

# FROM FR DAVID

## Dear friends

Our parish pilgrims to the Holy Land have begun to depart, some leaving on last Friday, others leaving in the coming days. We have 24 on the pilgrimage under the spiritual leadership of Fr Joey. We look forward to hearing from them along their journey. We pray that they may be kept safe and that they have the most grace-filled time.

This weekend we 'introduce' our Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) with a presentation at each of our Masses, led by our CCD Coordinator, Karen Forbes. This is the ministry undertaken each week by our wonderful band of some 50 catechists who conduct the Special Religious Education (SRE) for our Catholic students at the five public primary schools in our parish and at Chatswood High. We have over 700 Catholic children at these schools, and our catechists share the Faith with them with such commitment and care. Each term I go with some

of them and visit two of the many classes they conduct. I always come away deeply inspired and renewed in my own faith. We are always in need of further volunteers on a Wednesday and Thursday mornings. A great way to begin is to come along as a Catechist Assistant to 'get the feel'. Our Catechists are very well supported by our diocesan CCD team so that they are well resourced with lesson plans and loads of other helps. It takes but one hour a week so do give some thought to how to share in this very special ministry. We certainly need you!

We have now come to the end of Term 3 for our children and their families! А mighty congratulations to the whole community of Our Lady of Dolours Primary School for the amazing production of "The Little Mermaid" at the Concert Hall on Chatswood Concourse last Thursday evening. All 340 children participated before a sell-out audience of 750 people. Last Wednesday, our Year 12 students at Pius X College and at Mercy College graduated too. It was quite special for me as in both Colleges I have known some of the students since they were in Kindergarten. We wish them all the very best now for the HSC examinations and for the new chapter that begins to unfold for them.



During the coming week, our Diocese will host the Ignite Conference for young people at the Light of Christ Centre in Waitara. We have some 10 young people going from our parish under the leadership of Bettina Ignacio our Youth Ministry Officer. Fr Marek will be one of the number of priests there assisting with the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Penance and supporting our young people. It begins on Thursday evening and stretches through until next Sunday.

# GOSPEL REFLECTION

Do today's readings revolve around comparing our lives with others and how unfair life is, or do they emphasize God's boundless love and unwavering outreach to us? The underlying thread that connects the First Reading and the Gospel is the theme of God's limitless generosity. In the First Reading, taken from Isaiah 55:6-9, we are prepared for the profound message in the Gospel, which emphasizes the contrast between God's ways and human ways, God's thoughts and human thoughts.

The Gospel presents a parable about 'the Kingdom of Heaven.' It serves as a story that illustrates how God is fostering a genuine relationship with us, and promoting values that enable all individuals to lead lives that fully embrace their humanity.

The context in which this message is delivered invites those who have strayed to abandon their ways and turn to accept God as their Creator. This applies to us today as well. Sometimes, we may mistakenly believe that we

are too sinful or have wandered so far from the right path for God to have any interest in us. Even those leading virtuous lives may fall prey to the notion that "I have abandoned God; I may not be deserving of His care anymore." Such thoughts stem from negative influences and hinder our relationship with God. They confine God to a distorted image, formed by projecting our human relationship dynamics onto Him.

Hidden within the Gospel parable lies the subtle message that God has not abandoned us. In the parable, the landowner goes out five times in a single day to hire workers for his vineyard, symbolizing God's constant outreach to us. Our God never tires of searching for us, demonstrating His love.

If we shift our focus from the reactions of those who felt cheated to the goodness of the landowner, we will understand that Jesus wants us to recognize in our hearts that God is a loving and exceedingly generous. He encourages us not to view things solely from a worldly perspective. In today's story, those who worked all day were upset when those who had worked for only one hour received the same wages. They exclaimed, "These last worked only one hour, and yet you have made them equal to us, who bore the burden of the day and the scorching heat." In a way, these workers were correct. God did make them equal. In God's eyes, we are all equal – equally deserving of God's love and generosity.

God loves us, even when we feel undeserving of His love. However, we must guard against developing a false sense of entitlement. While God's forgiveness is boundless, our relationship with Him holds great personal significance. To be authentic we need to love God as well. How do we value God's love and generosity? Are we sincere in responding to His invitation? Are we willing to acknowledge our vulnerability and dependence, accepting the salvation earned through Jesus, our Christ? While the Gospel parable underscores that we cannot earn our way to heaven, it reminds us of the importance of fostering a sincere relationship with God.

