

## Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

As young children, we learn about the Golden Rule: "Do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6:31). Many of us have probably heard it often repeated since. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus explains to his disciples the radical meaning of the Golden Rule: they have to love and do good to their enemies as well as to their friends. This radical way of loving is the mark of the Christian. This way does not return evil with evil but instead returns evil with good.

Throughout our lives, we experience various kinds of love. Ideally, parents love and care for their children with no expectation of ever being repaid in full. The parents are satisfied if their children show gratitude for their parents' sacrifices. Our neighborhoods and our schools might offer a different experience of love, one marked by mutual benefit. Perhaps you and your neighbor exchange the favor of watching each other's home during vacations. Or maybe your neighbor invites you to dinner and you return the favor by inviting your neighbor to dinner the next week. You experience this love by responding with good to those who do good to you or by loving those who love you first.

Jesus challenges us to take love further, to extend love even when we have been treated with hatred and unkindness. The Gospel speaks about an attitude or a way of being that is not based in emotion, is not conditioned by feelings. The kind of love Jesus calls us to always wills good for another, even to the extent of responding with love to another's hatred and re-taliation. Hatred is the antithesis of Christian life. As Christians, we bless, not curse, those who hate us. This process takes us deeper into the heart of God.

Unresolved hate results in vindictiveness, bitterness, disgust, and even the desire to inflict injury. In contrast, Christ's love results in acting with love toward everyone, to bless or to be a blessing, without discrimination.

Love is a decision; it is not an accident. We must consciously choose to embrace a life of love. When we embrace this lifestyle of love, we respond to hatred with mercy and understanding and a refusal to hold grudges or harbor unkind thoughts about others. We pray for our enemies in the hope that our prayers will help them encounter the Christ in us and even become our friends.

This will enable a very worthwhile report to us in some months time. As you can read in the bulletin it is not too late to complete a survey. Please join with me in thanking these inspiring members of our parish community who give so generously of their time, experience and expertise.

**Our Catechists (Special Religious Education teachers) are now returning to their ministry** at our various public schools. This has not been possible for many months given the lockdown of the pandemic through much of 2021. A very special thank you to Maricel Malipara for her tremendous coordination of our team of dedicated volunteers Next Sunday, 26/27 February we will celebrate Catechist Sunday and speak of this important ministry. It will also be a great opportunity to introduce and to bless our catechists.

**On Monday I need to travel to Brisbane on behalf of Bishop Randazzo** who is still overseas, through due home later this week. I am representing Bishop Anthony and our Diocese at the Episcopal Ordination of the new Auxiliary Bishop of Brisbane, Most Rev Timothy Norton who is being ordained on the morning of 22 February, the Feast of the Chair of St Peter. Given that I have known Bishop Tim for many, many years the event will be quite personal for me. I shall return home on the afternoon of Tuesday.







## A letter from Bishop Anthony from Rome

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Greetings and blessings from Rome!

The streets and cafes are a lot quieter from my previous visits here as some health restrictions are still in place. Although I have studied in Rome and lived and worked in the Vatican for a number of years, there is always something very special about returning here, visiting and praying in the Papal Basilica of St Peter in the Vatican which holds such a unique position in the Christian world. The number of pilgrims is growing slowly each day that I have been here, and it is hoped that as people gain more confidence and the effects of the pandemic begin to stabilise, the large numbers of pilgrims usually seen at any time during the year either queuing in St Peter's Square or souvenir shopping in the side streets will soon return. Hopefully many people will start to plan for pilgrimages to our holy places, including Rome, as the Church prepares for World Youth Day in 2023 and the Holy Year in 2025. Might we also begin to consider how as a Diocese we will approach these milestones?

St Peter's is one of four Major Basilicas in Rome, but it is considered one of the holiest Catholic shrines. It is here we find St Peter's burial site. Although we knew St Peter the Apostle died a martyr in Rome and a church had been built over a small shrine believed to mark his burial place, it was not until 1968 that St Paul VI announced that the relics of St Peter had been "identified in a way which we can hold to be convincing," after the bones were discovered following excavations of the necropolis under St Peter's Basilica, which began in the 1940's near a monument erected in the fourth century to honour the great Apostle. A visit to St Peter's Basilica provides an opportunity to marvel at the amazing Renaissance engineering feat, the magnificent artworks and sculptures, sit quietly in prayer in one of the many chapels in the massive interior or to join a Vatican Scavi Tour to see the Tomb of St Peter. I always find my visit to be a moving experience. The Vatican is also the home of Pope Francis, the Apostolic Palace being his official residence.

This week, along with many clergy and laity from around the world, I attended the Symposium Priesthood at the Vatican.

Esteemed church leaders and academics gave rich and wide-ranging presentations – including reflections on tradition and new horizons; Trinity, mission and sacramentality; the challenges of formation; the missionary spirit and the culture of Vocation.

Pope Francis gave the opening lecture and spoke to us on *Faith and the Priesthood Today*. The Symposium has provided much to reflect upon, discuss and share with you when I return.

I also managed to catch up with the Australian Ambassador to the Holy See, Ms Chiara Porro. The youngest ambassador the Vatican has ever welcomed as part of its diplomatic core, Ambassador Porro was keen to hear "first-hand news from home" and how we have coped during the pandemic and lockdowns. We also discussed the question of Religious Freedom which is another hot topic for us in Australia, and in many parts of the world.

I will be returning to Broken Bay at the end of next week. Please be assured that I remember you at Mass and that I have prayed for you, your families and loved ones before the altar at St Peter's.
