Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

Luke 16:1–13

During the time of Jesus, a few who owned land possessed the majority of wealth. They would rent their land to peasants through one of three arrangements: a predetermined percentage of the yield, a fixed amount of the produce (fifty bushels of wheat or twenty gallons of olive oil), or money would be given as payment. In most cases, one of the first two arrangements were made. In this story, it is the second arrangement. To oversee this payment process, most landowners had stewards or managers. Luke tells us that the manager in this parable fails at managing his master's estate. The manager appears to have no malice toward his master. He is just unskilled and fails to fulfill his tasks. The master informs the manager that he is dismissed from his post, asking him to produce the books to give account of his management. The master has other options for recourse at his disposal: he could have the manager arrested and thrown into jail, make the manager repay the money lost by his mismanagement, or both. Instead, the master dismisses him. What the manager does next catches everyone's attention. Before the news spreads that he is being dismissed from his position, the manager quickly asks the debtors to present their bills of what they owe the master and then reduces the bill by a certain amount. This act creates good will toward the manager, as well as his master, in the community.

The motivation behind the manager's behavior is not clear in the parable. Some scholars interpret the passage this way: the manager, after experiencing the mercy of the master (being dismissed rather than thrown into jail), extends the same mercy to the debtors by removing his own commission from the bill. The manager had assessed the situation and knows that he is not able to do hard manual labor and is too proud to beg. He also knows the master is not going to give him a wonderful letter of recommendation for a job as a manager with another land owner. So he trusts that those whose debt he reduced now will return good will to him in the future when he needs it.

The master, upon seeing what the manager has done, commends him for his shrewdness. The manager responds appropriately in light of his circumstances. It is the quality of the response rather than the morality of the action that is the object of Jesus's praise. The manager is commended for using wealth for the benefit of others. In doing so, he benefits himself. The manager seems to recognize the value in giving and the benefits in return for the giver. The Gospel ends by emphasizing that an individual cannot serve two masters—God and wealth—because they are opposites.

Review of Parish Office Staffing

Dear friends,

It has now been some 18 months since I joined you here in our wonderful parish of Chatswood. It has been quite an extraordinary time as we have negotiated the challenges of COVID and yet, at the same time, undertaken a range of initiatives—spiritual, pastoral and material—to animate further the life of our faith community. It has been pleasing to look back and see what has occurred—the initiative of Being Church in the City with its various stages of development, new pastoral associations such as Community Action, many wonderful community events on our church forecourt and in Harrington Hall, the correction to the sound system in our church, enhancements such as the installation of glass doors at the front foyer, the interior renovation of the presbytery - to name just a few.

Throughout this period I have also been considering in the background the structure of parish staffing that might best suit the parish going forwards. There have been various factors prompting this. Over the last 18 months I have appreciated more deeply the complexity of the parish's management with its extensive facilities and financial arrangements. I have been acutely aware of the remarkable demand that this has placed on our current Finance and Facilities Officer, Michael Mercer, who is currently contracted just three days a week. Michael has been so generous in often being present on non-work days and has always demonstrated wonderful graciousness. Since the beginning of the year, our parish office has been closed on a Friday. In addition, it has been a personal learning for me through this period combining leadership of such a dynamic parish with my role as Vicar General for Bishop Anthony. In the midst of these, we have identified particular needs to enable our parish to grow pastorally. We also have a volume of projects ahead of us including the extension to the presbytery, the refurbishment of the parish office, the refurbishment of our church and the question of how we might maximize our entire precinct in the heart of Chatswood city.

The outcome of such considerations has been to propose and now, to introduce, a new structure of staffing in our Parish Office. These new roles will bring to an end the current roles of Finance and Facilities Officer and Parish Secretary. The new roles are:

- Business Manager, Monday to Friday 9am—5pm This is to be a permanent full-time role working on a site with multiple precincts and identified plans for growth and will provide guidance and expertise to assist with the next phase of growth. The role will lead business operations including financial management, procurement, site infrastructure, governance and compliance, risk management and office administration.
- Parish Support Officer, Monday to Friday 9am—5pm. This is to be a permanent full-time role which will be the first point of contact for Parish visitors, as well as providing general administrative and communications support.
- ♦ Administrative Assistant. This role is to provide administrative and clerical support for communications, administration, parish property and compliance obligations. The role is permanent part-time, working one day per week. The role does allow for flexibility with the working schedule for the right candidate
- ♦ A new pastoral role, **Director of Music** to coordinate, develop and enhance the music ministry at Our Lady of Dolours, Chatswood. The role is permanent part-time, working initially three days per week.
- We are to use this time also to recruit for a part time **Housekeeper** for our presbytery, one day a week.

I have been working with our staff over the past few weeks as we introduce this new configuration of roles. I have also been working with our musicians over the past month or so, developing the role of Director of Music.

The new roles are now open for recruitment, both internally and externally. Further information and Application Packs can be obtained by emailing recruitment@bbcatholic.org.au. Applications are open until the end of September and therefore we would hope to appoint through the course of October.

Please keep this new structure, with the change it entails, very much in your prayer. I shall update you along the way.




