Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

Luke 17:5-10

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus highlights two aspects of being a disciple. First, he talks about faith. Second, he talks about duty. By definition, a believer is one who has sufficient faith needed to be a follower. The response Jesus gives the disciples when they ask for an increase in faith is, "If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you" (17:6). Jesus is not saying the Apostles do not have faith. As disciples, they believe in Jesus and have faith in him. Jesus is encouraging the disciples to be content with their faith, even if it is only the size of a mustard seed. Even with just a small amount of faith, they are capable of doing great things.

This Scripture passage also suggests that if the disciples are patient, their gift from God will grow, just as a tiny mustard seed over time grows into a large tree. Jesus stresses that quantity of faith is not the issue. Relying on God and remaining faithful is what makes a difference. The ability to believe and trust others is part of being human; therefore, disciples should see faith in God as a natural part of life.

Next, Luke uses the example of the slave or servant to give the disciples insight into their duty to serve others. He asks, "Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded?" (17:9). The expectation is not that the servant be thanked but rather that the servant fulfill his duty. The servant is simply expected to do assigned tasks. A disciple of Jesus—a servant of Jesus—should not think she or he deserves or can earn special favor because of her or his service. Jesus is perhaps challenging the commonly held Jewish perspective that correct observance of the law and traditions deserves God's reward. If good works are expected of the servant as an ordinary part of duty, then faithful service is a basic requirement of those who follow Jesus. God's favor cannot be earned. Nothing a disciple does can lay claim to God's graciousness, nor does a disciple's deeds give her or him the right to demand anything of God. The analogy drawn here is that just as serving or doing one's duty defines the servant, so faith defines the believer.

It was with great sadness that last weekend we learnt of the death of Janet Coombs, just beyond her 90th birthday. She was particularly well known by our Sunday 7.30am attendees. Janet was the daughter of former Reserve Bank governor, economist Dr H.C. ("Nugget") Coombs. A curious 9 year old Janet was infatuated with the legal books in the home, which is when she decided she should "become a judge of the High Court at least". Her brothers also entered the law . Until Janet's retirement, she had the longest-running practice of any woman at the NSW Bar.

An active supporter of women at the Bar, Janet would offer new barristers the use of her chambers for the first six months of their practice. One such woman she shared her chambers with was Mary Gaudron. In 2010, Janet Coombs was made a Dame of the NSW Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. Vale such a wonderful and inspiring woman and may you rest in peace