When we align our thinking with God's perspective, rather than being disheartened by this parable, we will be filled with boundless joy. This parable reveals that God loves us more profoundly than we can fathom and has saved us through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

In closing, let us remember that we are all embraced by God's boundless love, regardless of our perceived shortcomings or past mistakes. God's infinite generosity and unyielding desire for a close relationship with us should fill our hearts with warmth and gratitude. As we reflect on these readings, may we find solace in the fact that God's love knows no bounds, and through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, we are cherished beyond measure. Let us go forth with joy in our hearts, sharing this love and kindness with all we encounter, for it is in the spirit of compassion and empathy that we truly reflect God's divine love to the world

# UPDATES

## Catechists & assistant Catechists, we need you!

- During school terms, Catechists in the Chatswood parish provide Catholic education classes – Special Religious Education (SRE) at five public primary schools within the parish: Artarmon, Castle Cove, Chatswood, Mowbray & Roseville.
- Scripture classes are held from Kindergarten to Year 6; children attend with the permission of their parents.
- SRE classes are held weekly during school terms from Tuesdays Thursdays, mostly in the mornings from about 9am – 12.30pm.
- Each class is half an hour in duration.
- Catechists at Chatswood High School provide seminars to high school students from Years 7 – 11 twice each term.
- Through praying together and exploring the teachings of Jesus, Catholic SRE lessons aim to provide children with a framework to help them make choices that recognise their relationship with God and with others, and they learn they are loved by God always.
- Children receive lessons that give them awareness and background information on the Sacraments that may be available to them and their families within the parish.

Teachers manuals with lesson plans are supplied to Catechists for their lessons, and power point slides are also available. Catechists spend some time preparing lessons however lessons don't need to be prepared from scratch: all the lesson are contained in the manual. Student activity books are provided to all students attending lessons and student work on their lesson activities as guided by the Catechist.



We are planning for SRE in 2024 and our main need in the parish is for assistant catechists to be classroom helpers: handing out student books and helping Catechists with activities that take place. Apart from a few admin requirements to get started in a classroom, assistants don't need to prepare lessons!

# PILGRIMAGE TO THE HOLY LAND

This week many of our parish's pilgrims set out on their journey and next Monday the last of us leave. We have been entrusted with prayer requests from many of you as we set out including in some cases with special sites where you would like us to give them up to God on your behalf. You can still do so this weekend. I'll make a last check of the box at the back of the church after 10.30 Mass.

The call to pilgrimage is part of the religious experience of people of all faiths in all times. The earliest Christian pilgrimage to Jerusalem was made by a woman, Egeria, in 381 and took her nearly 5 years! We hope to be back with you long before that, in time for Mass on the weekend of 14/15 October in fact. But the Vatican tells us that we are a pilgrim church, on a journey towards the kingdom of the Father. In our parish, we are also on a journey towards a more inclusive and synodal life together, a new way of being as a parish. One goes on a pilgrimage to ask God for help needed to live more generously one's own Christian vocation, explains the Vatican's Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy. Or as the Psalmist put it: I rejoiced with those who said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord". Our feet are standing in your gates, Jerusalem... that is where the tribes go up, to praise the name of the Lord. (Psalm 122) You can be sure that we will be praying for our parish and its journey as the 24 of us travel together the roads that Jesus took on His journey to Emmaus and the Kingdom.



# VINNIES UPDATE

In August Chatswood Parish Conference attended to 8 requests for help and expended some \$1500 in responding to them. Four of these requests were from people new to us.

Help provided was furniture, a bed replacement for a Disability Support pensioner and fitting out a small flat for a person just who had previously been living out of a car. Due to changed circumstances a single parent family began struggling with rent and bills so we are helping out till affordable accommodation is found. Food assistance was provided to two persons and transport to a disabled pensioner to attend medical consultation. Information on our No Interest Loans scheme was provided to another person also struggling with job loss and rental problems. 2 of the cases are ongoing.

## FORMATION **COURSE 2023** Level 1 Part 1

A Formation Experience for adults working with 3 to 6 year old children.

### COURSE DESCRIPTION AND AIMS

The Level One Formation Course is the foundation course for all three levels of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program. The aims of the course are:

- To explore with participants the general developmental characteristics, religious nature and religious needs of the 3 to 6 year old child.
- To meditate on the Biblical and Liturgical themes of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. This method was first developed by Dr. Sofia Cavalletti and Professor Gianna Gobbi in Rome, Italy and has been used now for over fifty years in various places throughout the world.
- To offer guidelines and assistance to catechists in setting up an atrium for the 3 to 6 year old child, preparing presentation album pages and making materials.
- To experience being formed as catechists by the Word of God and deepening our ability to observe and learn from the children, the joy of the Gospel!

Participants are expected to attend all sessions, and to have read or be reading: The Religious Potential of the Child, The Good Shepherd and the Child: A Joyfu Journey, Listening to God with Children Currently out of print). These publications are available from the National Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and online. Copies will be available for borrowing.

Participants who attend all sessions will receive a certificate from the National Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

Angela Hague **Course Formation** Leader

Angela is the Co-ordinator of Our Lady of Dolours Children's Atrium in Chatswood. She is a leading member of the National Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and has been involved in this work since November 2001. Angela began the first Atrium in Sydney in May 2005.






