From Fr David

Dear friends,

Over these weeks we have lost a number of very long-standing members of our community—Joe Woods, Terry Meagher (to whom we offer a tribute later in this bulletin), Moncia Cotter. Sadly Minnie Walshe now also joins them with the Lord in heaven, having passed away on the evening of Wednesday 1 October in Liverpool Hospital. Eternal rest grant unto Minnie O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon her. We will look to celebrate a Memorial Mass for Minnie in due time.

We are very mindful, too, this weekend of all those so tragically affected by the recent earthquake in the Philippines. A number of our community have relatives and friends in the area that has been struck. We keep them very much in our prayer.

There are a number of special activities in our community through the month of October. Importantly, in our Catholic Tradition, October is the month during which we are especially mindful of the Rosary, the great prayer to Our Lady through which we contemplate on the great mysteries of our Faith. We have many opportunities to pray the Rosary together this month. One of these is on 7 October, Our Parish has been registered for the 'One Million Children Praying the Rosary' for the Tuesday October campaign. Apparently, there are currently 238, 184 children registered so far. So be sure to have a look further in the bulletin for the details of our "Play and Pray" initiative. It is a wonderful activity through the current school holidays.

Work has begun around our church to install critical subterranean drainage. We are hopeful that the heavy part of this work will be completed by the start of Term 4 on 14 October. Thank you to everyone for your patience during these weeks when access to the northern side of the church is not possible. Following the installation of the drainage, we will be able to attend to the remediation of the timber underneath the church floor, and then install a termite guard around the perimeter of all the buildings. This work is essential before we progress to further enhancement of our church.

Fr Hien Vu got away safely last Monday with the diocesan group on pilgrimage for which he is the chaplain. Our own parish Jubilee pilgrimage to Rome, Assisi and Medjugorje departs on Monday 3 November. We have 36 in the group, almost entirely people from our community or those associated with the parish in some way. There is a lot happening, however, before we depart—our October Rosary opportunities, our gratitude lunch for our Catechists on Sunday 12 October, our celebration of Carlo Acutis feastday on Monday 13 October, our Footprints Mass on Wednesday 15 October to pray for those lost through stillbirth, our Carlo Acutis Eucharistic Miracle Exhibition on Sunday 19 October, and of course most importantly our next session of Parish-in-Council on Saturday 25 October, and our annual blessing of animals on Sunday 26 October occurring with our next Community Lunch.














We previously shared that long-term parishioner Terry Meagher had died (aged 92). Terry and his wife Dolour joined our parish in the 1970s. Terry was a devoted Acolyte in our parish in the subsequent decades, serving on the Altar and taking Holy Communion to the sick and elderly until his own age and health prevented him from continuing. Terry also took Holy Communion to the sick in Royal North Shore Hospital for many years. Dolour was a long-serving Minister of Communion, Lector (i.e. Reader) and Catechist and three of their children (Bruce, Andrew and John) were Altar Servers. Terry was a dedicated member of our parish Social Justice Committee for many years.

Terry was educated by the Jesuits at St Ignatius' College Riverview and two of Terry's brothers (Geoffrey and Paddy, both now deceased) were Jesuit priests and missionaries in India. Their work was significantly funded by the annual Indian Bazaar which has been running at Riverview since 1952. Terry was a devoted worker on the Bazaar for many decades. Terry was farewelled by a grateful Jesuit clergy in a requiem Mass last Wednesday at St Mary's Catholic Church North Sydney, attended by his large extended family (Terry and Dolour had 7 children – Trish, Bruce, Andrew, Pip, Kate, John and Nicki) and a noticeably large group of Chatswood parishioners.

We extend our deepest condolences to Dolour and the rest of the family. Terry was the gentlest of men and would always greet you with a smile. He will be greatly missed







October—The Month of the Rosary

Our Blessed Mother in her apparitions at Fatima in 1917 identified herself as The Lady of the Rosary. She appeared to three shepherd children Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco and repeatedly exhorted them to pray the rosary for world peace and the salvation of souls, to do penance and make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. At that time the Great War was raging across Europe and she foretold that a greater war would follow during the reign of Pope Pius XI if mankind did not listen to her advice and repent. World War II as predicted by Our Lady has come and gone and it appears that mankind has not adhered to Our Lady's request to pray the rosary daily for peace.

According to pious tradition, the idea of the Rosary was given to Saint Dominic when the Virgin Mary appeared to him in an apparition in the year 1214. This Marian apparition is given the title of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Dominican priest and theologian Blessed Alan de la Roche promoted the practice of the Rosary by establishing the "fifteen rosary promises" and founding several rosary confraternities.

The rosary is the favorite prayer of heaven and earth. No other prayer has been recommended by Our Lady in her visitations from heaven to earth like the rosary. No other prayer has been so frequently praised, commended and even commanded by the Popes, or enriched by them with such great indulgences as the rosary.

Devotion to the Rosary is one of the most distinguishable features of popular Catholic spirituality. The Rosary inspires us to meditate on the mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary. Meditation is an important part of our lives as Catholics. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, meditation "engages thought, imagination, emotion and desire. This mobilization of faculties is necessary in order to deepen our convictions of faith, prompt the conversion of our heart and strengthen our will to follow Christ." It makes sense to recommend the rosary especially given that Our Lady herself has asked us to pray it assuring us, that said with faith, it will bring us spiritual benefits, be an effective instrument in changing hearts and help to promote peace in our troubled world.

