Dear friends

Welcome to a new year in the life of our Church as we commence the Season of Advent and enter our preparation of Christmas!

Last weekend on Bishop Anthony's directive we re-introduced at every Mass the Chalice with the Precious Blood of Christ available to everyone who wishes to avail of it. This week we will make the chalice available on each side of the Sanctuary (rather than simply on one side).

Regretfully, we have run out of all our copies of the wonderful Advent resource published by our Diocese. However, as week to secure some more hard copies, the resource is available online through the QR code here. It is not too late to join one of our Advent Reflection groups being led by Deacon Tan on a Tuesday—either at 10.00am or at 7.00pm

We have now been able to collate all the responses to the survey that we undertook a few months ago on the renovation of our church—a project that lies ahead for us over 2026-2027, with the hope that the project will be completed ahead of the International Eucharistic Congress taking place in Sydney in 2028. Over the last few weekends. we had the opportunity to participate in our **Parish Pulse Survey**— a wonderful way to measure the mood of our community life and which we wish to conduct at this time every year. There will be yet a further opportunity to participate in the survey this weekend too. There are printed surveys in the church which we can leave in the white boxes around the church. An online version is also available through the QR code here.

Through the month of November we have conducted an annual count of the number of people attending Mass in our church. The outcome of this count has been 1485 average attendance each weekend. This is an increase from 1444 when the count was last taken in May 2025. The ever-increasing number over the last years has been very encouraging and is testament to the vitality of our parish community.

During the week, we received news of the permanent appointment of Mrs Brenda Timp, Principal of Mercy College, to the role of Catholic Schools Broken Bay Precinct Lead for the lower North Shore region. In this role, Brenda will have responsibility for the development of the new co-ed K-12 Catholic School at Pymble, and oversight of the recent changes at Northbridge and Willoughby primary schools. We will miss Brenda's more immediate engagement with our parish which has been simply superb over the last five years. With grateful hearts we wish her all the very best in this new chapter in her educational leadership. We are delighted, however, that Ms Melissa Murray, acting Principal at Mercy College has now been appointed in a permanent position as Principal of Mercy College. We congratulate Melissa and look forward to our close collaboration with her.

We acknowledge the Cammeraygal People of the Eora Nation, custodians of the land on which our parish stands and we commit ourselves to the ongoing journey of national reconciliation.

As a Parish of Catholic Faith we are committed to ensuring always a community of safety and care for all especially for children, and those who are vulnerable.

Preparing for Mass

In preparing to receive Christ in the Eucharist, you should consider:

- Have I interiorly prepared through prayer?
- Would the Sacrament of Reconciliation assist my preparation?
- Have I maintained the Eucharistic fast for one hour before receiving, except for water and medicine?*

*The elderly and infirm, along with those who care for them, are not bound to the Eucharistic fast.



"We must never forget the sacredness of what happens at Mass. It would be unthinkable to reduce the Eucharist to mere ritual or routine. Communion Procession

The act of processing forward to receive the Body and Blood of Christ is an important symbolic action, reminding us that we are a pilgrim people, while also uniting us as the one Body of Christ, journeying together. It is important, therefore, to remember that receiving the Body and Blood of Christ is not an isolated action, but rather part of a unifying ritual. In this regard, you should consider.

- Ensuring your actions allow the dignified and unifying pilgrimage as the Body of Christ, toward the Body of Christ. This includes singing the Communion Hymn, while processing.
- Being aware of your personal and valid choices as a communicant, that they do not disrupt the flow of the procession, or the ability of others to make their own choices.
- Leaving enough space between yourself and the person in front of you.
- As a sign of reverence to the Blessed Sacrament, gently bow not genuflect as you approach the Minster of Holy Communion.

Receiving the Body of Christ

When receiving the Body of Christ, the common posture in Australia is to stand; however, the communicant can choose to kneel, as long as they are aware of their surroundings and do not impact the reverence and safety of others. As you come forward to receive and gently bow, the Minister holds the host up to your eye level and says the words, "The Body of Christ", allowing you to reply "Amen" before receiving.

It is the communicant's choice whether to receive on the hand or on the tongue. Both are acceptable, and both should be done with reverence, respect and care.

Receiving on the hand

Place your hands out in front of you, with your dominant hand under your less dominant hand. Hold your hands still and open. Keep your fingers out of the way, allowing the Minister of Communion to place the host on your hand. Do not pluck or grab the host.

Once you receive on the hand, step to the side and consume the host while in the presence of the Minister.

Receiving on the tongue

After responding "Amen", open your mouth and gently extend your tongue out towards the Minister of Communion, so that they may place the host on your tongue. Please do not lower or bow your head while receiving on the tongue.

Once the host has been placed on your tongue, slowly draw your tongue back into your mouth to consume the Body of Christ.





Receiving the Blood of Christ

If the chalice is being offered at Mass, a communicant can choose if they wish to receive the Blood of Christ.


In the same manner which you approach the Body of Christ, bow gently as you approach the Minister, who will say "The Blood of Christ", and you respond "Amen." Take the Chalice in your hands as you would normally take a cup, and raise the Chalice to drink as normal, one sip is sufficient. Then carefully hand the Chalice back to the Minister.



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

STAY AWAKE!

Happy New Year! Today we listen to the Gospel according to Matthew for the first time on this first day of the new liturgical year, Year A. Matthew writes for Jewish followers of Jesus living in the mid-80s of the first century. We shall listen to this Gospel aware that Israelite-Jewish concepts permeate its presentation of the Jewish Jesus, so different from Mark or Luke.

The language of today's Gospel is very Jewish. It is drawn from imagery of the Old Testament—typical, as we shall see, of Matthew—and from a particular style of biblical writing called 'apocalyptic'. Tempted to take our selection literally, it is better and to think of it as 'theological-poetry'. The evangelist uses a familiar Jewish literary style of writing. Its basic theme is that, despite the evil and tragedies that surround people, God will save and protect those who are faithful, especially at that definitive moment of divine judgement at the end of time.

Jesus' injunction is to 'stay awake' to this moment—not to fall asleep or become disheartened by its delay. God will definitively act against evil and vindicate the faithful. Today's Gospel is a sobering reminder. We, too, must 'stay awake' and 'stand ready' to what will unfold in the year ahead and not be dispirited by all that seems negative, fruitless and disheartening. God's presence, the God who 'will be with us' will be revealed in the figure of the 'Son of Man'. This is a recurring theme in the Gospel and throughout this new liturgical year.

We will be able to share the outcomes of the Parish —in—Council in the coming weeks.




St Vincent de Paul Christmas Appeal 2025

OLD Vinnies Summer Appeal will be held next weekend. We report monthly on our activities, our November report is also in this bulletin. Since our Winter Appeal , OLD Vinnies i.e. we/you, have helped some 95 both families/single persons (cases) who sought help. We expended some \$13000. These figures are well above average. We are seeing a trend for more cases to be complicated with DV, mental health, children with disabilities and effects of drugs. So far we have not had to turn away help seekers but resources, both material and human, are strained.

Our main resource is from our Appeals. For our last Winter Appeal you generously gave \$9000. All donations to the Appeals goes to help our local cases. Shortfalls are being filled mainly from surpluses in the local region, Bunnings BBQs and poor boxes.

Vinnies is an international organisation and OLD Vinnies provides limited support to 5 overseas conferences in Indonesia and Thailand which are thankful. What your support does, apart from material help, shows Christian Charity at work and Catholic Witness. We hope that you will continue to generously support our neighbours in need next weekend.




