# FROM FR DAVID



Dear friends

Our deep sympathy to Joan Pitman and her sister Jean on the loss of their beloved mother, Teresita last Monday 22 October. We extend to them and all the family our affection at this time and pray that eternal rest be granted Teresita. We will farewell Teresita on Wednesday 1 November at Macquarie Park at 11am. May Teresita and all the souls of the Faithful Departed rest in peace.

Fr Joey left last Wednesday for three weeks of annual leave, returning on 13 November. We pray that he will be kept safe in his travels and return to us refreshed and relaxed. On the matter of travel, some brochures are in the foyer promoting a pilgrimage to India in February 2024 on which I have been asked to be one of the chaplains. This is an initiative of the Parish of French's Forest which has conducted a number of such pilgrimages in the past. There are just a few spots left on the forthcoming trip, so if you are interested in joining this pilgrimage do let the organisers know as soon as possible!

Thank you to all those who entered our month of October as prayerfully. October is a special month in which we remember Mary the mother of the Lord, especially through the prayer of the Rosary. On the last day of the month, Tuesday 31 October at 4.30pm the Rosary will be prayed on our Forecourt at 4.30pm bringing to a conclusion the month of devotions.

We now approach the month of November. This Wednesday we celebrate All Saints Day: Masses will be celebrated at 9am, 12.30pm and 6.00pm. And then on Thursday 2 November we celebrate the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed with four Masses through the day: 7.00am, 9.00am, 12.30pm and 7.00pm. Please note that there will be no Holy Hour celebrated on Thursday evening. This year we will be trying something new. We invite people to buy a candle for \$5 on which we will write the names of their loved ones that have passed away. The labels can fit up to 5 names. Payments and orders will take place on Trybooking with cash payments available at the office. When people come to Mass (any Mass in November), they are invited to light their candle before Mass and the servers will extinguish it after Mass. Further details are in the bulletin.

It is an honoured custom to ask for a Mass to be celebrated during November for the repose of the soul of our deceased. Envelopes are available in the foyer of the church. Please note however that it is not possible to designate a day or time for these Mass intentions. The Mass intentions will be distributed amongst the clergy and the Mass will be offered by the priest when it may be possible. A priest can only receive one intention per Mass. So if more intentions are received than available Masses the priests will send the intentions to other priests to help celebrate.

On Wednesday 15 November at 6.00pm we will have a special Mass for all our deceased children through pregnancy loss and stillbirth. Do spread the word about this, and invite all those affected by miscarriage or still birth to come and to hold the life of their deceased child before the Lord in whom everyone lives and in whom no one is lost.

November is also the month in which we will conduct the Second Session of our Parish-in-Council: Saturday 18 November. Registrations are now open! Everyone is welcome, but registrations are essential for our planning. Our Parish-in-Council invites to come together in pastoral discernment all those who affiliate with our Parish, not just those who may live in the geographical territory of the parish. Much work is occurring in the background, and last Monday evening we had over 50 people come together to take the formulation of our Parish Vision forward. It was a very productive evening and will assist the work on 18 November greatly.

This weekend we welcome Catholic Mission to our Parish, as we do at this time each year. Our speaker will be Conor Nolan. This is a great opportunity for us to learn about the endeavours of the Church in Australia contributing to the developing Church in so many different ways.



# **GOSPEL REFLECTION**



If we look at the first reading from Exodus and the Gospel from Matthew, we can see a clear message of God's love for humanity. We can see His vision of how we should live together and how it can transform our world. Both readings prescribe how to care for and love our family, friends, coworkers and strangers in need.

In today's reading from Exodus[1], Moses teaches the Chosen People how to be fair to people who don't have much power, like foreigners, widows, and orphans. It's more than just rules; it's about being a good person. For example, if someone is so poor they have to borrow money for food, charging them extra makes their life harder. Or think about taking away the only blanket someone has to keep warm. That's more than a bad deal; it's unfair.

The Gospel passage[2] is called the Great Commandment, not only because of the question from the Pharisees but also because of the brilliant answer with which Jesus responds. This Gospel passage shows how effectively God can turn the manipulative and malicious intent of the Pharisees' question into a beautiful, all-encompassing

virtue to live by; "to love God fully and love your neighbour as yourself."

