

From Fr David

Dear friends,

We have lost a number of valued members of our parish these last weeks. During the week Monica Cotter returned to the house of the Lord. As Gernard Ryan writes of Monica: "When Fr Robert Borg set up the parish liturgy committee Monica was its initial chair. A position she held for about a quarter of a century. She was in charge of training and rostering the readers for even longer. She read herself for even longer and kept going even when needing a walking stick to get to the lectern. Monica had high standards and expected the same of others. Readers had to be well dressed, pronounce words properly, proclaim not read, do so at the correct pace and volume and move in the correct way at the correct time. Monica and her husband Mark (who was an Acolyte in our parish) once ran a country pub so Monica was skilled in the art of blunt and direct communication. Constructive feedback as she called it. Her softer side could be seen in the gratitude she had for any small favour you did her. Monica was also a Minister of Communion and benefited in her final years from our Ministers taking her Communion. She pretty much single handedly set up our parish library with virtually no funds in a disused confessional. The library was recently moved and the shelving upgraded as part of the creation of our adoration chapel. Monica made a significant contribution to our parish over many decades. May she rest in peace." We will farewell Monica on Wednesday morning at 10.30am.

We continue in our journey to refresh our church as it enters its second century. In the pews we will see a survey sheet that seeks everyone's ideas in what they consider important and best for our church. The survey is open for several weeks. Please leave the completed forms in one of the white boxes around the church. Or alternatively feel welcome to complete the survey online using the QR code here.

This week a reminder that the remediation of our church floor will commence this Monday. We have the permission from Bishop Anthony to make the necessary expenditure to install subterranean drains along the western and northern sides of the church, to repair the beams and joists under the floor, and to install an termite prevention guard system around the building. This will come to a cost of \$130k which we can fund from our parish St Peter and



St Paul Fund. During the work the entrance along the back of the church will be closed off and also the northern pathway. We are hopeful that the drainage will be complete by the end of the school holiday to avoid any interruption to the classrooms behind the church. After this, the garden beds along the northern side of the church wall will be removed so as to restore the proper ventilation under the church building. Thank you for your patience whilst all this is undertaken.

A Letter from Pat Smith, Music Director Ku-ring-gai Parish to Titus Grenyer, our Music Director

I didn't get a chance to talk to you after the Mass yesterday. I wanted to express my thanks, on my own behalf and also on behalf of the children and their families. It was a great experience for the kids, to sing in such a large group first of all, and to work hard for such an extended period. Our rehearsals are always on Friday afternoons, not before Mass, so to work straight through from 9am to 11.30am was a big challenge for them. I'm very pleased with the way they tackled everything quite happily, and sang so well. Your choir was extremely welcoming, which was lovely. Only the older half of our choir sing from sheet music, so even handling the booklets and following words and music together was a new experience for some of our little ones. I'm very happy that you treated them just as you would any other choir member, and didn't lower your expectations on their account. It helped them rise to the occasion and take their responsibility seriously. They've also never sung from high over the congregation before. At St Patrick's we sit up the front, next to the piano, in the midst of the assembly. I'm sure that made them feel very elevated and special. Thanks very much for this opportunity. Maybe we could think about making it an annual event? You might even make a return visit, and bring your choir, or your parish children's choir, to join us one Sunday. We sing on 2nd and 4th Sundays of every month except during the summer holidays. It was a delight to watch you playing the organ! I'm so glad I was lucky enough to be not too far behind you during the final hymn. And thanks for sharing the piano with Michael - he's such a fantastic accompanist and made us all feel at home again. Please convey our sincere thanks to Fr David, and to all the very kind, welcoming members of your choir. Fr David also mentioned Choir Games, which is something I'll send you another, much longer email, about!





What is Vespers?

On the last Saturday of each month, the Parish Schola (comprising members of the Parish Choir) sings the office of Vespers, also known as Evening Prayer, at 4:45pm.

Vespers is a very ancient Office, with origins dating back to the first century, though it was more formally defined around the sixth century through the Rule of St Benedict. The Schola sings in alternatim – left side (cantoris) and right side (decani) alternating – as is the norm in monastic settings. The service, in essence, is simple. It begins with an invitation to prayer, followed by a hymn. Then, the choir leads the singing of psalms. Then, the priest reads from the Bible, and there is a short responsory. The choir then sings the Magnificat – the canticle of the Blessed Virgin Mary – typically as a composed work in four-part harmony. The service concludes with prayers, a blessing, and the singing of the Marian Antiphon (during our current time of year, the Salve Regina).

