Mark 12:38-44

Between last Sunday's Gospel reading (Mark 12:28-34) and today's (Mark 12:38-44) we miss Jesus contending with the scribes about the identification of the Messiah as Son of David, mentioned two weeks ago in the story of Bartimaeus. It also omits the immediately preceding verse which indicates that the great throng from the Bartimaeus story was still with him. Today Jesus warns about the scribes who, in contrast to Bartimaeus who threw off his himation, like to wear a stole (a more formal outer garment than the himation) and who, in accord with the favour asked three Sundays ago by James and John, want the seats of honour at feasts. These are not students nor ministers of the Kingdom (unless like the one from last Sunday's gospel), for they devour the property of widows – apparently a parallel to the rich man four Sundays ago whose wealth had been perhaps gained in fraud. What appears to be merely coincidental in Mark should raise interest, for Mark in his sometimes' embarrassing grammatical simplicity is nonetheless a sophisticated short-story teller. While there was promise in that scribe who knows the Law is summed as "Love God and your neighbour" and in blind Bartimaeus who saw and followed, and hope in the disciples who after the resurrection finally get the point and in the rich man's seeking, the scribes in general are of dubious merit; they are the antithesis of what disciples of Jesus are to be. It is one of the putative victims of their avarice who then provides Mark's next model: the poor widow who contributes two small coins to temple treasury. Others give from their surplus, but she gives from her "life", literally, meaning her living or livelihood. From this it is easy to find the parallel in the story of the prophet Elijah being assisted by the poor widow of Sidon who shares with him her family's meagre rations.

A strikingly similar idea can be read in the second reading, when we look past the influences from the philosophical world of forms: Christ in flesh shares in the whole frailty of humanity, each of whom die only once, and in his divinity he does not share merely from his surplus but he shares the whole of his very life.

Dear friends

The news of Fr Aldrin's new appointment has come as a great disappointment to so many of us. We were so very much looking forward to him being with us for some time and for us to benefit from his new priestly ministry. However, in a spirit of freedom and obedience Fr Aldrin has accepted his new appointment with acceptance graciousness, recognising the pastoral need that Bishop Anthony has asked him to attend in light of his many gifts. Indeed, he is looking forward to the new opportunity, knowing that he will continue to be supported by the great sense of fraternity with Fr Joey and myself that has been nurtured over this year. We will miss him but we are ready to encourage him in this first appointment of his priestly life grateful for the way in which his presence has gifted us. Fr Aldrin's last weekend with us will be on 13/14 November and he will celebrate the Saturday 5.30pm Mass, the Sunday 9am Mass and the Sunday 5.30pm Mass on that weekend. His new appointment at the Parish of The Lakes takes effect on Friday 19 November 2021.

This weekend we welcome back Bishop Emeritus David Walker to our Sunday Masses and our Tuesday mid-day Mass. It is great to see him again, and we thank him for his availability.

This coming week, our HSC students begin their examinations. Our Parish wishes to support them in a very particular way with our prayer. On Saturday 6 November we come together for an online Rosary, and then over the coming weeks we will have the opportunity of silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in our church on a Monday morning and Friday afternoon. The details of this are with our bulletin. At our Masses on the weekend, we will also pray a Blessing for our students. Do join with us to support our students after what has been one of the most challenging years for them.

Over the next several weeks we conduct our Pastoral Works Fund Appeal. Each parish must contribute to this Fund which especially supports our catechists and our pastoral care workers in the hospitals of our Diocese. Our Parish must contribute \$57,904 to this Appeal in this financial year. This is a huge task, especially given that we have been in lockdown for the first quarter of the financial year. If you can give generously to this appeal over the coming weeks, it would be greatly appreciated. In anticipation, our warm thanks.

Our Community Action Group is now in full swing. This coming Monday 8 November it is staging a forum in the Gordon Uniting Church Hall on the question of housing affordability in our Chatswood area. The details of this have been in our mailout and in our parish bulletin. Do come along and participate in this very important social issue.

Through this month of November, we are remembering all our deceased. There are various ways by which we can do this: by bringing along a photo of those who have died and placing on the sanctuary; recording the names of our deceased in our Book of Remembrance on the sanctuary; requesting a Mass intention for those who have died. The envelopes for these are now available in our church. Last weekend, at our Saturday Vigil Mass, we remembered deceased members of the Madrid Family through recalling the special Peruvian commemoration to Our Lord of the Miracles. 
