
Closing Prayer

Bishop Anthony has considered, however, that the needs of the Parish of Manly are greater and that Fr Marek's contribution there will be of great benefit to the people there. Fr Marek has been with us for just two years. He has been a tireless minister especially with our youth ministry, Men Alive, our aged care facilities, Alpha and other programs, our baptismal preparation ministry, our parish pilgrimages, not to mention the liturgical enhancements he has facilitated and all the amazing handyman tasks he has done. We are going to miss him greatly. Thankfully we will have good time to plan our farewell of our wonderful brother and friend. Please join with me thanking Fr Marek for all his time with us, and praying every blessing for him as he assumes this new challenge in his priestly ministry.

In Fr Marek's place, **Bishop Anthony has appointed Fr Anselam Lakra**, a priest of our diocese, currently Assistant Priest at the Cathedral Parish of Hornsby. Fr Anselam will

join us in early February, and we look forward to welcoming him to our parish family.

Our music ministry continues to grow and strengthen. I am pleased to share with you that we have now been able to appoint two Senior Scholars: Ruby Bron, our Senior Choral Scholar, commencing with us this weekend, and Tim Li, our Senior Organ Scholar, starting with us at the end of January 2024. Their scholarship enables them with the experience of church music, the tutelage of our Parish Director of Music, Titus Grenyer and further professional development.

We are now in our final week of preparation for Christmas! Each day this week, our Filipino Simbang Gabi festival unfolds with a Mass each morning at 5.30am. Everyone is welcome to attend this Missa de Gallo (the Mass of the crow). What a powerful and special way to prepare for the celebration of Christmas. These daily Masses began on Saturday 16 December and continue right through to Sunday 24 December.

Also, next **Thursday 21 December at 7pm we will have a special Second Form of the Rite of Reconciliation** to prepare for Christmas, joined with our ordinary Holy Hour. Together as a community, we will pray God's mercy and forgiveness and there will be opportunity, too, for individual Confession.



GOSPEL REFLECTION



In the world of business, a mission statement describes the purpose of an organisation. This statement is meant to reflect the essence of the organisation and its goals.

The prophet Isaiah probably had no idea he was presenting a mission statement for the Messiah.

But listen to it again. Listen to it as a Mission Statement: "He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison; to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord."

This is the very statement that Jesus used to start his ministry.

And there is really no more a concise picture of what Jesus came to do for us.

How many times did Jesus bring glad tidings to the lowly?

Think of the comfort he gave to the woman at the well.

How many times did he heal the broken-hearted?

Think of the widow of Nain, whose son Jesus brought back to life. What of the multitudes

he liberated from sin and sickness – and not just in first-century Israel?

We have all been touched by Jesus and the good news he proclaimed. But there is more here. Jesus' mission statement is ours as well. We are called to bring the "glad tidings" of God's love to the world. We are called to care for the broken hearted and to tell people that the favour of the Lord is for everyone.

Remember: Jesus didn't come just to lift us up. He also came to show us how to live. We need an outlook like John the Baptist's. Rather than focusing on himself, he answered his questioners in a way that pointed to Jesus. He was "the voice of one crying out in the desert," whose job was to "make straight the way of the Lord".

It is not our job to save people but to help them make contact with their Saviour. They can only make a decision to follow Jesus after they have met him.

We all face the temptation to play God and to try to solve other people's problems. But we can't meet everyone's needs completely—only God can do that.

We can certainly share our time, talent, and wisdom, but ultimately, we must let every person face his or her own challenges with the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

We are halfway through Advent, so maybe it's a good time to evaluate our progress – just as businesses evaluate their own strengths and weaknesses from time to time.

Do you believe that you are called to bind up the broken-hearted, to comfort those that mourn and to bring good news to the afflicted?

Try to remember that you are called to be Christ's presence in the world today. Through your words and actions many people who are hurting may be restored.

Do you point others to Jesus Christ by the example and witness you give to others?

How are you going at fulfilling your mission?

Have you been working to bring glad tidings to people?

If so, then thank the Lord, and tell him that you want to go even further.

Imagine the grace and peace that can flow from every act of kindness, every gentle word of encouragement, and every work of service you do. And then it won't take long before "justice and praise" spring up wherever you go.



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

SHEER JOY

What brings joy to you? What makes your heart sing? Joy is infectious. Joy rings out today from the beginning of our prayer with the Entrance Antiphon "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." (Phil 4:4-5). Isaiah proclaims, "I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God" (Isa 61:10). The psalm, drawn from the Magnificat in Luke, invites us to respond: "My soul rejoices in my God" (Luke 1:46), and we hear "My soul glorifies the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God, my saviour" (vv. 46-47). Paul's final exhortation from his First Letter to the Thessalonians begins "Rejoice always" (1 Thess 5:16). What is the cause of all this rejoicing? It is the story of the Good News unfolding from the prophet Isaiah, becoming flesh through Mary's faithful response; it is God's gift of God's son, Jesus, born among us who has been raised. We draw near to the celebration of Jesus' birth but we live in the light of resurrection, so we have reason to rejoice. Today's Gospel reveals the witness to the

coming of Jesus, "a man sent from God" (John 1:6). We hear emphatic repetition of the truth with both "witness" and "light" repeated three times. John is the voice in the wilderness confirming "the one who is coming after" (1:27).


