#### Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

On this Sunday, we as Church reflect on the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd, as told in chapter 10 of the Gospel of John. Historically, shepherds have been considered honorable individuals, even noble. Ezekiel refers to the kings of Israel as shepherds. In Psalm 23, pious Jews view their God as a shepherd who provides good things for his flock: "The Lord is my shepherd" (verse 1). The psalm continues to articulate what it means to be in a committed relationship with the Good Shepherd.

When Jesus says, "I am the good shepherd" (John 10:14), those who hear him automatically draw a parallel to those attributes because of their familiarity with the Psalms. The new insight Jesus adds is this: "I give them eternal life, and they will never perish" (10:28). Jesus is saying that not only in this life, but also in life eternal, all those who hear his voice and follow him will have all these good things. The Good Shepherd desires only good things for his flock. Jesus and his Father look after those who hear their voices and follow them.







#### Fatima and the Rosary

At every one of her six apparitions at Fatima between May and October 1917, Our Lady specifically asked for the rosary to be said everyday. The rosary is prayed almost daily in our church - Mondays - 11.45 am, Tuesdays to Saturdays - following the 9 am Mass. Everyone is most welcome to join in. According to tradition, the Rosary was given to **Saint Dominic** (1170-1221) in 1208 in a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary to spread this devotion. It was later promoted by **Blessed Allan de la Roche** (1428-1475) a Dominican Friar who received from the Blessed Virgin herself through a private revelation 15 promises to those who pray the Rosary devoutly.

#### 15 Promises of the Virgin Mary to Christians Who Recite the Rosary:

- 1. To all those who shall recite my Rosary devoutly, I promise my special protection and very great graces.
- 2. Those who shall persevere in the recitation of my Rosary will receive some signal grace.
- 3. The Rosary will be a very powerful armour against Hell; it will destroy vice, deliver from sin, and dispel heresy.
- 4. The Rosary will make virtue and good works flourish, and will obtain for souls the most abundant divine mercies; it will substitute in hearts love of God for love of the world, and elevate them to desire heavenly and eternal good. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means!
- 5. Those who trust themselves to me through the Rosary will not perish.
- 6. Those who shall recite my Rosary piously, considering its mysteries, will not be overwhelmed by misfortune, nor die a bad death. The sinner will be converted; the just will grow in grace and become worthy of eternal life.
- 7. Those truly devoted to my Rosary will not die without the consolations of the Church, or without grace.
- 8. Those who shall recite my Rosary will find during their life and at their death the light of God, the fullness of His grace, and will share in the merits of the blessed.
- 9. I will deliver very promptly from Purgatory the souls devoted to my Rosary.
- 10. The true children of my Rosary will enjoy great glory in Heaven.
- 11. What you shall ask through my Rosary you shall obtain.
- 12. Those who propagate my Rosary will obtain through me aid in all their necessities.
- 13. I have obtained from my Son that all confreres of the Rosary shall have for their brethren in life and death the saints of Heaven.
- 14. Those who recite my Rosary faithfully are all my beloved children, the brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ.
- 15. Devotion to my Rosary is a great sign of predestination

Many of us have busy lives with much time devoted to achieving personal goals and demands made of us by life. In this situation prayer can often be omitted as it may seem that


our inactivity equates with lack of achievement yet we know that Jesus calls us to prayer and himself found time and a place for prayer.

#### A Message from Bishop Anthony on Vocations Sunday


This Sunday, 8 May is World Day of Prayer for Vocations – marking its 59<sup>th</sup> anniversary. It is also known as Good Shepherd Sunday. The motivation for this day is found in both the Gospels of Matthew (9:38) and Luke (10:2) when Jesus says "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborer's into his harvest." There are four vocations our Church uses to help discern God's plan: marriage, single life, priesthood and religious life and God calls us to respond freely and generously to His call.

However, World Day of Prayer for vocations is an opportunity to celebrate and pray for vocations to ordained ministry and religious life in all its forms. In the Diocese of Broken Bay we have 7 seminarians and 3 Diaconate Aspirants. As a community we need to wrap ourselves around their formation. Everyone in the Church has ownership of their process which is multi-dimensional – the human, spiritual, intellectual and pastoral – and they interrelate, and interconnect with each other. In my years as a priest and bishop I have served as a vo-



cations director, seminary rector and episcopal vicar for formation with a particular focus on the formation of seminarians, young clergy, and the ongoing formation of priests. I know those discerning a vocation today have seen the challenges the Church has faced and the shift in culture but still they come forward. I have also heard those considering a vocation say that prayers, their own as well as others, are critical to their discernment. Even once a decision has been made to pursue the priesthood, diaconate, missionary or religious life, the continual prayers of the faithful for the grace to persevere in holiness are appreciated and welcomed. Please pray, on this Vocations Sunday, for our seminarians and deacons as they continue on their journey, and pray that the Lord will bless the Diocese of Broken Bay with more vocations.

Sunday is also special for all the mothers in the Diocese. I pray you and your families have a very special Mother's Day, and even if your mother cannot be with you I will pray in gratitude for all those who have given new life.

It is with mixed feelings that I announce that after twelve years of outstanding leadership and dedicated service to the St Pius X College community, Mr John Couani will conclude his time as Principal of the College at the end of the current school year.

John's contribution to the St Pius X community has been immense. He has not only overseen the transition from the leadership of the Christian Brothers to lay leadership but has also been instrumental in building upon the College's excellent reputation in the local and broader Catholic community. Under his stewardship, College enrolments have never been stronger and John has been passionate in his desire to see all young people experience success in their lives. He is a man of deep faith and has been a wonderful advocate for the charism of Blessed Edmund Rice.

John started his teaching career in 1977 at Marist Sisters' College in Woolwich and also worked at Marist College, Pagewood and Brigidine College in Randwick. In 1987 he became the Assistant Principal at St Brendan's College in Yeppoon in Queensland (a Christian Brothers' school) and later he returned to Sydney to take up the role of Deputy Principal at St Patrick's College Sutherland, another Christian Brothers' school. John then moved into more senior roles in Catholic education; firstly as Principal at De La Salle College in Kingsgrove and later at Holy Spirit College in Lakemba. In 2002, John became a senior Regional Consultant with the Catholic Education Office in Sydney and was the Regional Director in the Eastern Region from 2006-2010. John commenced as Principal of St Pius X in 2011.

As John transitions to retirement in 2023, we wish him and his wife Maree every blessing. He will be sorely missed by members of the St Pius X College community and by his colleagues in Catholic education.



#### Towards the Federal Election—21 May 2022



Australia's Catholic bishops have called for a shakeup that focuses the country's politics on the common good of all, including - and especially - those who struggle to participate in the community.

Archbishop Mark Coleridge said no one political party fully embodies Catholic Social Teaching. The bishops are, however, offering an election statement to encourage Catholics and people of good will to reflect on the good they can do for their community by using their vote for the good of all. Archbishop Mark said "we all long for what Pope Francis calls 'a better kind of politics, one that is truly at service of the common good."

The Statement takes the theme "Towards a Better Kind of Politics" from Pope Francis' encyclical letter Fratelli Tutti. While not endorsing political parties, the document identifies some key issues that the bishops believe voters should consider before deciding which candidates or parties to support. The statement was prepared with reference to the key principles of Catholic Social Teaching, which are outlined in the statement.
