Priest: For those waiting for answered prayer: All: Grant your steadfast patience.

Priest: For those waiting in the face of uncertainty: All: Grant unshakable confidence in your sovereign provision.

Priest: For those waiting for justice and mercy to reign: All: Grant a glimpse of your glory in our wounded world.

Priest: For all of us waiting for God's kingdom to come: All: Grant that we might have the peace of Christ as we wait, the love of Christ as we act, and the grace of Christ as we speak.

#### **Candle Lighting**

Priest: This morning we light the first candle which reminds us that throughout history, God's people have spent time waiting, wandering and wondering about the timing of God's eternal plan. Like the people of old, we long for God's presence to illuminate the areas of life where we are called to wait. This morning we echo the words of the Psalmist, "Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord!" (*Psalm 27:14*)

This Sunday we begin a new year in our Church's year with the First Week of Advent. Advent is that special time each year we are given to prepare for the wonder of Christmas. We reflect on the mystery of waiting as we long to receive the life of Christ more fully in our hearts and in our world. To help us prepare. we have the ancient practice of the Advent Wreath on which we light a candle each week. Each candle represents one of the gifts of Christmas: hope, faith, joy, and peace. We now have a very elegant Advent Wreath. This has been made possible through a small bequest of the late Fr Barry Nobbs, for whom we now have the stand in memory. I am sure we will agree it is a very beautiful addition to our church.

We prepare for Christmas in a diversity of ways. One of those most important, of course, is to be aware of those not as fortunate as ourselves. And so, this weekend envelopes are available to contribute to the St Vincent de Paul Christmas appeal. These can be left on any of the collection baskets during Mass.

The next few weeks will be quite busy with end of year and Christmas events! We are invited to a very special event at 10.00am on Monday 4 December at St Pius X College. Pius X College and Mercy Catholic College are collaborating to host 'The Road to Bethlehem – A Liturgical Pilgrimage.' Joined by students from St Leo's Catholic College Wahroonga and members of the parish, we will bring to life the Nativity with large sets, costumes, and live animals. Yes, camels are even on their way! Our students and staff dressed in biblical costumes will move in and through the congregation seated in the playground, as they unfold one of the greatest stories from our 'God of surprises'. It is the 800th Anniversary since St Francis of Assisi first held a live Nativity. Praying for fine weather, do feel welcome to join us on Monday! This will be the final week of school for the students at Pius College, so we wish them all the very best as they bring their school year to its conclusion.

Friday 8 December is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary through which we celebrate the freedom that Mary is given to become fully who she is created to be. However, at 8.00pm we will have an online Rosary available, the details of which are in the bulletin, with the link on our parish website on the 'online gatherings' page.

Earlier next Friday evening, our parish primary school is enjoying a great Christmas Fiesta! All of us are welcome to join in the school playgrounds! There will be music, dining, and lots of entertainment! And of course, a very special guest! So do come along and enjoy the festival. This week we return to our ordinary 6pm Wednesday evening Mass. May this be a special opportunity for us to enter prayerfully this new joyful season of spiritual preparation we have begun.

# GOSPEL REFLECTION



Be on your guard, stay awake.

These words certainly do sound familiar, don't they? Over and over again, we are warned to lock our doors, set our alarms, and not talk to strangers. But that's not what Jesus was talking about.

The watching that Jesus urges us to do-the watching that is at the heart of the season of Advent-isn't meant to make us fearful or tense.

On the contrary, it's supposed to fill us with expectation and even joy—just as we pray at Mass after the Lord's Prayer, asking our Father to keep us "safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ."

So just what are we watching and waiting for? The fulfilment of God's promises—the time when every tear will be wiped away and all pain and suffering will end.

For the time when we will be gathered around God's throne, completely immersed in his love and filled to overflowing with his divine life.

We're not waiting just for Christmas; we're waiting for the fulfilment of everything that Christmas began—Jesus' glorious return!

