to eternal life' (Sermo 344). If we read the last part of the passage carefully, the reward that Jesus speaks of is not the reward given to us but the reward given to those who are good to us.

What is the reward God offers us? What is the gift God has given to us already even before we have paid the price? The Spirit is the gift of God. The Spirit incorporates us into life, an eternal and divine life lived in love. True love is not about what we get from others but about what we give to others. The cross is true love. If you want to love your children, give your life on the cross. If you want to love your parents, give your life on the cross. If you want to love strangers, give your life on the cross. If you want to love your our brothers and sisters, give your life on the cross. If you want to love your neighbours or love strangers, give your life on the cross. If you want to love your enemies, give your life on the cross.

We are thankful today for the cross of Christ, for the cross is the way to resurrection, it is the way to life, it is our way to respond to the gift of love God has given us. It is the strength to sustain us. In that same homily Augustine says, 'But let us have confidence, because the one who instituted this contest does not watch his own champion without helping them, nor does he encourage us to rely on our own strength' (Sermo 344). The help of God is given to us through the Spirit, the help of God is given to us in bread that is broken and in wine that is poured out. The help of God is given to us through the body of the Lord that was broken and the blood of the Lord that was spilled. We thank God for the gift of eternal life found only through the cost of discipleship. This is our mission, sisters and brothers: to lose everything to gain it all.

VINNIES CHATSWOOD WINTER APPEAL JULY 1-2



The St Vincent de Paul 2023 Chatswood Winter Appeal is being held this weekend. This local Appeal is part of the Statewide Appeal which began in May and will last until the end of August.

The main work of the St Vincent de Paul Chatswood Conference is to provide support and assistance for people in need in our local area. The Chatswood Conference has so far received more than 50 requests for assistance; and has expended over \$8,000 in meeting the emergency needs of the people in our local community.

The supports we have provided included food, medical, pharmaceutical, whitegoods, furniture, rental assistance, transport and clothing.

Our parish contains a large government housing population from which comes most of the calls for assistance. Many of those seeking for support are people from disadvantage backgrounds, single parent family, people with mental health issues and those lacking life skills to handle problems.

Up until last year, your generous support has allowed us to cover all the costs in providing supports to people in need in our area without the need to seek supplement funds from other areas of the society.

If you wish to make a donation, envelopes are around the church and may be put on the collection plates. Provision is made in the envelopes for cash or credit card donations.

New Sung Mass:

The Parish Choir is singing every Sunday at the 10:30am mass. We have recently introduced a new mass setting, which is intended to be accessible and easy to sing for the congregation. It is called "Mass of Our Lady", and it will be introduced to more masses in the coming weeks. I hope that as you listen to it each week, it will grow on you and become more familiar.

New Organ:

I am delighted to announce that we have acquired a new organ for the church. It is a reed organ, built by Danish company Joh. P . Andresen & Co. Not much is known about the company, but it seems that the organ was probably built in the early to mid-20th century.

A reed organ differs from a pipe organ in that its sound is produced using small metal reeds. It has no pedalboard, but instead has two pedals for pumping air. Reed organs require constant pedalling to maintain a steady airflow while playing, similar to bagpipes. Much like a pipe organ, it uses stop knobs to create different sounds, and it also has knee levers for more expressive capabilities. This allows a reed organ to go from very soft to very loud instantly, giving the performer great versatility. I am excited to find possible uses for this instrument in the liturgy,

particularly for Holy Hour, as its warm tone lends itself well to devotional services.

As we look to enhance the worship in our parish, the time has come to formally establish the Parish Choir. This choir rehearses on Thursday evenings from 5:30-7:00pm, and generally sings on a Sunday at the 10:30am service. If you love to sing, you are invited to be a part of the next chapter in our church's musical life. Regular attendance is not essential.

On the third Sunday of each month, we invite the children of the parish to sing in the Children's Choir for the 9:00am mass. Music is a wonderful and natural gift of children, and this is the perfect opportunity for them to be a part of the music in the church. Rehearsals take place after the 9:00am mass, on the second Sunday of the month.
