

## FROM FR DAVID



DDear friends,

Last week we introduced an additional Mass during the week: a Wednesday evening 6pm Mass. Different people have shared that this may be advantageous to people given that there is no weekday evening Mass on the North Shore, and that people may appreciate being able to come to Mass after work and before dinner. At our first Wednesday evening Mass last week we had some ten people with us which was indeed a promising start. This means now that of a Wednesday we have three Masses: 9,00am, 12.30pm and 6.00pm. We will trial the new 6.00pm Mass for a couple of months and then review. However, do spread the word about the availability of this weekday evening Mass.

This weekend we conduct our annual CatholicCare Broken Bay Homeless Appeal, ahead of Homelessness Week, 7-13 August. There is no place like home. But for many, having a home is not possible. The causes may be diverse, but the impact is the same – a loss of dignity and a sense of hopelessness. Few people choose to be homeless and the longer a person remains homeless, the more difficult it is to return to a mainstream environment. CatholicCare offers a raft of services to help CatholicCare provides a women's refuge, transitional accommodation options, young parent's homelessness services and street sleeping outreach support. CatholicCare also operate Dom's Place in Hornsby and Mary Mac's in Woy Woy providing meals, a place to shower and wash clothes, and somewhere for people who are homeless or transient to be welcome and to connect with support and community. Many people who access CatholicCare services are lonely, and when they walk through the door they can frequently be simply seeking a listening ear.

The appeal coincides with the Feast Day of St Mary Mackillop of the Cross on Tuesday 8 August. Mary enjoyed the attitude "never leave a need unattended." We give thanks for her astounding example of self-giving and for the manner in which she pioneered a distinctively Australian holiness: pragmatic, self-sacrificing and ordinary. On Tuesday we will honour Mary through our two scheduled Masses of 9.00am and 12.30pm. The following Tuesday, 15 August is the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary. For the occasion, we will enjoy an online Rosary on the evening of 14 August, and then have five Masses through Tuesday 15 August: 9.00am (with Our Lady of Dolours Primary School). 10.15am (with classes from St Pius College). 12.30pm, 1.45pm (with senior students of both Mercy College and Pius College) and then at 7.00pm,

With great joy we share that our Parish Director of Music, Titus Grenyer, in addition to his engagement with our parish, has been appointed the Organist for Sydney Town Hall. This is a very prestigious appointment and we warmly congratulate Titus. It is testament to his fine organ scholarship. With our parish enjoying the presence of such an accomplished musician, we have been considering even further ways to ensure our parish as a centre of excellence in sacred music. To this end, we will shortly be able to offer two scholarships to senior students who wish to learn organ. We are also looking to attract from among tertiary students an Organ Scholar and a Choral Scholar who would join us for a twelve month period, benefiting from their mentoring by Titus but also contributing to the quality of music in our parish. We are hopeful that this will be a significant enrichment to the status of our church.

Last Wednesday evening, we furthered our preparation for our Parish-in-Council, our first meeting being on Saturday 26 August. A number of parishioners came together to offer their availability as facilitators for the day. As I shared last week, meeting as a Parish-in-Council exercises our co-responsibility for mission. We walk together to give life to our Parish Mission: Bringing the Light of Christ: we love, we grow, we serve. Our meetings, therefore, are one's of encounter, listening and discernment. And for this to occur we require a very particular methodology. The methodology is one of table conversation, around particular questions, by which each and every person has the opportunity to have their voice heard. Together the participants listen to what the 'table' is saying through such individual contributions. It is the common discernment that is then fed back into the larger group in such a way that leads us to outcomes that can be actioned. This is to experience the Gospel account of Luke 24. The disciples are walking together to a town. A stranger joins them. He asks a question, they respond with a question and a conversation begins. Yet, through the conversation and the way in which it begins to bring them new hope they come to the recognition of the presence of the Risen Lord, most fully in the breaking of bread together. So, too, our meeting on Saturday 26 August will be supported with a range of conversations, invite us to listen to one another, and hopefully lead us to new vision. For this reason, our facilitators will serve a vital role on the day enabling the process of table conversation to have its potential and discipline.

