Dear friends,

Last Wednesday, on 8 December, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, we celebrated the 111 anniversary of the establishment of our Parish! We give God thanks for the continuity of our Catholic Faith in our neighbourhood and region over such a long time, full of anticipation about our future.

We have our church bell ringing again! On your behalf, a most profound word of gratitude to Mr Thomas Perrins who has voluntarily restored the bell and has it sounding again! The bell had to be removed from its frame which had rusted and a new stainless-steel frame has been established. The rusted clapper has been removed and a special external hammer pertinent to the bell was procured from Perth. The bell is now connected to a control box which enables it to ring at the start of every Mass – except the Sunday 7.30am Mass. Over summer, Thomas will also arrange for the Angelus to ring at 12noon and at 6pm. The restoration of our bell has been a special delight this year! Again, our enormous gratitude to Thomas. Please keep him very much in your prayer, especially as he prepares for his wedding day!

We are also pushing ahead with implementing very significant upgrades to the sound system in our church. As everyone would appreciate this has been a long-standing issue. We are now hopeful that this will be addressed in time for Christmas. You will notice that there has been some activity in respect to this over the last week. The new speakers and software have yet to be connected and programmed but we are now definitely making progress. We are very grateful to Mr Ben Thrum who has assisted us in the most amazing way with this project. The interior space of the church is challenging for a sound engineer. However, we do believe we can get it right.



What a powerful way to complete our Season of Advent and to prepare for Christmas

With the arrival of 15 December, the NSW Government is set to further ease COVID restrictions. We will advise everyone further next week as to the implications of the change. However, at this stage it does not seem that there will be a need to book ahead for Masses over the Christmas period.

This Sunday we have our Christmas Bake Sale! And don't forget our Christmas Forecourt Concerts of a Thursday evening. We will have a very special visitor on Thursday 23 December. The details of these are all in our parish bulletin.
