Reflection by Sr Maria Joanna on the Feast of the Presentation

Praised be Jesus and Mary!

First of all, I'd like to express my gratitude to Fr. David for inviting me to write in the occasion of the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus.

I said my *Fiat* to the consecrated life when I was climbing the Cross Mountain(Crizevac) during the pilgrimage to Medjugorje in 1991. I had received the Call from the Lord Jesus earlier, but I hadn't yet given Him my definite reply. While climbing the Cross Mountain, a small mountain full of rocks, with the Stations of the Cross along the side of the track, I felt urged to take off my shoes. Nowadays the rocks are smooth worn by the foot of pilgrims, but then the rocks had rather sharp edges. While I was slowly climbing the Mountain barefoot, I realised the consecrated life to me is to follow Jesus doing the *Via Crucis* with Him because of the reason that I love Jesus and Mary. When I realised this, I said "Yes" in my heart to give my life to Him. Right away my whole being was inundated with immense joy to the point I almost couldn't feel the pain under my foot.

One year later I joined "Marian Community Oasis of Peace (Comunita' Mariana Oasi della Pace)", a new congregation born in Northern Italy in 1987 by Fr. Gianni Sgreva, a Passionist priest, with a group of young Italian. We try to live the life of intercession, expiation, and accoglienza (welcoming with heart) for peace of the world, and, ultimately, to become peace in resemblance of Jesus who reconciled the world on the Cross (Ef 2.14-18).

It is almost 30 years since I joined the Congregation. I never regretted my choice all these years because God makes me understand this life is His Will for me. My life is given to Him, hence my life is always in His Presence and under His Providence.

I still remember when the words of John 3:8 were impressed in my heart while I was praying in our Church of Our Lady of Dolour 30 years ago when I was searching for the Will of God. Even though we can't fathom profoundly works of the Holy Spirit, by trusting in Him we can become like little birds carried aloft on the Eagle's Wing (cfr Ex 19:4). And this leads us to have peace deep in our heart.