All are welcome to attend Vespers, and also join in the singing, especially of the hymn and chanted psalms. The texts are displayed on Powerpoint slides, but can also be downloaded on your phone using the Universalis app and navigating to Vespers on the day.

October—The Month of the Rosary

Our Blessed Mother in her apparitions at Fatima in 1917 identified herself as The Lady of the Rosary. She appeared to three shepherd children Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco and repeatedly exhorted them to pray the rosary for world peace and the salvation of souls, to do penance and make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. At that time the Great War was raging across Europe and she foretold that a greater war would follow during the reign of Pope Pius XI if mankind did not listen to her advice and repent. World War II as predicted by Our Lady has come and gone and it appears that mankind has not adhered to Our Lady's request to pray the rosary daily for peace.

According to pious tradition, the idea of the Rosary was given to Saint Dominic when the Virgin Mary appeared to him in an apparition in the year 1214. This Marian apparition is given the title of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Dominican priest and theologian Blessed Alan de la Roche promoted the practice of the Rosary by establishing the "fifteen rosary promises" and founding several rosary confraternities.

The rosary is the favorite prayer of heaven and earth. No other prayer has been recommended by Our Lady in her visitations from heaven to earth like the rosary. No other prayer has been so frequently praised, commended and even commanded by the Popes, or enriched by them with such great indulgences as the rosary.

Devotion to the Rosary is one of the most distinguishable features of popular Catholic spirituality. The Rosary inspires us to meditate on the mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary. Meditation is an important part of our lives as Catholics. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, meditation "engages thought, imagination, emotion and desire. This mobilization of faculties is necessary in order to deepen our convictions of faith, prompt the conversion of our heart and strengthen our will to follow Christ." It makes sense to recommend the rosary especially given that Our Lady herself has asked us to pray it assuring us, that said with faith, it will bring us spiritual benefits, be an effective instrument in changing hearts and help to promote peace in our troubled world.

Rosary Events in our Church

We have the Marian Movement of Priests (MMP) Rosary (also known as the Cenacle) every Monday at 11.45 am (MMP Cenacle)

Daily rosary is prayed every Tuesday to Saturday following the 9 am Mass and after the 12.30 pm Mass every Monday to Friday.

We have a Parish Online Rosary on some of Our Lady's major feast days, usually at 8 pm. The next one will be on Tuesday 7 October at 8 pm (Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, Link: https://us02web.zoom.us/j/82321899320 or Meeting ID: 823 2189 9320) and Monday 8 December (Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Zoom details will follow). Please feel free to join us.

"One Million Children Praying the Rosary" (Pray & Play) will be held in the church on 7 October at 2 pm. Parents are invited to bring their children to be part of this event. See details on flyer in the bulletin.

Please join us for a **Public Rosary in the forecourt** of the church on Saturday 11 October at 11 am (see separate notice). This public rosary is an international campaign to pray the rosary together in commemoration of the last apparition of Our Lady (October 13, 1917) at Fatima. It is a great opportunity for prayer groups and communities to join together in public prayer.

A group of young people in our parish are responsible for organising the Five First Saturdays rosary devotion which is held every first Saturday of the month either in the forecourt or in the church (depending on the weather). This is in compliance with the request of Our Lady in 1925 when she appeared to Sr Lucia, one of the visionaries at Fatima in 1917. 



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

REVERSAL OF FORTUNE

We live in relative wealth and comfort, although we are aware of many who suffer from impoverishment and homelessness. We know that the wealthy get wealthier as the gap between the rich and poor grows. This is a global issue.

Today's Gospel reflects on this same issue characterised in a person of great wealth and another who is impoverished, hungry and sore-covered. He is called 'Lazarus'. The evangelist wants our sympathy to be with him. He is named and even attended to by God's creature, the dog, who seeks to heal Lazarus' sores. In contrast, Luke paints a picture of a nameless wealthy householder. He feasts daily, dressed in the garb of imperialism with a table overloaded with food, inaccessible to the famished Lazarus barred by a gate. Both die and the roles become reversed in the afterlife vividly portrayed. Lazarus is comforted by God; the other separated by a huge gulf in the flames of punishment. Even in this scene of the hereafter the man of wealth continues to look down on Lazarus and suggest he even be his servant, bringing water to quench his intolerable thirst.

