

From Fr David

Dear friends,

Thank you to all those who assisted whilst our clergy were on retreat last week. It was a very restful and nourishing week and our priests are deeply grateful for the opportunity.

The Church's annual Season of Creation starts on Monday and runs until 4 October which is St Francis's feast day. As a registered EarthCare parish this is an important season for us when, following the vision of the late Pope Francis, and as now reiterated by Pope Leo XIV, we listen to the Cry of the Earth and the Cry of the Poor. This year will follow a similar pattern to last year but with some significant differences. Last year we 'greened' the church over the 4 week period, decorating the window ledges with pot plants contributed by parishioners. This year we would love the support of the wonderful people who do the flowers and church decoration for other seasons so that the greening becomes more apparent. We again need any of us who have pot plants at home to bring them along and set them in place on the window ledges. Please put your name on your pot so that it doesn't get taken into the PEW or somewhere else. Last year we undertook a major audit of our parish's performance against the key measures for an Earthcare Parish. This year we need only to measure our progress against those criteria and the extent to which we have achieved the goals we set ourselves. Last year we started a Community Garden. Wow! This Season of Creation we will dig up the vegetables that have gone to seed and plant herbs to harvest for the parish to enjoy and also flowers that are known to help our bee and butterfly colonies to flourish. Last year we went on a bush walk culminating in a beautiful reflection led by Fr Anselam and a shared morning tea. This year that will take place on Saturday morning 13 September. Finally there will be a blessing of the Community Garden on Sunday 5 October.

Our Parish Pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi for the Year of Jubilee in the first half of November now has 29 participants! It will be a very special time away together. It is still possible to join us, but registrations definitely close at the end of September. Phone Harvest on 1800 819 156 and Quote Pilgrimage PV2588.

PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI: TO THE TOP





TAKING THE LOWER PLACE. In today's Gospel Jesus offers some wise advice on table etiquette. For Luke, the story has implications for the relationship of the rich to the poor who gather for the Eucharistic banquet. Only if all members are treated with equal dignity can it truly be called the Lord's Supper. Parishes prosper when all are treated equally regardless of how much each can put on the collection plate.



A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted."

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

MEAL-TEACHINGS

Today's opening Gospel verse sets the scene for what will unfold. It is a Sabbath, a day of rest when Israelites emulate the action of God in the creation story in Genesis 1. A meal now provides this for Jesus. What follows is in two parts.

The first is an analysis of social structure and hierarchy in Luke's day. Jesus notices how some presume to sit in the places of honour. They presume entitlement. We are in a world where one of the most important social dynamics concerns the importance of 'honour' and 'shame.' Honour is a publicly recognised value by which people are confirmed or grow in their social standing; shame is its antithesis. Honour is a limited commodity which is either inherited or acquired. Those who 'shame' another grow in honour. Luke's Jesus uses this social dynamic to reflect on self-exaltation and humility: 'Those who exalt themselves will be humbled and those who humble themselves will be

The second part of today's Gospel further explores what happens at meals. The common expectation would be to host a meal with one's friends and people of similar social standing. Jesus upends such meal etiquette. Rather than inviting social equals he encourages meal invitees to be the poor and those from the lower echelons. Payment for such graciousness will occur in the time of resurrection. These meal-teachings from Luke's day, of humility and welcoming of the poor, continue to speak to us today.

The July Our Lady of Dolours St Vincent de Paul Conference Report



In July, OLD Vinnies responded to 14 calls for help, 3 were received late and were carried into August, 3 were from families with long term difficulties outside our scope but towards which we are providing support. We provided food and furniture to a New Australian single parent family to make their rented digs more livable. We made more workable the enforced temporary living arrangements of a family whose bathroom was subject of necessary upgrade. We helped another newcomer with moving into recently allocated public housing. Another newbie family with DV associated medical conditions was assisted with bills and clothing. Other assistance provided was more routine including appliance repairs, clothing and significant pharmaceutical support. (People on pensions generally can manage day to day but emergencies such as appliance breakdowns upset budgets.) Some \$2000 of resources were needed.

Our grateful thanks to all contributors to our recent Winter Appeal which raised over \$9000.
