# Thank you for participating in the National Church Life Survey

This weekend we will invite everyone to participate in the National Church Life Survey, held over from 2021. This is an important survey taken every 5 years across the Churches in Australia and it provides a most important snapshot of the life of Christian communities, and of how we experience and practice our faith.



The survey maps the presence of churches nationwide and shares the stories of the positive contribution churches make to their local communities. The results identify core qualities of vitality so church communities can build on strengths, and steward the gifts and skills of our people more effectively

Though this will be an intrusion into our liturgy this weekend, the surveys will be of great help to us as we think through our pastoral needs in the future.

During each of our Masses, after the Gospel, we will invite people to complete a survey form. We will allow 20 minutes for this. The surveys are designed for each individual to complete, and they are anonymous. Our Wardens will collect the completed forms. However, if you need more time you can complete them at the end of Mass and hand them afterwards.

In several months time we will receive the Report of our Survey, and we look forward to making this available to everyone. This will assist us enormously as we reflect on the significance of Being Church in the City.

# Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

#### The Gospel according to Luke 6:17,20-26

Luke wants his community and us to understand that Jesus is very clear about the two paths we can take—one path is the road to blessedness, and the other path is the road to woefulness. The blessed are those who are poor, hungry, weeping, and followers of Jesus. The woeful are those who are rich, filled up, well thought of, and happy. The problem isn't the riches themselves, it is the attitude that rich people often have toward them. A wealthy person who values riches more than people who are poor, or who considers the accumulation of wealth more important than the path Jesus calls us to follow, is a woeful person because she or he seeks and finds comfort in wealth instead of in God.

Choosing Jesus does not necessarily mean that life on earth will be easy. But faithfulness never goes unrewarded in the Kingdom of God. We stay focused by trusting in God, as Jeremiah did: "Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, / whose trust is the Lord" (17:7). Christians who focus on this trust in the Lord—no matter what happens in their lives—will always remain faithful to God. No persecution is so severe, nor any life so filled with everything a human being could want, that a true follower of Jesus could turn away from God. Just as Moses gave the Israelites the Ten Commandments as true compasses to guide their spiritual and secular lives, Jesus gives us the Beatitudes to guide us through life as honorable members of God's Kingdom. These moral qualities identify God-fearing people. Those who conduct their lives in such honor-deserving ways will indeed by honored by God—the only honor that counts.






# **Stations of the Cross During Lent**

# 15th ANNIVERSARY OF APOLOGY FOR STOLEN GENERATIONS

Sunday 13 February is the 15th anniversary of the unanimous parliamentary apology to Indigenous peoples and particularly to the Stolen Generations. The Apology included a commitment to the process of reconciliation. Sadly, many of the targets of this process have not been reached.

Last year, the Australian Catholic Bishops endorsed the Uluru Statement from the Heart which was released in 2017. Bishop Macbeth-Green said: Sadly the Church has not always lived up to our Gospel calling in our engagement with our indigenous brothers and sisters.