It is important, however, for us to keep in mind that our meeting on 26 August is but our first one. We plan to meet as a Parish-in-Council four times a year, and in so doing, and as we become familiar with the methodology, to gain a momentum of direction into the future. No one meeting can achieve this. However, our growing experience of being a Parish-in-Council may well do this.

All are welcome to join Our Parish-in-Council on Saturday 26 August, but remember registrations are essential. And registrations close on Sunday 13 August, so we have but this week ahead to register. This will then enable us to complete all the logistical preparation for the occasion.

Do keep this new step in the life of our parish community in your prayer.

#### **Requests for Mass Intentions:**

It is a privilege to our priests to be able to offer Mass for a special intention, we welcome such requests. It is important to note, however, that a priest can only receive one intention per Mass. Therefore, it may not be possible to have a Mass offered on a specific day and time, given that the priest may already have allocated an intention for the Mass. #### **Gospel Connection:**

The event of the Transfiguration strengthened the bond between Jesus and His inner circle of disciples.

How can moments of shared spiritual experiences strengthen the community and fellowship among believers today?



## GOSPEL REFLECTION

This feast is so rich that it impossible to give a single explanation or interpretation. We need to put aside our constant Western desire to categorise neatly, and to proceed as in the East, poetically, allowing the interplay of images and ideas to evoke the mystery beyond our grasp. Like beholding an opal, its whole beauty cannot be seen from any one angle. Origen (mid-third century) is the earliest witness (Comm. in Ps. 88.13) to the claim that the transfiguration took place on Galilee's Mount Tabor, a border point for the lands of Zebulun, Issachar and Naphtali, and the trade route called the Way of the Sea that passed its base. That location is not inconsistent with Matthew's narrative and so was widely accepted over the next centuries. It could have been guided by reflection on Isaiah 9:1-2, as cited in Mathew 4:13-16 (both read on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time in year A): "Zebulun! Napthali! Way of the Sea... The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned." Another ancient tradition has the transfiguration occurring forty days before the crucifixion, and counting from the Exaltation of the Cross brings us to 6 August, the date on which Mount Tabor's fifth-century Byzantine basilica was dedicated. The earliest known observance of this feast in the West is from the ninth century, whence it spread, though not with it always being celebrated on the same date. It was fixed on 6 August for the whole Roman rite only in 1457.

The account contains many features shared by other theophanies. The high mountain, the usual awe-inspiring meeting point between heaven and earth, is where Moses on Horeb encounters God in the burning bush, and on Sinai/Horeb he receives the Law and his face shines, and there the people of Israel say "Do not let us hear again the Voice, nor see the Fire (splendour of God)" (Deut 18:16); on Mount Carmel Elijah contents with the priests of Baal, then on Horeb, after wind, earthquake, and fire, he hears the "still small voice" and speaks with God (see the first reading on the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time, A). The cloud most often indicates darkness, but God's glory also manifests in cloud: whether a dark or bright cloud, the result remains the same, blindness, the inability to see God. The light is related to the cloud. White, and brightness, feature in the first reading from Daniel, such that the transfigured Jesus is consistently described in the same way as the Ancient of Days (except for age) and thus as the visible image of the invisible Father. Lastly the Voice, which is often deafening, sometimes whispering, repeats the words heard at the baptism (Matthew 3:17), "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; listen to him."

In the use of Cloud, Light, and Voice, we appear to have verbal portraits of the invisible, and reports of the ineffable. There are two main interpretations of the transfiguration: firstly, Jesus in his human nature changed, manifesting the divinisation of human nature in the Incarnation of the Word; secondly, Jesus did not change, for God is unchanging, but the disciples' spiritual eyes were opened to see him as he is. This evokes 1 John 3:3, "we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is." An Orthodox interpretation also explains this as a trinitarian theophany: the Father speaks (the unseen Voice), the Son shines (the Light), and the Holy Spirit is present in the Cloud. In the Synoptic Gospels it marks a turning point: just as at the baptism he soon embarked on his mission of proclaiming the kingdom of heaven, soon after the transfiguration he sets out for Jerusalem.

This is a permanent full-time position.






LiveWorkCancer has established Networks to support women and men navigating work/careers and while experiencing cancer.




