#### Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

Luke 15:1-10

Note that both parables in this Sunday's Gospel have the same structure: something is lost, a search follows, what is lost is found, friends and neighbors are called together, and, finally, an invitation to rejoice is extended. The opening verse, "Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him [Jesus]" (15:1), is Luke's way of saying that these individuals are willing to listen to the prophet Jesus. In the Scriptures, willingness to hear the words of the prophet is comparable to being open to conversion. The contrast is between the tax collectors and the sinners, who are willing to listen to Jesus, and the Pharisees and scribes, whose grumbling and complaining clearly shows they are not open to conversion.

Jesus responds to the grumbling by telling a few parables. The first parable is about a lost sheep. In Luke's version of this parable, the shepherd is responsible for losing his sheep. When the shepherd notices that the sheep is missing, he does the unthinkable. He leaves the ninety-nine healthy sheep alone in the wilderness and goes in search of the single lost sheep, which has perhaps already been killed by wild animals or injured after falling down a ravine. The shepherd, with relentless determination, pursues the lost sheep until he finds it. Then the shepherd "lays it on his shoulders and rejoices" (15:5) in a moment of embrace, tenderness, and heartfelt joy. This image of the shepherd carrying the lost sheep on his shoulders is depicted in many pieces of art. This wonderful, pastoral image reminds us of God's unwavering pursuit of those who may have lost their way and the guarantee of God's tender embrace when they are reunited with God. The shepherd does not confine his rejoicing to his own heart but instead invites his friends and neighbors together to rejoice with him and join in his happiness. Jesus tells us that although this reunion of the shepherd and sheep is wonderful, "there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance" (15:7). Jesus invites us to stop running away from God and recognize our need for forgiveness—for God's loving embrace is already present.

The second parable is about a woman who loses one of her ten silver coins. This story is unique to Luke's Gospel. Some Scripture scholars speculate that the coins were the woman's dowry, making them of extreme sentimental value. The woman's response is to light a lamp and immediately start looking for the lost coin. She sweeps and cleans the house until she finds the lost coin. When she finds the coin, the woman gathers her friends and neighbors and says, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost" (15:9). Jesus again compares the rejoicing of the woman and her friends and neighbors to the joy God and the angels experience when one sinner repents. Repentance and conversion of heart bring rejoicing not only for those directly affected by this awakening but also for God and the angels in heaven, making it a cosmic event. The joy explodes into a party. Through these parables, Luke presents one of the essential aspects of the mission of Jesus—to seek and find the lost.

This coming week all our clergy will be away! It is the week of the diocesan annual clergy retreat. This year Fr Marek, returning home on Sunday 11 September, and Deacon Kevin will be attending the week under the direction of Fr Paul Chandler OCarm at the Hartzer Retreat Centre at Bowral. Fr Joey will be travelling to Melbourne on Sunday to undertake his retreat with his fellow students of the Siloam Program in which he has been involved over the last two years. Fr Joey will return on Friday. I will be travelling as chaplain on a pilgrimage to the Red Centre leaving on Monday 12 September and returning on Monday 19 September. I will be with a group of some 20 pilgrims from all around Australia, visiting Alice Springs, Kings Canyon and Uluru.

During this time we are profoundly grateful to both Bishop Emeritus David Walker and to Deacon Roberto Corpuz for the way in which they will maintain our ordinary schedule during the week. Please note however there will be only one Mass celebrated each day (Monday to Friday) at 12.30pm by Bishop David. Deacon Robert will lead a Liturgy of the Word with Communion at 9am form Tuesday to Friday. This will mean that our ordinary times for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will also continue without interruption. Similarly, Deacon Roberto will assist with our usual Holy Hour on Thursday evening.

The good news is that from 20 September all our clergy will be home again and we will be able to return to our ordinary pattern of priest staffing.

Please keep Fr Marek, Fr Joey, Deacon Kevin and me in your prayer over these days that our time away will be restorative and spiritually nourishing.

#### Review of Parish Office Staffing

Dear friends,

It has now been some 18 months since I joined you here in our wonderful parish of Chatswood. It has been quite an extraordinary time as we have negotiated the challenges of COVID and yet, at the same time, undertaken a range of initiatives—spiritual, pastoral and material—to animate further the life of our faith community. It has been pleasing to look back and see what has occurred—the initiative of Being Church in the City with its various stages of development, new pastoral associations such as Community Action, many wonderful community events on our church forecourt and in Harrington Hall, the correction to the sound system in our church, enhancements such as the installation of glass doors at the front foyer, the interior renovation of the presbytery - to name just a few.

Throughout this period I have also been considering in the background the structure of parish staffing that might best suit the parish going forwards. There have been various factors prompting this. Over the last 18 months I have appreciated more deeply the complexity of the parish's management with its extensive facilities and financial arrangements. I have been acutely aware of the remarkable demand that this has placed on our current Finance and Facilities Officer, Michael Mercer, who is currently contracted just three days a week. Michael has been so generous in often being present on non-work days and has always demonstrated wonderful graciousness. Since the beginning of the year, our parish office has been closed on a Friday. In addition, it has been a personal learning for me through this period combining leadership of such a dynamic parish with my role as Vicar General for Bishop Anthony. In the midst of these, we have identified particular needs to enable our parish to grow pastorally. We also have a volume of projects ahead of us including the extension to the presbytery, the refurbishment of the parish office, the refurbishment of our church and the question of how we might maximize our entire precinct in the heart of Chatswood city.

The outcome of such considerations has been to propose and now, to introduce, a new structure of staffing in our Parish Office. These new roles will bring to an end the current roles of Finance and Facilities Officer and Parish Secretary. The new roles are:

- Business Manager, Monday to Friday 9am—5pm This is to be a permanent full-time role working on a site with multiple precincts and identified plans for growth and will provide guidance and expertise to assist with the next phase of growth. The role will lead business operations including financial management, procurement, site infrastructure, governance and compliance, risk management and office administration.
- Parish Support Officer, Monday to Friday 9am—5pm. This is to be a permanent full-time role which will be the
  first point of contact for Parish visitors, as well as providing general administrative and communications support.
- Administrative Assistant. This role is to provide administrative and clerical support for communications, administration, parish property and compliance obligations. The role is permanent part-time, working one day per week. The role does allow for flexibility with the working schedule for the right candidate
- ♦ A new pastoral role, **Director of Music** to coordinate, develop and enhance the music ministry at Our Lady of Dolours, Chatswood. The role is permanent part-time, working initially three days per week.
- We are to use this time also to recruit for a part time **Housekeeper** for our presbytery, one day a week.

I have been working with our staff over the past few weeks as we introduce this new configuration of roles. I have also been working with our musicians over the past month or so, developing the role of Director of Music.

The new roles are now open for recruitment, both internally and externally. Further information and Application Packs can be obtained by emailing <a href="mailto:recruitment@bbcatholic.org.au">recruitment@bbcatholic.org.au</a>. Applications are open until the end of September and therefore we would hope to appoint through the course of October.

Please keep this new structure, with the change it entails, very much in your prayer. I shall update you along the way.