The religious leaders of the time, the Pharisees, wanted to trick Jesus into picking one rule as more important than others. Christ's interpretation was more reasonable, for he put the law in service of people, as in the principle, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath." [3]

This idea that people come first isn't just about religious rules. It applies to everything—our jobs, the economy, social policies, and respect for the planet. These things are there to make our lives more fulfilling, not to make us subservient to them.

The Psalm and the letter from St Paul help to underscore the great commandment given by Jesus. They illustrate the practice of living the great commandment in our lives. The Psalm is a prayer of praise by King David in thanks to God, who has saved him from his enemies who can harm him. We all have harmful enemies: our sinful tendencies, bad people, the physical world, and evil temptations. Meanwhile, the letter from St. Paul points to the power of modelling good behaviour. This way, people around us can see Christ in us and through us.

All of this grows out of a complete love of God with our hearts, souls and minds. By our example and words, we proclaim the word of Christ. We will become people who can model good behaviour among our family, friends, coworkers and strangers in need.



# **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

# THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT

Communities, like the individuals that make them up, cannot exist or grow without reflecting on their stories. In remembering our past, we are reminded of lessons learnt, values shared, and obstacles overcome.

While the setting for the first reading is that of the time of the Exodus it clearly reflects the problems the Israelites faced when they had settled in the land. In order to resolve these problems, they are called to remember that they are a people where every member should be valued, especially those who cannot defend themselves. The other person is precious to God and has a dignity that is to be respected and preserved. They are reminded of their past so as to build a present that is just and equitable.

Jesus in his turn was asked what the most important commandment of the law was. The law of Moses was that formative and guiding tradition that shaped the Jewish people's self-understanding. In a sense, by asking what is the greatest commandment the Pharisees were asking, who are we? Jesus' reply is that we can only be truly ourselves when we can balance a wholehearted love of God with care for our brothers and sisters.

As Paul reflects on the history of the Thessalonian community, he praises God for the way they have overcome numerous obstacles. In the midst of opposition, they remained faithful to each other and to the Lord, so much so that they became a base for Paul's further missionary endeavour in the rest of Greece.

# MUSIC UPDATE



Last Sunday at the 10:30am mass, the Parish Choir sang an Alleluia from the Graduale Romanum, a book containing the main collection of Gregorian chants. This was certainly a challenge, as it is still new to many in the choir, but it was also immensely satisfying to sing this beautiful music.

The Catholic church has always put on singing the music of our own heritage, of which Gregorian chant is of particular significance. We need look no further than paragraph 116 of the Vatican II document Sacrosanctum Concilium: "The Church acknowledges Gregorian chant as specially suited to the Roman Liturgy: therefore, under normal circumstances, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services."

Chanted music alone is the musical language created by and more for the church, with its earliest notations dating back to the 9th century, of which many melodies are based on an even oral tradition that probably dates back to the early Church. It is one of the great treasures of the Catholic faith. I hope we can continue to sing more of it, as well as find ways to introduce it to all our weekend sung masses, as has long been the wish of the popes before and after Vatican II.



# St John Marie Vianney (1786 -1859) and the Blessed Sacrament

John Vianney was a man undistinguished by his intellectual capacity and struggled to meet the academic requirements for ordination to the priesthood. As a priest however, he was so distinguished by his holiness that he attracted penitents from near and far and was outstanding in his love of the Blessed Sacrament. His priesthood was such that he has been designated the patron saint of priests.

The following reflection on his love for the Blessed Sacrament is well worth consideration by anyone who regards imitation of the saints as a way to personal growth in holiness:

St. John Vianney was known to sometimes in the pulpit, wishing to preach on the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, get so choked up that he could hardly speak and would, with tears, point to the tabernacle and say: "There He is!" and that is all he could say. "We should consider those moments spent before the Blessed Sacrament as the happiest of our lives. Our Lord is hidden there, waiting for us to come and visit Him, and make our request to Him".

Currently we have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for adoration and prayer on Thursday mornings following the 9 am Mass to 12 noon and again from 7 – 8 pm in the evenings. Of course Jesus is truly present in the tabernacle and available to us at all times for prayer and adoration by all those who recognize his real presence in the tabernacle. Parishioners are encouraged to avail of these opportunities to spend time with the Lord.