The promise of comfort for those who suffer and the reversal of fortune for those of wealth echoes throughout the Gospel. This is the future that awaits everyone and is in God's hands. To those of high status and wealth in the Lukan household, the story would be heard as a sobering reminder of how to live generously, caring for those in need. Today's Gospel might also nudge us into action.







The Jubilee of Catechists 28 September 2025

The Special Religious Education / Catechist Ministry at Chatswood is a vibrant Ministry committed to educating children attending public primary schools and a secondary school within the parish. Lessons are conducted with students from Kindergarten to Year 6 during school terms, and high school seminars take place twice each term at Chatswood High School.


Approximately 700 children attend lessons at five primary state schools: Artarmon, Castle Cove, Chatswood, Mowbray, Roseville and Chatswood high school.

Throughout the year clergy visits take place at the schools with clergy enthusiastically participating in lessons, to the delight of the children and the Catechists! Flyers and newsletters are issued to students to take home to their parents and families. Opportunities for Catechists to share their experiences and get together occur regularly during meetings, coffee catch ups and Reflection Days throughout the year.

Catechists:

- Teach from the Catholic curriculum provided by the Diocese of Broken Bay
- Engage in a range of 'age and stage' appropriate activities with children using the 'Walking with Jesus Pathways to Discipleship' program. Activities include Bible stories, colouring in, songs and word puzzles
- Actively listen to children and encourage them in prayers to know Jesus' unconditional love for them
 Share our stories and grow together in faith with the children, in a warm and engaging classroom environment.

The Walking with Jesus program consists of Student Books, Teachers' Manuals, and downloadable digital resources for use by Catechists in their lessons.

What is the Atrium?

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a Christian formation process for children between the ages of 3 and 12 years. The central aim of this faith formation program is to enable the child to experience and form an authentic relationship with God. This happens in a specially prepared room called the atrium.

The Catechesis is grounded in scripture and the liturgy of the church, then framed by Montessori principles of education. This allows children to hear the Gospels through the use of sensorially rich materials. The children are free to work with these materials that represent essential proclamations of the Christian message.

On Thursday the Community Gardeners of OLOD, having previously fertilized and prepared the soil in the garden beds, planted our new Spring offerings. We have chosen a mixture of herbs and vegetables as well as flowers that support pollen-spreading insects like butterflies and bees that are fast becoming endangered species in Sydney and elsewhere. Each of us has our own beds with our chosen plants, some dedicated to favorite saints. Come and visit them as they grow. Lei's are the cucumbers and beans in the name of St Michael, Maryanne's marigolds and lobelia are for St Mary McKillop, Alison has chosen lavender bushes, Jason has planted some Chinese vegetables donated by the Botanic Gardens, Caroline's are chilies and Irene's are basil and Jo has dedicated her bed of basil and coriander to St Jude which says a lot about her

gardening skill. When the Feast of St Francis comes round and the Season of Creation draws to a close, the Community Garden will be blessed by Fr David. Do check it out as you go by and see if you can find the melitzana (Greek), aubergine (French), baingan (Hindi), eggplant (Australia) growing shyly under their rather chewed-up leaves.

As Catholics we view creation as the work of God and this therefore gives us greater reason for respecting nature in all its various expressions. We have concern for the state of the environment such as protecting wild lives e.g. the koala, the forest, the impact of mining, protecting the Barrier Reef etc. We are constantly being reminded of the threat posed by climate change.

Let us also remember that the pinnacle of God's creation in under a deliberate and large scale attack by human agencies. The unborn baby has a dignity as it is "made in the image and likeness of God" and is created for eternal union with God the Creator. Alongside our concern for our environment there is an even urgent concern for human life. In considering God's creation and our role in appreciating and respecting it, we acknowledge the primacy of the need to protect the life of the unborn and to demand that government acts to protect these children while we do everything within our capacity to draw attention to the plight of the unborn and to protect and uphold them, bearing in mind that they enjoy the same dignity in the eyes of God as we do ourselves.
