This Sunday's Gospel - Matthew 25:1-13

Dear friends



This Sunday we will be honoured by a visit from the Governor of NSW, the Hon Margaret Beazley AC KC who will join us for the performance of the Bach Akademie. It will be special to welcome her to our church for the first time.

A very special thank you to all those who have prepared the Second Session of our Parish-in-Council that has occurred this weekend, on the afternoon of Saturday 18 November. Now our sessions focus on practical ways by which we can bring to life our Misson to Bring the Light of Christ to the City. Again, we have some 100 people involved and over a dozen children in Kidz-in-Council. That there are new faces that are participating is a great encouragement. During this session of Parish-in-Council we have also published our Parish Annual Report. This is available to everyone, as well, this weekend and is online. It is a wonderful showcase of so much that makes our parish community vibrant. Early next year we will come back to it particularly in respect to the question of how best to finance such a large enterprise.

During the week we celebrated our first "Footprints" Mass to remember all those who have died in miscarriage and stillbirth. It was a beautiful and poignant celebration that we will now offer every November. A big thank you to Chloe, Olivia and Gen for putting everything together for the Mass.

Over the last few days we have learnt of the death of two people who have been very much part of our Chatswood parish story: Fr John Alt and Sr Ellen Cahill rsm. As Victoria Tubier recalls, "Fr John came to Chatswood in 1974 as Assistant Parish Priest. Father Alt was always very kind. He was interested in every parishioner and made sure to get to know them. He was very fatherly for such a young man. Father Alt was a key member of the Paulian Association, which had been founded by Roy Boylan. A number of families in the parish would take turns to gather in members' homes and discuss scriptural passages but also the social aspects of problems in the world, and what we might do about them. On one particular occasion, however, his love of harness racing warred with his love of scripture, and he had a quiet word in the ear of the evening's host to see if we could pop the television on – just for a quick look at the Miracle Mile while we were having supper. Back in the 70s some of the priests still wore more formal attire, and were often invited to come into Our Lady of Dolours primary school and give a class. Father Alt would come striding across the playground in beretta and cassock, children hanging off him as he greeted them. In his robes, and with his imposing height made even greater by the beretta, the children described him as being 'at least seven feet tall', and reported to their parents that God had come to speak in their class earlier that day." Fr John had also been Parish Priest of Meadowbank for many years.

Sr Ellen Cahill rsm was the deputy principal at OLD for many years across the 1970s and then was principal at St Mary's North Sydney. Her brother Jim and his wife Roma (both deceased) lived in East Roseville (now Castle Cove) opposite the former church there. Jim was an Acolyte at East Roseville for many years and also here at OLD when East Roseville was closed down. From memory, Roma only died in the last year or so and was buried from Chatswood. Sr Ellen was buried from Monte San Angelo College in North Sydney on Friday.

Eternal rest grant unto Fr John and Sr Eilen, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.

This Wednesday evening at 7.30pm Bishop Anthony will join us for our annual celebration of Red Wednesday Mass at 7.30pm. This is the Mass at which we remember the Suffering Church – Christians throughout the world who are persecuted for their faith. Do join us for this special occasion.

Please note that because of this celebration, there will be no 6pm Mass on Wednesday 22 November. Neither will there 6pm Mass on Wednesday 29 November due to a special Carols Event in our church that evening. We will resume our Wednesday 6pm Mass in the first week of December.

This week I shall be in Brisbane delivering a retreat to the clergy of the Archdiocese from Sunday evening to Friday morning. Please keep me in your prayer. I shall be home for the Ordination to the Diaconate of Hien Vu for our Diocese of Broken Bay taking place at St Leonard's Naremburn on Friday 24 November at 7.30pm. We keep Hien in our prayer especially at this auspicious time.



GOSPEL REFLECTION

As I was growing up my Dad often said to me "If a job is worth doing, it is worth doing well". In other words, don't do a job in a half-hearted fashion, but give it all your attention and use all your ability no matter how lowly it seems.

The writer of the proverbs is saying the same thing. He uses a woman, one who would not normally be singled out, to emphasise his point. If he had talked about a king or a high priest his comments would not have had as much impact because, in those days, you couldn't criticise a king or a high priest. Therefore, everything they did was right.

There was probably no point talking about a slave because they had to do whatever they were told, so he chose the next lowest on the social ladder but someone that everyone was familiar with, a wife and mother.

