

Stories of Local Hope

In Feb 2019 an interstate family sought help. They had arrived in Sydney on a promise of work which lasted only 3 months, throwing the family of 3 into serious problems as it was not registered for social services. The wife had a part time job which did not cover rent fully. The husband developed serious clots in his leg and required extensive medication. Chatswood helped get his affairs into some order and registered for CL benefits. We helped him get better accommodation and provided furniture. We provided several thousand dollars in goods and medicines as well as budget counselling. In September 2019 he was starting a new job.

A business man of Asian background fell on hard times and developed an eye problem which will lead to total blindness. He has been legally blind for some years now but retains some sight. He is in fear of when he loses that sight. His immune system is suppressed and Covid adds greatly to his fears. He uses a lot of his pension on medical expenses and transport to doctor. We have been supporting him regularly with groceries, bill paying and transport.



Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

Jesus wants his disciples to be recognized by the way they treat one another: The way believers treat one another should be noticeably different from the way nonbelievers treat one another. Selfless love is the difference. For Catholics, charity—another word for love—is one of the three theological virtues. The other two theological virtues are faith and hope. These theological virtues are the core values that help Catholics mature in their relationship with God and others. As we practice these virtues, we are drawn into a deeper understanding of our relationship with the Triune God.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples—shortly before his death—that they are to love one another in the same way he has loved them. Loving one another is the foundation upon which those who follow Jesus construct their whole virtuous lives: "Love one another. Just as I have loved you" (13:34). Jesus's proclamation could not have been clearer.

As children of God, we are free to live as individuals who love others because we have experienced the life-giving love of God, which has made us spiritually free. When we see these characteristics present within an individual, we know that the love of God is present; we may even use the word *holiness* to describe this presence.

Jesus is telling his disciples that every follower of Jesus has to make a choice, as Jesus has, between loving and not loving (see *CCC*, number 1970).

A plea for your musical help!





Recent Happenings in our Parish





Joint PPMC meeting Tuesday 10th May

As part of our parish renewal initiative, our parish hosted a joint Parish Pastoral and Missionary Council meeting with the parishes of Lindfield-Killara and Lower North Shore on Tuesday 10th May in the Magnificat Meeting Room. As our ideas and dreams for Being Church in the City evolve, we thought it an opportune time to meet with our respective PPMCs in neighbouring parishes, to get to know each other better, discuss our strengths within each of our parishes, and where we can support each other within our deanery.

There were 22 attendees including the parish priest of each Parish (Fr Colin, Fr Jose as well as Fr David). In introducing ourselves, we were invited to share what brought us to our role in the parish, and where the Spirit is calling us, and it gave us an opportunity to get to know one another better.

Dividing ourselves into three groups we discussed our parish strengths and weaker points where we would benefit from support. We then discussed what we, as three neighbouring parishes, could do better if we did it together.

The outcome of the meeting are three areas for joint collaboration that we initially wish to pursue:

- Youth and family ministry that includes music
- Social Justice
- Communication and social media.

Three working groups have been created to discuss how we can take this forward. We envisage these connections will permeate through to the wider parishioners as we build relationships.

Many of us have busy lives with much time devoted to achieving personal goals and demands made of us by life. In this situation prayer can often be omitted as it may seem that


our inactivity equates with lack of achievement yet we know that Jesus calls us to prayer and himself found time and a place for prayer.

When Jesus saw His mother and the disciple whom He loved, He said to His Mother "Woman, behold your Son! Then He said to His disciple, "Behold your Mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his home - John 19:26-27



The Feast of Mary Help of Christians is celebrated on 24 May. The tradition of this advocation goes back to 1571, when the whole of Christendom was saved by Mary Help of Christians when Catholics throughout Europe prayed the Rosary. The great battle of Lepanto occurred on 7 October 1571 and for this reason this date was chosen as the feast of the Holy Rosary. In 1573 Pope Pius VII instituted the feast in thanksgiving for the decisive victory of Christianity.



Near the end of the 17th century, Emperor Leopold I of Austria took refuge in the Shrine of Mary Help of Christians at Pasau, when 200,000 Ottoman Turks besieged the capital city of Vienna, but a great victory occurred thanks to Mary Help of Christians.

On 8 September, Feast of Our Lady's Birthday, plans were drawn for the battle. On 12 September, Feast of the Holy Name of Mary, Vienna was finally freed through the intercession of Mary Help of Christians. All Europe had joined with the Emperor crying out "Mary, Help!" and praying the Holy rosary.

The Australian bishops have long ago placed Australia under the patronage of Our Lady Help of Christians. It is therefore fitting that we turn to Our Lady Help of Christians seeking her intercession in our times of needs particularly the assault on Christian values in our own land and for the conversion of Russia and peace in the Ukraine.

So on the 24 May, we are encouraged to pray with fervour, with special reliance on the rosary, for Our Lady's protection against those forces hostile to human dignity and freedom.



SERRA VOCATIONS MASS



 - d. Dishwashers are provided in these two rooms. If full of clean dishes, please remove before placing the dishes we have used in the dishwasher and turn on before we leave.


