GOSPEL REFLECTION

As we approach the end of our liturgical calendar, the Church invites us to reflect on finality and the end-of-time truths that shape our faith. During this season, our liturgical readings take on an apocalyptic tone, a term derived from the Greek meaning 'to reveal' or 'to lay bare.' It is a time when the Church seeks to disclose the divine vision for the world, offering us a glimpse into the nature of God's kingdom so that we may ready ourselves for its coming.

Let's begin by delving into the second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians. Paul's transformative encounter with the risen Christ propelled him to become a pivotal figure in spreading the Gospel. His writings convey a sense of urgency and transformation, a call to be vigilant for the unprecedented events of the end times, heralded by the return of Jesus. Paul's message in 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 is unequivocal: be prepared for this momentous event.

The Gospel of Matthew presents us with the parable of the ten bridesmaids, a

symbolic narrative that illustrates the necessity of readiness for the Second Coming of Christ. The early Christians lived with the imminent expectation of Christ's return. Such anticipation should not be a cause for anxiety but a call to live in a state of hopeful watchfulness, embodying the love of Christ in our daily lives.

However, as decades passed, from the writing of Paul's epistles to the composition of Matthew's Gospel, a spiritual complacency began to take root. Today, two millennia later, we must confront the same tendency to lapse into spiritual complacency, the mistaken belief that the delay in Christ's return affords us the liberty to live without regard for the Gospel's demands. Yet, the Gospel warns us against such complacency.

In Matthew's account, the kingdom of God is likened to ten bridesmaids awaiting the bridegroom. The five wise bridesmaids are prepared for the bridegroom's arrival with their lamps well-supplied with oil. In contrast, the five foolish bridesmaids find themselves unprepared and, consequently, excluded from the wedding banquet. The message is clear: we must emulate the preparedness of the wise bridesmaids.

The oil in the parable can be interpreted as a metaphor for the grace we receive through the sacraments, the tangible signs of the Holy Spirit's presence in our lives. In baptism, we are anointed with oil, symbolizing the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. In confirmation, we are sealed with the oil of chrism. This oil represents not just the sacraments themselves but calls for our active participation in the Church's sacramental life. Through this engagement, the love of Christ is nurtured within us.

When we fall away from these practices, we allow the oil of our faith to run low; we risk missing the joyous communion with Christ. It is not enough to merely perform acts of faith. We must live our faith in our every action with love. This way, we anticipate Christ's return meaningfully.

Therefore, let us be vigilant and persistent in our faith. Let us keep the oil of our lamps replenished through prayer, the sacraments, and acts of love and service. In doing so, we affirm our readiness for the end times and for each day we are granted in this life. Let us live with the conviction that Christ's return, while not predictable by our worldly understanding, is an assured promise that calls us to a life of preparedness, marked by a profound love for God and one another.



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD BEING ON THE ALERT

Some thirty years of Christian life and experience separate the first letter of Paul to the Thessalonians and the writing of Matthew's Gospel. When Paul wrote in the late Forties and early Fifties there was a keen sense and expectation that the Lord was going to return at any moment. These earliest Christians were so convinced that this was the case that they were unprepared and ill-equipped to deal with the death of other Christians before the Lord's return. It is not as though Paul himself had foreseen this difficulty and, as is often the case in his letters, we see how a concrete problem prompts him to further reflection. It is important not to press Paul's description of the return of the Lord too far. This is theology in the making and Paul himself will continue to develop his thought on these matters (see 1 Corinthians 15).

If Paul's Christians faced the problem caused by assuming the Lord would return soon, Matthew's community had to confront another set of circumstances. The fact that by the early to mid-Eighties the Lord had not returned placed another dilemma before them. For Matthew, the problem was that of a community becoming apathetic and seeing its initial enthusiasm and commitment wane. The parable of Jesus about the bridesmaids who fell asleep and missed their opportunity was the perfect means to stress the need for Christians to be prepared as they waited for the Lord's return.

VINNIES SEPTEMBER REPORT

9 requests for help were addressed during October, 2 from persons new to us. We received 3 requests for food assistance; significant bills, mainly power, had been paid leaving insufficient funds for them to live on. Some outstanding pharmaceutical bills were paid for a Disability Support Pensioner with depression problems. One new case involved an Old Age Pensioner who had received some internal injuries from a hit and run incident and the non Medicare investigation to determine the extent of these was out of reach. The other new case was a single mother separated from ex and children who could no longer maintain her current accomodation on her income, and was seeking help till she moved. We also assisted a disabled pensioner with transport to essential medical care. Expenditure of some \$1400 was incurred.