Not only did she do her tasks well, but she made time to help the poor and the needy. And for this she was praised at the city gates. That was where the important people (the elders) sat to discuss town business and problems. You can imagine the elders saying to someone who comes to them for help, "Go and see Mary Smith she will look after you.

The wife in the story had particular talents and she used them for the good of her husband and for others. The gospel also talks about talents. While it is actually money that is being talked about it can also be applied to our talents (our gifts) given to us by God.

The first two men took what was given to them and used it profitably for themselves and the giver. The third man basically said "I don't have any gifts" so he hid what he had and did nothing. There are many people in the church

who do exactly the same thing. They are asked to do something and say I can't, I don't have the ability. They keep putting themselves down. Someone close to me is actually a good leader but will never willingly take leadership positions. Yet I have seen this person with a group of people and when he quietly suggests someone do something they do it without question. His authority is immediately recognised.

God has blessed each of us with gifts or talents. Consider the gifts of the Holy Spirit that we receive at Confirmation. They are given to us for serving and building up the body of Christ. These are all marvelous gifts that he wants us to nurture so that they can bear powerful fruit. The kingdom of God isn't built up only by prayer and fasting, miracles and healing. It also requires more ordinary, but no less useful, gifts such as compassion, curiosity, industriousness, kindness, and courage.

Remember, the Kingdom of God has been expanded by such common things as the invention of the telephone, advances in air travel, and even the work of some very creative authors and songwriters!

A young boy once offered Jesus his bag lunch. He certainly didn't think his few pieces of bread and two fish could make a big difference. But Jesus used it to feed a multitude!

God can do a lot with a little.

He has given us talents to further his kingdom, and he wants to work through us. Don't let them lie dormant, collecting dust. Be generous, be adventurous, and surrender them to him.

Miracles just may follow!

The unfaithful servant feared he could never please his master, so he didn't even try.

We do something similar when we wait for God to assign us some really important task and ignore the small ones he gives us every day, or when we turn aside from his prompting because we think we're not good enough. The reality is, God is already delighted with us!


If we take our eyes off ourselves and simply start doing his will, he will multiply our efforts with an abundant harvest. But he cannot use our talents if they are buried in a hole marked "When I'm Ready."

I know that within this parish there are many people who are using their talents and we thank them for that. But for the rest of us - Have you allowed your gift to remain dormant? If so, now is the time to start using it.







BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

BEING READY FOR THE DAY OF THE LORD

At first sight, it seems hard to make sense of the choice of readings for this Sunday. How are we to understand and appreciate the combination of the description of the perfect wife from the book of Proverbs, Paul's advice on the coming of the Day of the Lord, and the warning contained in Jesus' parable of the talents?

The first reading comes from a world

where

the role and possibilities for a woman were

solely defined by her responsibility for the home. The key to understanding the reading is not the cultural expectations of the woman, limited as they were, but the qualities which mark her life – generosity, diligence, care for the poor and openness to the needy.

Paul sets out to help his community to prepare for the Lord's return by reminding them that they had no need to fear the coming of the Lord if they live good Christian lives. The most important thing is to live in the present moment well to be ready for the Lord's return.

Matthew's community is encouraged to prepare for the Day of the Lord by focusing on the need to make use of the talents and opportunities which the Lord had given them. One of the striking elements of the parable is that the tenants are judged in accordance with what they have been given on an individual basis. Like the woman in the first reading, it is not what you have but how you use it that is most important for again.



LET'S HELP END MODERN SLAVERY

Baptist World Aid this week published its 2023 Ethical Fashion Report. In it they identify fast fashion companies that provide cheap clothing by continuing to exploit the 80 million women and children who work in the garment supply chain around the world. Their 2023 report finds that Australians are more likely to change our behaviour to purchase ethically than any other people in the world but our problem is, we don't know which are the ethical companies to buy from. Also the rise in living costs makes it harder to resist cheap attractive clothing even though we suspect that its low price means that we are supporting modern slavery in buying it. The good news is that annual reports like the one published this week by Baptist World Aid are bringing about change. For example, Kmart and Target which ranked among the worst companies when the Ethical Fashion Report was first published has moved up the ranks since and is now in the top 20% with a score of 53 out of 100. Big W is only at 34 which at least is an improvement on previous years in contrast to companies like Decjuba which is unchanged at 16 and Billabong which still scores 5 out of 100 and is in the bottom 20% of companies assessed. You can find out how ethical your favourite clothing company is by putting Baptist World Aid Australia/Ethical Fashion Report into your browser and typing in the brand name. It's our behaviour as consumers that can bring an end to modern slavery. Let's do it.
