FROM FR DAVID

Dear friends,

We are fast approaching our second Session of Parish in Council on Saturday 18 November. Everyone is welcome, including all those who may live beyond the territory of our parish but who affiliate with us, and those who were present at our first session on 26 August. Returning to the second session will not take the place of anyone! Registrations are essential, however. And these will close in the coming days to enable us to finalise our planning. This time, too, we will be joined by some observers from neighbouring parishes as the concept of Parish-in-Council becomes more widely known. Do please register as soon as possible this week!

With pleasure I also share with you some changes to our parish team which brings to completion the re-configuration of our parish team that we have had in place for most of this year:

a. Effective Monday 6 November, we have a new Parish Receptionist. This is Diana Tinambun. Diana will be with us Monday – Friday 9am- 5pm. Diana will be known to a number of us, having been a part of our parish for a number of years, until relatively recently. Diana comes to us from an accounting and finance background with roles within Fund Accountings and Risk and Control. Her last role was a Fund Accounting Team Leader in Colonial First State, a superannuation company. Now she seeks a change in career, inspired by her Catholic faith and her sense of mission, and we very much look forward to her contribution.

b. Also effective Monday 6 November, Chloe Aylward assumes a new position as Parish Projects Officer. This is a three day a week position, Monday – Wednesday, with Wednesday working from home. In this role Chloe will have responsibility for our Parish Planned Giving Program, our database, Sacramental Registers and their administration, Safeguarding Compliance and support for our Parish-in-Council. Chloe has been a great asset to us over the last several months in her capacity in our front office, but is not able to continue with us full-time. Thankfully, however, she remains an important member of our team.

c. On Tuesday 7 November, Mona Saouma takes up a new position in our team as Pastoral Support Worker. This is a three day a week position, Tuesday- Thursday 9am -5pm. Mona will continue to provide her invaluable assistance to Angela Hague in Children's Ministry but now also broaden her assistance to Families, including playgroup activities and Seniors Ministry.

d. From Monday 13 November, we will also have the services of a Parish Accountant, Ilona Dudek. Ilona will be engaged as an Independent Contractor to work with Amelia, our Book-keeper, to supervise monthly financial reports, publish Quarterly Financial Reports and assist us with high level financial administration. Ilona is well versed in parishes, being also currently engaged with Lower North Shore Parish and the Parish of French's Forest. Ilona grew up in our own parish and her mother attends our Spanish Masses.

Last Sunday, I visited the North Shore Temple Emmanuel in Chatswood and spent time with Rabbi Nicole Roberts and Rabbi Moshe Givental. I was deeply impressed by their sensitivity and vision. In the midst of such dreadful conflict it was important and significant to reach out and to make new friendships. We are deeply conscious of the suffering in the Middle East: we hold both the suffering of people in Israel deeply traumatised by events of 7 October and the suffering of people in Gaza who are victim to such struggles for power. We hold every person who is suffering equal in our hearts and prayers. We are also very conscious of the rise of anti-Semitism in societies around the world, including in Australia that makes our Jewish friends deeply fearful. Anti-Semitism can never be the response to our concern for the people of Gaza. We must condemn every form of it and seek always the path of friendship. In so doing. It has been a grace over these months to develop friendships now with both our Buddhist and Jewish brothers and sisters in Chatswood and we look forward, when the time and opportunity is right, to grow our new found relationships. In so doing we bring the light of Christ to our city which is always a light that brings peace and fraternity.

This weekend I am in Canberra, honoured to be joining Stephen and Carla Gageler and their family for Stephen's installation as Chief Justice of Australia in the High Court on Monday 6 November. Again, we congratulate Stephen on this most eminent appointment and wish him and Carla and their family our prayerful best wishes on this important occasion.

GOSPEL REFLECTION



Here are some unsettling questions:

Am I happy to help others without being praised for my service?

Am I content even when my good deeds go unnoticed?

Do I live out my faith or simply give lip service to my beliefs?

