A special welcome to Fr Tai Pham from the Parish of Bankstown in the Archdiocese of Sydney who will celebrate our 10.30am Mass, this Sunday 27 July. Fr Tai was ordained on 31 May of this year, and it was my privilege to preach at his Mass of Thanksgiving. It will be lovely to introduce Fr Tai to our own parish of Chatswood.

### Introduction to Pastoral Care Course

Volunteer Catholic Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion visit hospitals throughout the Diocese of Broken Bay providing comfort and care to Catholic patients. Our Diocese and NSW Health require that 40 hours of training is completed to perform this important role. The *Introduction to Pastoral Care Course* (IPCC) meets this requirement, is **FREE** and is open to those who already volunteer in a hospital context, or in local health and aged care facilities, and to those who might be deciding if they are suited to this ministry. As well as being prepared by your Parish to be an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, some of the key qualities we are looking for in anyone who may be considering being part of this hospital ministry are:

- A genuine prayerful faith life including reverence for and regular participation in Sunday Eucharist
- An ability to listen and a willingness to refer on when necessary
- A warm, friendly, empathetic disposition
- The ability to relate to people of different ages, personalities and backgrounds
- A respect for others and their diversity
- The ability to work as part of a team
- Enthusiasm, motivation and professionalism
- A compassionate heart

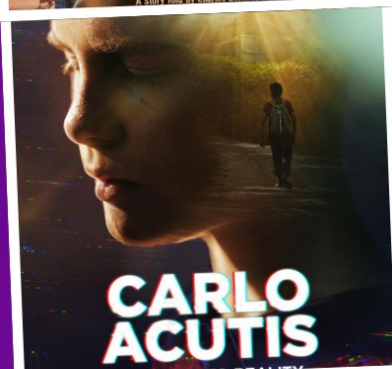

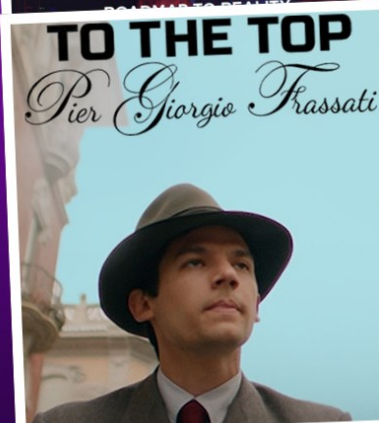

### BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

#### DO NOT PUT US TO THE TEST

With the ending from last Sunday's Gospel still reverberating in our ears ('Mary has chosen the good part which should not be taken away from her'), Luke moves next to see how Mary's focus on Jesus and his word finds its expression. In today's Gospel which follows immediately on from last week's, disciples come to Jesus requesting that he teach them to pray. This is an important moment, instructive for Luke's audience and us.

What follows is the Lord's Prayer. We note it is slightly shorter (and perhaps more original) than the 'Our Father' we pray each Sunday. This comes from Matthew and the Sermon on the Mount. Luke's version offers the essence of Jesus' prayer: It is an affirmation of God's holiness, a request that God's Kingdom come, for daily bread and forgiveness, especially of others who transgress, and not to be put to the test. This 'testing' about discipleship and fidelity to God is what Luke's listeners (and us) experience. Later, in Gethsemane, Jesus reminds his disciples to pray not to be 'tested' (Luke 22:40, 46).

A parable about persistence follows next. It unpacks further the meaning of Jesus' prayer: God, like parents who respond to requests made of them by their children, will always offer that which is good to those who ask, especially the gift of the Holy Spirit—a divine agent present in Jesus from the beginning of the Gospel story. God's gift to Jesus is now God's gift to us, confirmed through prayer.

