This film explores the life lived by Carlo Acutis and the lessons he offers young people regarding the challenges of the digital world. The documentary blends live action, animation and documentary-style interviews with Acutis' family, friends, tech experts and scholars to tackle urgent questions about artificial intelligence and the technological world we live in. One of the themes of the film is that Acutis was online to lead people offline to the Eucharist, back to real encounters and he's a great role model for us.



PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI: TO THE TOP

Filmed in Italy, this docudrama chronicles the life and spirituality of Pier Giorgio Frassati, an Italian activist who put his Catholic beliefs into practice to help the poor and downtrodden in his hometown of Turin. The film uses the aspect of his mountain climbing to shed light on his holiness and humanity. A Saint with appeal for the young, Pier Giorgio loved to go with friends in the mountains, to play jokes among them, to laugh and to have a good time together. But at the centre of everything was faith, was prayer, was love for God.

What is Vespers?

On the last Saturday of each month, the Parish Schola (comprising members of the Parish Choir) sings the office of Vespers, also known as Evening Prayer, at 4:45pm.

Vespers is a very ancient Office, with origins dating back to the first century, though it was more formally defined around the sixth century through the Rule of St Benedict. The Schola sings in alternatim – left side (cantoris) and right side (decani) alternating – as is the norm in monastic settings.

The service, in essence, is simple. It begins with an invitation to prayer, followed by a hymn. Then, the choir leads the singing of psalms. Then, the priest reads from the Bible, and there is a short responsory. The choir then sings the Magnificat – the canticle of the Blessed Virgin Mary – typically as a composed work in four-part harmony. The service concludes with prayers, a blessing, and the singing of the Marian Antiphon (during our current time of year, the Salve Regina).

All are welcome to attend Vespers, and also join in the singing, especially of the hymn and chanted psalms. The texts are displayed on Powerpoint slides, but can also be downloaded on your phone using the Universalis app and navigating to Vespers on the day.

The July Our Lady of Dolours St Vincent de Paul Conference Report



In July, OLD Vinnies responded to 14 calls for help, 3 were received late and were carried into August, 3 were from families with long term difficulties outside our scope but towards which we are providing support. We provided food and furniture to a New Australian single parent family to make their rented digs more livable. We made more workable the enforced temporary living arrangements of a family whose bathroom was subject of necessary upgrade. We helped another newcomer with moving into recently allocated public housing. Another newbie family with DV associated medical conditions was assisted with bills and clothing. Other assistance provided was more routine including appliance repairs, clothing and significant pharmaceutical support. (People on pensions generally can manage day to day but emergencies such as appliance breakdowns upset budgets.) Some \$2000 of resources were needed.

Our grateful thanks to all contributors to our recent Winter Appeal which raised over \$9000.

Welcoming the Alvera Family

On Wednesday 13th August, the Alvera family, sponsored by a group including 3 of our parishioners and supported by our parish, arrived at Sydney's international airport at 5.10 a.m. It was an early start for us sponsors, with Trish Wilson and Jo Karaolis going to the airport along with Eva Martinez who was our driver and Spanish interpreter. We had a long and anxious wait before finally the small excited group came through the Arrival Gate and jumped up and down when they saw us with our Welcome sign made by students at Mercy College. We gathered them up and took them to their new home in Chatswood where the rest of the sponsors were waiting with a delicious hot breakfast and a birthday cake for Karla and Jose to share, since both had had birthdays the week before and had not been able to celebrate or receive presents.

Since then we have had a busy time taking them shopping, visiting the doctor and getting them connected to Centrelink and Medicare. They have been very cheerful and very adaptable but it has been a hard week for them because of jet lag, infection picked up during the flight and the cold weather. They left Trinidad where the temperature ranges from mild to hot and they have never needed warm clothes. They have found Sydney extremely cold. Last Sunday their mother, Damelys, was very keen to come to Our Lady of Dolours to say thank you to everyone for making it possible for her children to come to Australia where they can get medical care and education. Damelys is an active and committed Christian within the evangelical tradition. One of the big challenges for the Spanish-speaking family is to learn English but Damelys has learned to say "God bless you" and "Jesus loves you", as she assured Fr David after the Mass.


Thank you to all who have helped the Alvera family in so many ways. We could not have managed without Eva Martinez who has been incredibly supportive and whose Spanish language skills have been invaluable. The support of Andrew Harding, who has not only refurbished and made the house available but provided ongoing maintenance support, has been foundational. Then there are all of you who provided recycled clothing which has been a life-saver for us at times and those who donated toys, particularly the Hub of Hope who created a Jengo set with Bible references for the children.

