Luke 1:26-38

On the fourth Sunday of Advent, we hear of God's plan to send the long-awaited Messiah into the world. Unlike various books of the Old Testament that merely hint at how God will do this, the Gospel of Luke actually spells out the plan. A girl named Mary, who lives in the insignificant city of Nazareth in the Galilee territory, learns from the angel Gabriel of her role in this plan. Mary, who is still a virgin, is betrothed but not yet married to Joseph. Gabriel says to Mary: "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you" (1:28). Mary must be troubled or afraid by the appearance of the angel; she is in her parents' home and must wonder, "How did he get in?" Gabriel wishes to waylay her fears: "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God" (1:30). The angel goes on to reveal the reason for God's having sent him: "You will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus" (1:31), which means "God saves." Jesus "will be called the Son of the Most High" (1:32), and he will sit on the throne of his ancestor King David and rule over the house of Jacob forever.

Mary's response is unbelievably practical. She doesn't get caught up in what the angel says about her son's reigning over a kingdom for eternity; instead, she asks, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" (1:34). The angel explains that through the power of the Holy Spirit, she will conceive and "therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God" (1:35). Gabriel helps Mary accept that this will come to pass by telling her about her cousin Elizabeth who, unable to have children because of her advanced age, now finds herself pregnant by the power of God. The angel states, "Nothing will be impossible with God" (1:37).

Relying entirely on God, Mary responds, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word" (1:38). Mary strives to do God's will even though she doesn't know the full ramifications of saying yes to God. She trusts that God will provide for her. We look to Mary as the first Christian disciple because she surrenders to God's plan for her life. She not only accepts God's call but shows remarkable patience as her life begins to change as a result. For this reason, she is indeed favored by God.

On Saturday 11th December, our parish welcomed young people with a disability and their families to a Christmas BBQ to share the joy of the season with them. There were over 20 guests and an army of helpers both from the parish and from St Pius X. The students were a huge hit with the young ladies and the guys who loved being included and feeling part of a shared event. John and Carol Russell were our BBQ chefs and delivered plates of sausages with perfect timing. Many helpers came to decorate beforehand (with special mention of Chet Catapang and Rosetta Kosch) and were especially helped by the wonderful Bolus family. Gillian Hawkins did the shopping for the BBQ and stayed on after preparing the Catechists' lunch to prepare this one and was on her feet for 8 hours straight. Many people brought salads, slices and cakes to be enjoyed. Part way through the meal young James who is 19 with vision and hearing impairment, who had not spoken above a whisper for the past hour, suddenly announced in a loud voice, 'This is fun!'. Karen, a 20 year old young man from Persia with severe and complex needs,

brought his grandparents with him and





enjoyed a special hug from Fr David who had baptised and confirmed him. For the young people's parents, it was a special joy to be able to relax and chat to each other knowing that their children were being kept happily entertained by parishioners and students. The Filipino Chaplaincy contributed generously to the cost of the event. Yvonne Corpuz shared some photos of the afternoon with these beautiful and insightful words: "They say that a picture is worth a thousand words. Here are some pictures of that beautiful, heartwarming afternoon. I wanted to share these as they remind me so much of what Fr. David has mentioned in his homily -- that in our woundedness is the space for both hurt and hope. Last Saturday afternoon, that hope -- on many dimensions -- was so clearly palpable."