These are not easy questions to ask, and the answers may be hard to uncover. Yet, uncomfortable as such a question-and-answer session may be, it can reveal attitudes and behavior that Jesus wants to heal in us so that our hearts can be free to serve him more effectively. Jesus warned his disciples not to imitate those scribes and Pharisees who didn't put their own preaching and teaching into practice, yet expected everyone else to do so.

He also reproached those teachers who performed "all their deeds to be seen by others," taking pride in their positions and in public honours.

Jesus didn't mince any words in criticizing these Pharisees for their outward display of

holiness. That's because he knew that many of them weren't living up to the standard they expected from others. We can be sure they had good intentions. They studied the Law because they wanted to follow God's will, but their behaviour contradicted it. They modified their religious clothing to make it stand out more, and they sought the respect of the people, not for who they were but for their position in society.

We might wonder why the Pharisees were so concerned about other people's opinions. It's not that they were insecure. It's more likely that they were trying to protect their faith against corruption by their Roman occupiers. They wanted to preserve Judaism at all costs. And so, they stressed ritual and tradition to the point that they lost sight of what was supposed to be underneath it.

In the process, they started looking down on those who weren't "true believers" according to their standards. Unfortunately, none of us is above this type of temptation. Though we may not carry enormous Bibles or wear huge crosses to show off, we may still want to be recognized for who we are and what we can do. Or we may hide our gifts, imagining we're not worthy enough to share them—which can also be a subtle form of pride.

But our weakness in these areas shouldn't discourage us. On the contrary, it should make us even more eager to seek God's mercy!

If we want to be humble, we don't have to look any further than Jesus for our example. He never tried to get attention. He never promoted himself, and yet he drew far more people than the Pharisees ever could. That's because he had what they needed—the Father's love.

We don't have to impress anyone if we are following Jesus. We just have to stay close to him, and people will recognize his presence within us. He will purify our hearts, so that we can empty ourselves, take up our crosses, and serve him with joy!In their conceit, those Pharisees were acting as if the gifts and responsibilities God had given them came from themselves and not from God. And what's worse, they were using these heavenly gifts to gain the admiration of their fellow Jews.

This doesn't mean that God wants us to hold a negative view of ourselves.

Actually, He delights in our achievements and even wants us to delight and take pride in them — but not in a way that steals from him. It's good to be pleased with our work and to be proud of our abilities.

But when we begin to act as if we've accomplished things on our own, without God's grace, or to think that our gifts make us better than other people, we need to remember Paul's admonition: "What do you have that you did not receive? And if you received it, why do you boast as if it were not a gift?"

Each one of us has been gifted by God. We have God given abilities, but we have to be free in our love of God to know that we can do them for Him not for ourselves. As I said at the beginning Jesus wants us to be free to serve him more effectively.

During Mass, let us offer ourselves and our gifts to the Lord again. Let him teach us how to use these gifts in a way that gives him glory and advances his kingdom. We can be proud of ourselves! So let him teach us the way to "godly pride."

Addressing the people and his disciples Jesus said, 'The scribes and the Pharisees occupy the chair of Moses. BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

CALLED TO SERVE

Leadership has always been a risky business. With leadership comes prestige and the esteem of others and yet these can be dangerous and murky waters. Those involved in leadership often experience being caught in the tension between the respective privileges and responsibilities that accompany their position. Today's readings converge in their concern to reflect on the nature of authority and how it should be exercised.

At the time Malachi wrote, the people of Israel were in dire need of religious reform and the priests were called to account for their role in creating that situation. If the charge could be laid at the feet of the priests in Malachi's time that they did not care for the people, the same could not be said for Paul. While Paul was called to be an apostle, he was also most concerned to offer the gospel without charge. In the ancient world wandering teachers were usually sponsored financially. Paul avoided such ambiguous relationships by not accepting any help from a community till he had established it and was ready to move on to another.

When Jesus sets out to address the disciples and the people about the scribes and Pharisees it probably sounded fairly safe. Anyone can be comfortable when another person is being subjected to scrutiny and criticism! But the second half of the Gospel suddenly changes direction and disciples in every age are given some guiding principles. Firstly, leadership comes from God, secondly, we belong to one family and thirdly, leadership means service.