### Chatswood OLOD Vinnies June Report

Vinnies received 9 requests for help in June, two were from “clients “ new to us. Of the “old clients”, 2 addressed pharmaceutical needs, one involving a severely handicapped and ill child. Another case concerned a mother struggling with language , DV effects, fines, car accident and power bills; we helped where we could. Another lady had budgeting difficulties (we usually refer such problems to a budget councilor either at Catholic Care or in house). The other 3 “oldies “ did not require material assistance. One new “client” was a First Nations chap and the other a New Australian. The former had had a difficult life, has issues affecting employability but looked to us to assist with probs associated with travelling interstate for his father’s funeral. The other sought blankets , warm clothing and a heater. In all over \$400 was expended with commitments of \$1200 for pharmacy needs.

### ITEMS WANTED FOR OUR REFUGEE FAMILY

We are expecting our refugee family to arrive in 4 weeks time, flying in from Trinidad. The mother tells me that they have very little luggage as they don't own much in the way of clothes or anything else. Thanks to your generosity at the Feast for Freedom, we have money to buy them new things, especially underwear and personal items, but perhaps you have clothes that your children have outgrown that are still in near new condition that you would like to go to the family? Of so, please read on.

This is what we know about the sizes of the family members:

Mother: A thin build, size S or M with size 37 shoes

Older daughter: 18 years. Also thin, size S or M, but with much larger feet: size 42

Son aged 9 but wears size 10 or 12 in shirts & trousers and size 34 shoes

Younger daughter aged 7 dress size 6 or 8, shoes size 33

Also we want to have toys and games ready for the children to ease them into this frightening and (for them) cold new world. Perhaps you have toys or games that your children no longer play with or use? We asked them what they like and the boy said he likes soccer and lego and the little girl said she would love to learn to skate (we think she meant ice skating - probably thinks that's what you do in the cold) and she wants a pink guitar! To be serious, the house has space for the children to have their own playroom and the outside area has a hard surface large enough for a portable soccer net and basketball hoop. We don't suggest books because the family speaks Spanish only at present but picture books and graphic books suitable for their ages would be good.

If you have good quality items that match anything in the list above that your family no longer needs, please bring them to weekend Mass and place them in the collection box in the front of the church. Dee, our parish engagement officer, will collect them for us on Monday mornings for the next 2 weeks. During the week, please take them to Diana in the front office as sadly items go missing if left for long in the church.

I was in a wheelchair and I wore braces on my limbs to keep them in a functional position. I had constant muscle spasms and excruciating pain. I do not need a wheelchair anymore. Since then my life has improved on a daily basis, and my health has improved in ways the medical community has no explanation for, as there is no cure for my condition.

My local hospital discovered a tumor on my liver that needed surgery to remove the tumor. We went to Alan's healing service and I felt a tingling in my abdomen and back of my neck. I didn't think any more about it and went to the hospital for surgery. The day before surgery they were trying to locate my tumor and couldn't find it with ultrasound or x-ray. The doctor then confirmed the tumor was not there and three other doctors also looked for it and could not find it. I've had about eight x-rays since then and still, there is no tumor. Thank God!