While we do not need any more donations at present, what we do ask for is your continuing prayers for the family as they navigate the challenges ahead of them. Their courage is amazing and their faith is strong but there is so much for them still to deal with, including school, English classes, complex medical help and learning their way around Chatswood shops, all without very much English.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

AT THE FEAST IN THE KINGDOM

In this Sunday's Gospel we are still in that section of Luke that concerns the journey of Jesus and his disciples on their way to Jerusalem. This section of the Gospel, Luke 9-19, is long. It is also important as the evangelist seeks to contemporise the teaching of Jesus, for a later time and culture. The evangelist also provides us in this 'journey narrative' with a window into what some of the issues were with which Jesus' followers were dealing.

One of them here concerned salvation and ultimate communion with God. Someone enquires about the number of those 'saved'? Will it be a few? The question allows Jesus in Luke's Gospel to address a key presumption circulating within the Gospel audience. There were some who presumed that simply being a member of the Gospel household, participating in a meal (the Eucharist?) or listening to the teaching of the Master guaranteed admittance into the Kingdom.

Jesus reminds Luke's audience to be careful about such presumptive and elitist behaviour. This attitude, of being better than others because of one's spiritual heritage or conduct, does not guarantee automatic admission into the Kingdom. It needs to be checked. Rather than a restrictive or exclusive view of Kingdom admission - only those with the right 'credentials' will be admitted - ultimate communion with God is open ended and available to all, as people 'from east and west, from north and south will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God. A spirit of openness, hospitality and inclusivity characterise Jesus' disciples.

In the footsteps of Mary MacKillop

On the 8 August we celebrated the feast of St Mary MacKillop (1842-1909), a remarkable woman who accomplished great feats in the establishment of Catholic education in Australia and beyond.

Catholic education owes an enormous debt to the Sisters of St Joseph established by Mary MacKillop, the Christian Brothers and the Marist Brothers who for many years staffed Catholic schools throughout Australia. Today we no longer have the services of those religious orders and the vast majority of Catholic students are educated in the State Education system. As a result their education in the faith now relies greatly on lay Catholics. These lay catechists are not required to make the same sacrifices which the nuns and religious Brothers of yesteryears had to make. Yet we struggle to find sufficient volunteers to fulfill this most important role in the formation of our children.

St Mary MacKillop is noted for her statement "never see a need without doing something about it". Today the need is evident but there are too few ready to respond to this need by taking on the role of catechist. If you are willing to help remedy this situation, please contact Karen Forbes, our parish catechists co-ordinator (phone 9410 9000) to discuss how you could join the ranks of our catechists servicing the five Primary Schools and the High School within our parish boundaries.

As Catholics our attitudes and actions are governed by an understanding of the dignity that God has bestowed on each and every human person regardless of his/her personal qualities and capacities. This obliges us to come to the defence of all those whose life and dignity are under threat.

You are invited to join the campaign to protect and defend the most basic of human rights, the right to life, by joining the parish Pro-Life Movement and engaging in one or more of the actions listed below:

Prayer:

Praying for the unborn. You are invited to pray the following prayer daily:

Heavenly Father, in Your love for us, protect against the wickedness of the devil, those helpless little ones to whom You have given the gift of life. Touch with pity the hearts of those women pregnant in our world today who are not thinking of motherhood. Help them to see that the child they carry is made in Your image - as well as theirs - made for eternal life. Dispel their fear and selfishness and give them true womanly hearts to love their babies and give them birth and all the needed care that a mother can give. We ask this through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. Amen (EWTN)

The Rosary. Apart from the specific prayer mentioned above, the rosary has long been recognized by Catholics as a most powerful means of obtaining the intercession of our Blessed Lady for the needs of all people in whatever situation. It is a prayer that is highly commended when praying for the conversion of souls, the sick and those confronted with difficulties in life. It is also a powerful prayer for the unborn, their parents and the conversion of those involved in promoting abortion and euthanasia. We have a pro-life rosary via Zoom every Thursday at 8 pm, https://us06web.zoom.us/j/8034195601, or meeting ID 8034195601, no passcode required. This enables individuals to join with others in praying for the unborn without having to leave their own home. Of course your own personal rosary is highly encouraged.

Exercise your political rights and responsibilities. The attack on human life in our society is sanctioned by legislation that allows for the abortion of an unborn baby at any stage in a woman's pregnancy and even provides for the baby that survives an attempted abortion to be left to die and disposed of as medical waste. In a democratic society this situation can only persist if a sufficient number of voters support parties that endorse this legislation or who remain indifferent. A basic but fundamental action that we can all take is to write to the Premier (Hon Chris Minns), Leader of the Opposition (Mark Speakman) and our local Member of Parliament, expressing strong opposition to laws that allow for abortion and voluntary assisted dying and demanding that such laws be overturned. Write to these parliamentarians via their electoral office or care of Parliament House, Macquarie Street, Sydney 2000.

Support those organisations that assist pregnant women in difficulties. Many women feel compelled to resort to abortion under pressure from the father of the unborn child or from other family members or "friends" or as a result of the financial or other difficulties involved in raising a child.