Rather than passively waiting, try to spend this Advent actively anticipating the Lord. Invite him to meet you in prayer and at Mass. Look for him in the face of a stranger—or a difficult family member. Let the sights, sounds, and smells of the season lift your imagination and give you a glimpse of the celebration that awaits you.

Don't sleep through heaven! It's all around us, if we but open our eyes. Don't sleep through the miracle of God becoming man, either. Believe that Jesus is with us right now, that he wants to shower us with his love and grace.

Open your eyes, and you will begin to see signs that the kingdom is coming, signs that will fill your heart with hope and expectation.

Jesus really is on his way. Even if he doesn't come back in glory this Advent, he still wants to come into our lives. And may he find us attentive when he does come!

In the parable of the man on the journey, the doorkeeper holds a very important position. Since none of the household staff knows when their master will return, the doorkeeper must always be looking out for signs of his arrival. Well, each of us has a similar job—to keep watch for Jesus. All he needs is for us to be alert, and he will have plenty of room to work. Let's not forget to look heavenward this Advent.

St. John tells us that Jesus, the Word, has become flesh and dwelt among us, and that we have seen his glory. As we devote time simply to gazing on Jesus in prayer and meditation, we will become more alert. We will begin to see this world differently and notice signs of Jesus' power and presence.

He may fill us with his love during Mass or at Eucharistic adoration.

He may give us his peace in the midst of a trying or painful situation.

He may convince us to go to the sacrament of Reconciliation after a long absence, or to reconcile with a neighbour or relative.

And who knows? He just might decide to rend the heavens and return in glory after all!

This really can be a season of transformation for us. If we are watchful and alert, we really will come to know Jesus more this Advent—and we really will begin to shine with his glory.

#### **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

#### WATCHING AND WAITING

The liturgical year begins, Advent dawns, and the readings call us into reflection and renewal of our relationship with God. The prophet Isaiah's plea resounds across the ages, lamenting the current state of affairs. Having already asked God to see how bad things are, he beseeches God "Oh that you would tear the heavens open and come down." Then and now, God's help is needed to turn our lives around.

The psalm invites us to raise our voices in response "Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved." Paul writing to the Corinthians offers a thanksgiving to God for the revelation of Jesus Christ and prays with all gratefulness

so that they, and we, "will not be without any of the gifts of the Holy Spirit while waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ."

In today's Gospel four imperatives emphatically call upon our hearts: "see" and "be alert" come in rapid succession, then "stay awake" is repeated. This warning to stay awake is echoed twice to the disciples in Gethsemane. The beginning of Mark's Gospel announces, "The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ" (v1) and "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news" (v15). The ultimate moment of revelation of Jesus comes with the resurrection and the empty tomb. This is our time to turn our hearts to God, to hear the good news, to wait with gratitude and renew our souls before celebrating anew the birth of Jesus, God among us.

# CELEBRATING PEOPLE WHO LIVE WITH A DISABILITY

This Sunday 3rd December is the International Day of People with Disability and at Our Lady of Dolours we are celebrating it with a Christmas party in the Magnificat room on Saturday for young people who live with autism, intellectual disabilities or other challenges. The Community Action team is hosting the party and will be supported by students from Pius and Mercy Colleges and anyone from the parish is very welcome. The party starts at 2.00 p.m. and Santa Claus is dropping in at 3.15 p.m. The International Day of Persons with a Disability aims to create an inclusive and diverse society. In Australia, 4.4 million people live with a disability and a third of those have a severe



or profound disability. Among older Australians, nearly half live with a disability. One in ten people with a disability experiences discrimination which includes difficulty finding employment in jobs for which they have the necessary skills. One of the saddest kinds of discrimination is when children or adults stare or point or make comments which the person can hear and this is distressingly common. More frequently we look away. Let us resolve this Sunday to make eye contact with anyone we meet who has a disability and find a way to connect, despite the barriers.
