Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

By his willingness to be led by the Holy Spirit, Jesus remains faithful to his relationship with God the Father, in spite of the devil's cunning. The Church, in her wisdom, has created Lent as a time for us to focus on our relationship with God and on our need to remain faithful to God in our present circumstances. The Church has developed many Lenten practices to help us enhance our relationship with God. For example, some people might wish to incorporate spiritual exercises, such as spiritual reading or Saint Ignatius's exercises, into their daily prayer routine. Others may wish to focus on voluntary self-denial, such as fasting and almsgiving.

Lent lasts forty days, paralleling Jesus's time in the desert. We use this time to prepare for the significant events of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. These events are central to understanding the redemptive meaning of Jesus's life, death, and Resurrection. Through Jesus's death on the cross, all humanity receives salvation. And Jesus's Resurrection demonstrates that he truly is the Son of God, who has conquered death once and for all.

To prepare ourselves for this *kairos* moment (meaning "the right time"), we spend forty days properly preparing ourselves to enter more fully into the Paschal mystery that we celebrate and share during the liturgies of Holy Week and the Easter season.

There are also other ways by which to enter Lent this year. Don't forget the special concert of music, "Ashes to Easter" that Peter Kearney is presenting in our church this Sunday, 6 March, at 4pm. Admission is free! A great event to which to bring along the family and reflect on Lent together.

Earlier on Sunday, a good number of people from our Parish will travel to Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara for the Rite of Election. We have 22 people currently preparing for Baptism at our Easter Vigil on Saturday 16 April. On Sunday afternoon at 2.00pm they will be presented to Bishop Anthony who will inscribe their names in the Book of the Elect—our register of catechumens. We congratulate our new Christian Catholics on their journey and we will look forward to the joy of their baptism!

From Friday 11 March we will have Stations of the Cross prayed in our church each Friday morning at 11.45am and each Friday evening at 7.30pm. It has been customary for different members of our parish community to lead these. Do let Deacon Kevin know your interest. The Stations are a very prayerful way of engaging the mystery of our salvation.

Last Sunday evening I presented an online seminar for our parish on the three pillars of our Lenten practice: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. If you would like to listen to the seminar it can be found on our Parish YouTube channel at <https://youtu.be/fdnDEbJ3hLc>

As we are hopefully appreciating, the sound system in our church has been greatly improved over the last months, with enormous gratitude to Mr Ben Thrum our consultant sound engineer. We still have some tweaking to achieve, especially with speakers in the foyer and choir loft and with the microphone on the lectern, which we are learning to use differently from when the sound was quite problematic. Everyone's patience is most appreciated as we continue to refine things. However, it has been a great blessing to resolve finally what has been such a long outstanding difficulty.

On Sunday night I will travel to Canberra for meetings on Monday. As some will be aware, the Australian Bishops have appointed me as Secretary for the Second Assembly for the 5th Plenary Council of the Church in Australia taking place in July. So there is much work to be done in preparing for this event. Do pray for my safe travel and for my work in this area.

Next week we have a very special launch, Being Church in the City. We will have seen the banner on the front of our bulletin and now on banners on the Forecourt. This represents a very important invitation for us to dream about what is possible for us as a Catholic community of faith in the heart of such an urban, multicultural and vibrant city. How is the Spirit calling us? What might this mean for our church, our community, our entire pastoral and educational precinct? And so, from next week we will be inviting us all on a great journey that will extend to Pentecost 2023! Stay tuned!

A Lenten Message to us from Bishop Anthony

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We began our annual Lenten journey this week with Ash Wednesday and the distribution of ashes which are a sign of repentance from sin. The liturgical practice of applying ashes on one's forehead goes back as far as the eighth century, and while they symbolise penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts.

Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving – often called the three pillars of Lent. It also reminds us of the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert praying and fasting, and leads us to Jesus' death and resurrection. This is a time when we can put our souls before a mirror and see who we really are; when we recognise and own our fragility; when we can reflect and refocus on our lives and make sure we are not in any way being deflected from love of God and neighbour. Lent allows us to give more time to prayer and build our personal relationship with God. We all have busy lives in different ways but a life without prayer is a life without the joy of the presence of God.

Fasting is one of the oldest practices linked to Lent. An imitation of Jesus Christ's fasting in the wilderness before He began His public ministry, it is the most solemn period of fasting on the Church's calendar, leading to the celebration of our most important feast, Easter. We give up some comforts or adopt particular spiritual practices, spend time in self-examination, resolve to repent from sin but ultimately this is the time for spiritual renewal and spiritual growth. Almsgiving is a very ancient charitable practice, and while we should always consider the suffering and needs of others, Lent encourages us to do more than just consider.

One of the central lessons of the cross is compassion, and making the needs of other people our own, sharing our material goods. Contributing to an appeal for the poor or persecuted is true Christian charity. We don't have to look far to see the recent desperate situations of people both here and abroad. This past week the heartbreaking devastation unleashed by unprecedented rain and floods, the loss of life and homes, has been heartbreaking.

And on the other side of the world the invasion of Ukraine, the targeting of civilian buildings, and an escalating death toll. We have a great deal to pray for during these turbulent times.

Now more than ever, I encourage you to reconnect with the Body of Christ during this Lenten season, and reflect upon your spiritual pilgrimage as individuals and a community as we prepare for the glorious celebration of Easter.
