From Fr David

Dear friends

This weekend we farewell our much-loved Fr Aldrin from our community. Fr Aldrin has been with us just 18 months as a student, a Deacon, and a newly ordained priest. However, he has very much endeared himself to us all by his warmth of personality, his sincerity and by his pastoral companionship. We thank him for the way in which we have been enriched by his presence and giftedness and we wish him the very best as he assumes his first pastoral appointment in his priestly life. We are grateful that he is not too far away for he knows that he will always have a place in our hearts.

The NSW Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill (2021) has begun to be debated in the NSW Parliament. This proposed legislation is of grave concern to us who value life and who affirm the importance of care in palliation as the true indication of our rights and dignity. The termination of life as a form of palliation is abhorrent to us. I urge you to make your voice known to your local Members of Parliament and to join in the "Compassion Never Kills" rally taking place on the grassed area behind the NSW State Library on Thursday 18 November from 4pm. Registrations for the rally are essential and can be made through this QR code



Last Monday evening, a number of our parish community attended our Community Action forum on affordable housing – or remarkable lack thereof - in the Ku-ring-gai Council region. Mercidatis from our parish spoke eloquently of her experience. Our Community Action group will continue to keep this issue before us in the coming months leading to Council elections.



The renovations to our parish presbytery are now in full swing. There is much current disruption to our residence, but it is all at the service of a most worthwhile outcome. All asbestos has now been removed; a new verandah ceiling has been installed, central air conditioning has been installed, the bathrooms have been gutted ahead of refitting, major repairs in the kitchen have been achieved, and the interior repainting has commenced!





Just an alert that from Monday 15 November, access to Kirk Street will be severely restricted. Council is upgrading the pedestrian crossing on the intersection with Archer Street. The work is expected to take about 2 weeks.

Our Gospel this Sunday

Mark 13:24-32

No matter what happens, we need to remain faithful to the Word of God, for even though heaven and earth pass away, the Word of God is eternal and will not pass away. God's Word is the only sure thing. Mark tells his community that in times ahead, they will experience suffering and pain and that events will make the world a dark place. But Mark cautions Christians to never lose hope, the hope grounded in their faith in the Gospel of Jesus Christ, for those who remain faithful, in spite of world events, will be with Christ in eternity.

Mark warns us that as Christians, we will have to profess our faith by the way we live, and in times of persecution we may even have to die for our faith. But at the Second Coming of Jesus, the faithful will be gathered by Jesus as a community to eternally live in the holy presence of God the Father. Mark also tells us that no one knows when the Second Coming of Jesus will happen. In fact, Mark gives us great advice: "But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (13:32). So why worry about it? Not even Jesus the Son knows. We should live our lives each day as faithful followers of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. That is something we can control.
