A message from Fr David.

Dear Friends,

On behalf of Fr Hien, Fr Anselam (currently in India following his mother's death), Deacon Tan and all our parish Team, a very happy Easter to everyone. In a time of instability and uncertainty we affirm once again the power of Life and the triumph of love over fear. What a joy it is for us this weekend to welcome 25 people into our Church by baptism, and a further 8 people through formal Reception into the Church through the Sacrament of Confirmation. We pray that our welcome of them will be the source of great blessing for them all. It is an enormous blessing to us who witness the ever-fresh activity of the Risen Lord in our midst.

An enormous word of gratitude to all those who have made our celebrations this Easter as beautiful, especially our wonderful and creative florists and our magnificent and dedicated choir, along with all those who have exercised a liturgical ministry over these solemn days. Thank you, too, to all those who have made our Parish Stations of the Cross last Wednesday evening, and our public enactment of the Stations on Chatswood Concourse on Friday morning as prayerful and as meaningful.

We look forward to our annual Divine Mercy Celebration next Sunday, the Second Sunday of Easter, beginning at 2:30pm in the church.

As we gather to celebrate the life of the Risen Lord, our Jewish brothers and sisters gather at this time for Passover. During the week I received this beautiful message from Rabbi Nicole Roberts from North Shore Temple Emmanuel: *May your celebrations and services be enriching to all, full of beauty and quiet contemplative moments, with only the best of surprises that expand the heart and uplift the soul. Through the hardest of times, you and Our Lady of Dolours have been our rock and our refuge - grieving alongside us, praying for better days, engaging in sacred conversation, and being present in moments we felt abandoned. Our world is so in need of the work you do. Thank you for your kindness and compassion. Thank you for being our neighbours and friends. We*

thank God for our friendship and we continue to walk together in hope and charity.

Over the last several weeks a number of engineer's reports on our church building have been completed at the service of the project of its refurbishment. The last took place last Monday, testing the foundations of the building to withstand any future building projects surrounding the church. In a couple of weeks' time we will have the summary of these and the first outline of a costed timeline for the project. It is our hope to have the project completed by the commencement of 2028, in time for the International Eucharistic Congress of that year. In the meantime, we are profoundly grateful to Mr Han Dang for his tremendous work re-building our Reconciliation Room in our church. The new design now clearly allows us the two options of meeting with the Confessor face to face, through entrance on the left-hand side, or of retaining our anonymity by entering by the right hand door. There is a little more work to be undertaken on the room following Easter, but the room is now functional again.

Archbishop Randazzo, now Apostolic Administrator, has approved the celebration of the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite (Traditional Latin Mass) at Naremburn on a weekly basis on Sunday at 4 pm at St Leonard's Church, Naremburn effective from 3 May 2026. The pastoral responsibility for the celebration and for the faithful who gather will continue to be entrusted to the Fraternity of St Peter. For more details please read Archbishop Anthony's pastoral letter dated 17 March 2026 to the faithful on the celebration of the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite. Copies of the letter are available on the table in the foyer.

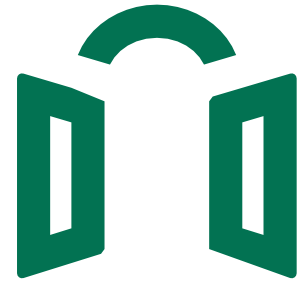

EASTER SUNDAY / A

5 APRIL 2026

CHRIST IS RISEN. ALLELUIA! The empty tomb, and the neatly folded burial cloths, were signs that led the Beloved Disciple to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. In the witness of the apostles, and the faithfulness, courage and love of our fellow Christians, we too have powerful signs that Christ is risen and lives among us. Observing them, our faith cries out: 'Alleluia!'

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

Acts 10:34, 37-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles
We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea: about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

The teaching of scripture is that he must rise from the dead.

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

HOMILY

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES

Replaces the Profession of Faith.

Dear brethren (brothers and sisters), through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life. And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church. And so I ask you:

P. Do you renounce Satan?

All: I do.

P. And all his works?

All: I do.

P. And all his empty show?

All: I do.

P. Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth?

All: I do.

P. Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

All: I do.

P. Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

All: I do.

P. And may almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins, keep us by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord, for eternal life.

All: Amen.

The Harbour Bridge was closed to vehicular traffic and so they were able to swarm over the main deck of the bridge in great numbers. No, this was not a demonstration to show support for respect for life and demand an end to the killing of the unborn. It was a protest by those wanting to support the state of Palestine and its people. They were strong in their conviction and attracted great numbers to march over the Harbour Bridge. It was a most impressive display of their convictions

The procession to mark the Day of the Unborn went ahead on Sunday 22 March with a crowd of maybe 2,000 taking part in this special event,

Again, we make an appeal to parishioners to register their willingness to support the pro-life movement by signing on the form in the leaflet "Life Is for Everyone" which can be found in the main foyer of the church. You can help by your prayer, by supporting only politicians that uphold the sanctity of life, by providing financial or material aid to women who are facing an unexpected pregnancy and experiencing difficulty after childbirth or by participating in rallies and processions in support of the pro-life cause, etc. Those who feel unable to participate in all these activities can at least be able to undertake to say a simple prayer daily for the unborn and to support the other activities of the pro-life movement to the extent they are able to.

One pleasing aspect of the action undertaken by pro-life activists has been the participation in the *40 Days for Life* campaign which involves having people present outside Parliament House to pray for the unborn everyday of Lent commencing at 7 am and finishing at 7 pm, This has been a marvellous exercise in dedication to the pro-life cause involving many predominantly young people making the sacrifice to ensure that there are always people praying outside Parliament House during the stipulated hours. We can justly take pride in their efforts and hopefully be spurred by their example to do what we can to advance the pro-life cause.

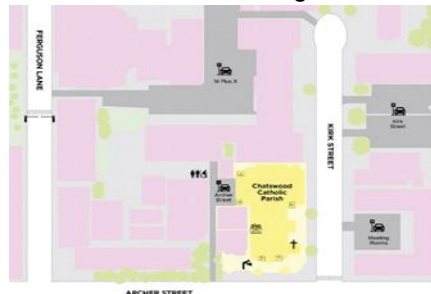