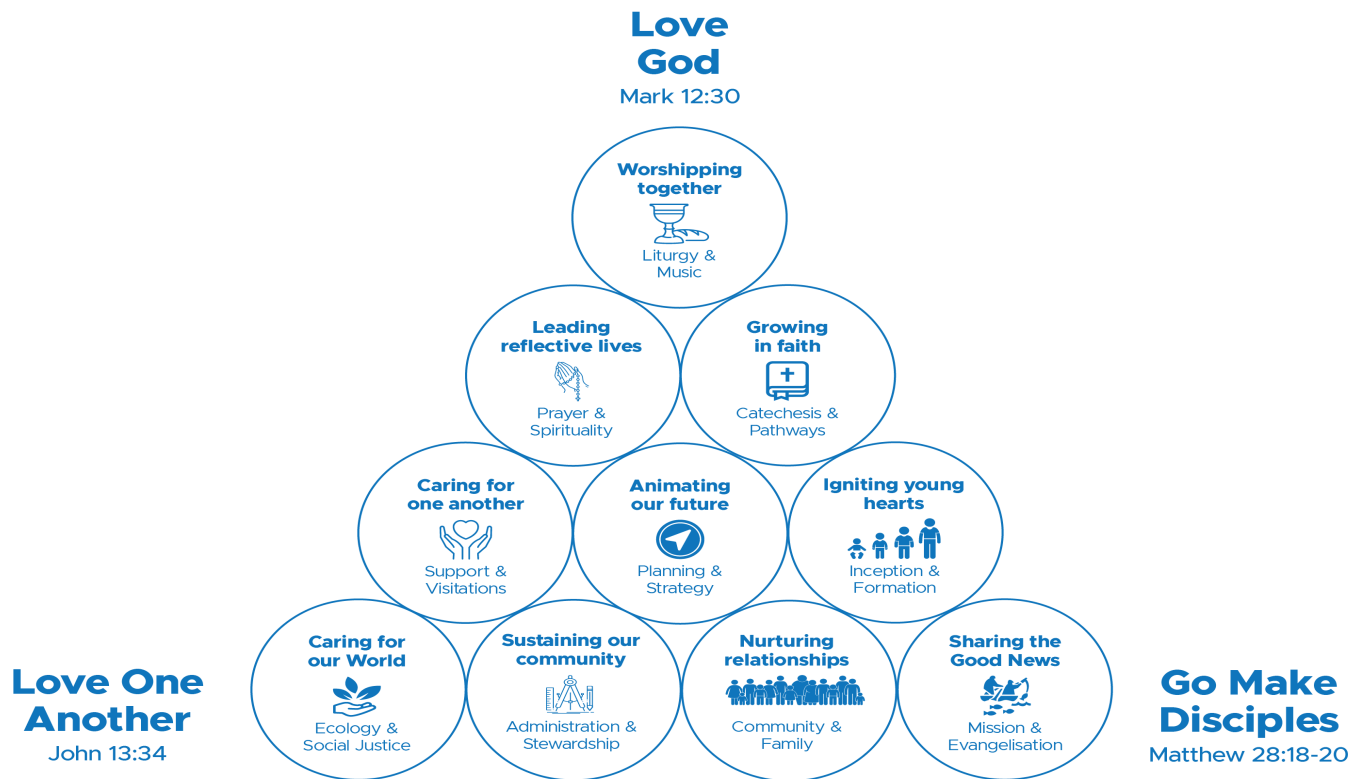

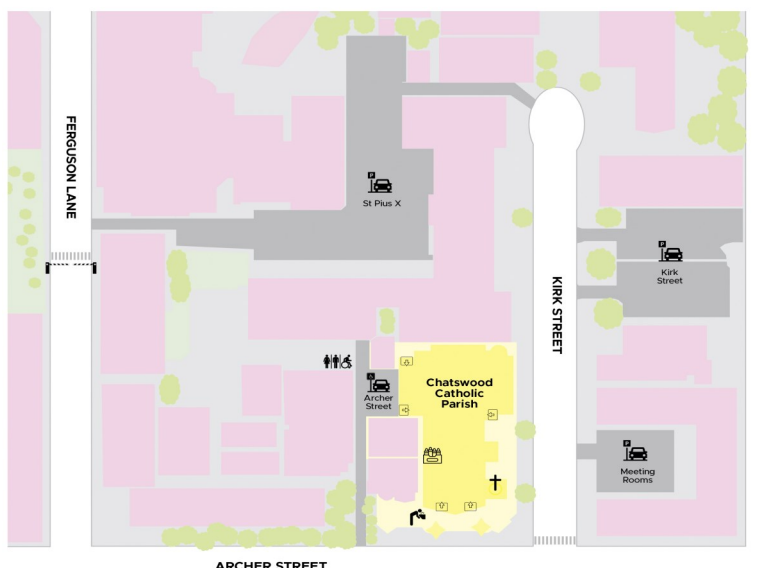