Rosary Events in our Church

We have the Marian Movement of Priests (MMP) Rosary (also known as the Cenacle) every Monday at 11.45 am (MMP Cenacle)

Daily rosary is prayed every Tuesday to Saturday following the 9 am Mass and after the 12.30 pm Mass every Monday to Friday.

We have a Parish Online Rosary on some of Our Lady's major feast days, usually at 8 pm. The next one will be on Tuesday 7 October at 8 pm (Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, Link: https://us02web.zoom.us/j/82321899320 or Meeting ID: 823 2189 9320) and Monday 8 December (Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Zoom details will follow). Please feel free to join us.

"One Million Children Praying the Rosary" (Pray & Play) will be held in the church on 7 October at 2 pm. Parents are invited to bring their children to be part of this event. See details on flyer in the bulletin.

Please join us for a **Public Rosary in the forecourt** of the church on Saturday 11 October at 11 am (see separate notice). This public rosary is an international campaign to pray the rosary together in commemoration of the last apparition of Our Lady (October 13, 1917) at Fatima. It is a great opportunity for prayer groups and communities to join together in public prayer.

A group of young people in our parish are responsible for organising the Five First Saturdays rosary devotion which is held every first Saturday of the month either in the forecourt or in the church (depending on the weather). This is in compliance with the request of Our Lady in 1925 when she appeared to Sr Lucia, one of the visionaries at Fatima in 1917. 



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

MERELY SERVANTS

There are two parts to today's Gospel. The first concerns faith. The apostles ask Jesus to 'increase their faith'. His response is not about making faith quantifiable but about allowing it to be active—no matter how limited one's faith seems to be. Faith makes what seems impossible (requesting a tree to be uprooted and planted in the ocean) possible. The imagery that Jesus uses accentuates the real nature of faith and assures Gospel listeners that faith helps disciples to act with confidence and see unimaginable possibilities for their lives with God.

This affirmation connects to the second part of today's proclamation. It is about acting with a spirit of humility, rather than from high status and arrogance. The final words of the Gospel - 'We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty'-invites Luke's audience, and ourselves, to see that our conduct in fidelity to God is what is important, not how we are promoted or regarded differentially by others. The saying that exemplifies Luke's portrait of Jesus, as 'one who came to serve and not be served' encourages his disciples, seduced by status, to live similarly, 'rather than be served'.

This reversal of social expectation and status seeking is difficult in a world which promotes a popularity founded on worldliness, status seeking and entitlement.

The Jubilee of Catechists 28 September 2025

My name is Gillian Hawkins and I have been a catechist at Our Lady of Dolours Parish for 14 - 15 years.

In this wonderful **Jubilee Year** which we are celebrating, this particular weekend is the **Jubilee of Catechists Weekend** in all Catholic Parishes in Australia.

As a thanks and blessing for all of our Catechists in our Broken Bay Diocese, Bishop Anthony shared with us a wonderful morning of reflection on our Ministry on Friday, 26 September to commence our celebration of this Jubilee Weekend. It was wonderful to be together and to share this very special time of encouragement and blessing with Bishop Anthony – a very blessed and privileged opportunity to share together – well over 100 Catechists.

Can I just say, we need new catechists to join us? We always need new Catechists to join us.

Let me tell you that I absolutely love being a catechist – we go into a classroom for 30 minutes each week during a 10 week term and we talk to the children about God's love for them and **especially** about Jesus.

Parents and carers of children are their primary teachers of faith, it is they who have chosen to have them baptised and enrolled them in Catholic Scripture Lessons (SRE). We just come along and water those seeds of faith.

Catechists and helpers are needed across **all** Primary schools (**we have 5 Primary Schools in our Parish**) Artarmon, Chatswood, Castle Cove, Mowbray and Roseville. Perhaps your child attends one of those schools?

We also attend Chatswood High School to share five - one hour Seminars over one day, twice a term.

The structure and content of all lessons is provided for us. There is excellent training – which is not onerous; we have a Manual which clearly sets out the lessons; and the children have work books, all of which prepare us to go into the classroom and tell our children about Jesus.

In my journey as a Catechist I have learned so much more about my own walk with Jesus than I could ever hope to impart to the children.

I invite you to join us - teaching young children about Jesus and his love for them.

How blessed we are to have our faith and relationship with God – and what a wonderful opportunity to share it with others, particularly our children.

Please speak to one of our catechists at the front of the Church, who would love to answer any queries you may have.



These had in fact contributed to creating the small lake of water that had pooled under the Church floor and kept the walls damp.

Our last task as a registered Earthcare Parish is to review our performance against the goals of Laudato 'Si, 'hearing the Cry of the Earth and the Cry of the Poor'. We will do this over the coming week by surveying the various ministries of the parish to identify the environmentally-conscious steps each has taken during the last 12 months and the efforts of each, as appropriate, to consider the Cry of the Poor. So we close our month-long reflection and celebration with St Francis's renowned canticle to Creation.






