Dear Friends,

As I write this on Friday morning, I have just come from being with Gillian Hawkins and her family in Gillian's final hours with us. Since Thursday, Gillian has been in Neringah Hospice in Wahroonga, having been in Royal North Shore Hospital for the past several weeks. She is at peace, ready to be received by the Lord whom she loved so deeply. We surround her, and Jo and Karen and their families, with our prayer, ever grateful for the remarkable blessing that Gillian has been for our parish over so many years in such diverse ways. How difficult it is to imagine our community without her gracious and generous presence. We know that her eternal reward will be great, indeed. "Now Lord you can let your servant go in peace, for my eyes have seen your salvation." (Lk 2: 29). Rest in peace, our dear and beautiful friend.

It is a very great honour to share that four members of our parish family have received significant awards for all that they do for us. The Holy Father, Pope Leo, has bestowed on Yvonne Corpuz, Brendan Tertini and Anthony Seeto the "Benerementi Medal". This award, originally instituted by Pope Pius VI, is awarded to clergy and laity in recognition of their significant service to the Church. Yvonne, Anthony, and Brendan have been awarded this honour by the Pope for their roles in developing sustainable models of parish synodality especially through pioneering our Parish-in-Council model of parish. This has now gained attention more widely in our Diocese, in the Church in Australia and more widely across the Church internationally. This is such a high honour for them and for our parish! Congratulations Brendan, Anthony, and Yvonne! And thank for all that you

do for our parish community. We are so blessed by your leadership!

And we also warmly congratulate Rita Biviano who has been awarded the Diocesan Medal by Archbishop Randazzo in recognition of over 40 years of service to the Ministry of Special Religious Education. Your generous ministry is an inspiration to us all, Rita! What a remarkable contribution. Rita, Anthony, Brendan and Yvonne have been presented with their awards at a special 40th anniversary diocesan dinner on the evening of Friday 29 May.

Our children preparing to receive the Eucharist for the first time are now in their final preparation, ready to celebrate this occasion over the following two weekends at our church. We continue to keep them in our prayer for this most important moment in their journey of faith.

Next week, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi. Do join us in the afternoon of Sunday 7 June for a time of prayer focussed on the Eucharist, with a Eucharistic procession, adoration, and benediction. And this coming Tuesday evening, Fr Hien begins a series on Explaining the Mass, the details of which are in the bulletin. A wonderful way of keeping our understanding and love of the Eucharist.

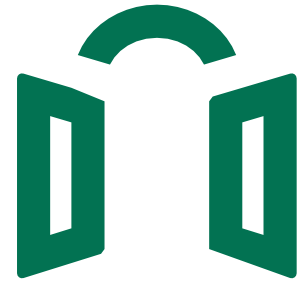

back with full energy for a second set that left our attendees wanting more.

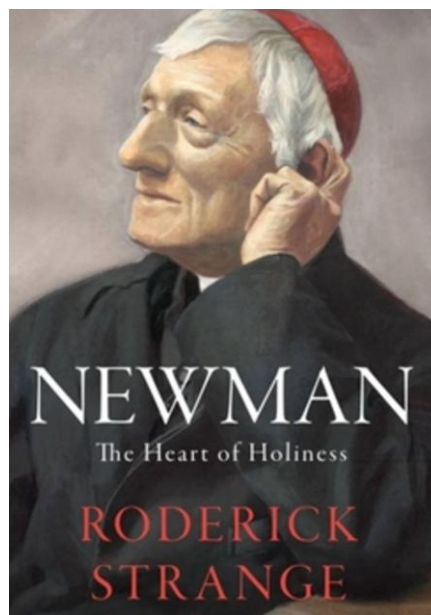
Spiritual Growth Book Club (with Fr David)

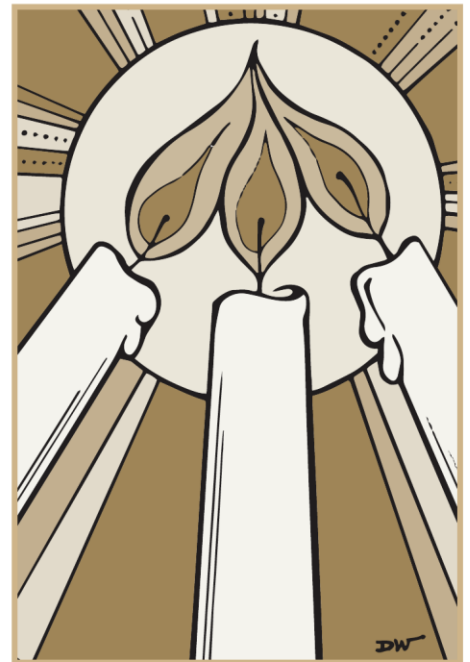

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

WE ARE GOD’S BELOVED

In a world of unrest and at a time when
many of us could be struggling with
uncertainty and loneliness, the readings
for this Feast offer us a soulful soothing
balm. Each of the readings celebrate God
(first reading), the Holy Spirit (second
reading) and Jesus (our Gospel); our focus
is on the Gospel. The passage’s context
is about Nicodemus, a Jewish leader,
coming to Jesus ‘by night’, seeking to
understand Jesus’ relationship with God.
Jesus speaks of the importance of being
born ‘from above’.

In typical Johannine misunderstanding—
Nicodemus doesn’t understand how
we can be born ‘again’ (a confusion
with Jesus’ word ‘above’ and a play on
the Greek)—John invites the audience
(and us) to come to the heart of God’s
agenda: God is in absolute love with the
world; his Son, Jesus, becomes the fruit
of that love through whom believers, even
the searching Nicodemus, will be found
and have life eternal. This is a powerful
witness and clear statement of God’s
intention for our world. We, too, need
to hear this when there seem to be many
contrary and conflicting voices.

John’s Gospel is important for us to
know that no matter what, we are God’s
beloved; God does not judge or condemn
us. This flies in the face of those who
think, wrongly, that God is ‘out to get us’
and awaits to chalk up our misdeeds. This
is so contradictory to the God revealed
to us in Jesus. We, like Nicodemus, find
ourselves at times stumbling around ‘by
night’ as we seek to come into the light.
This is God’s gift to us on this feast as we
celebrate God’s beloved intent for us and
our world.

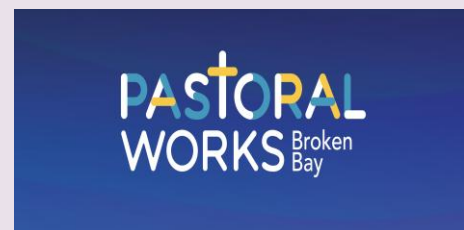

"When I finish my nursing studies, I hope to serve my country and my hometown."

Fr Guilhermino speaks of Oktaviana as a young woman of quiet determination, generous in spirit and faithful in her efforts. Alongside her studies, she helps her family at home. Her parents are farmers with limited means, carrying the burden of daily living costs while doing all they can to support her education. Oktaviana will turn 23 this year and is now in her final year of Nursing. She has worked hard through many hardships to reach this point, while maintaining strong academic results throughout her studies. Without further support, however, she may not be able to graduate, as the final steps toward graduation remain costly, with fees for internship, thesis and graduation still to be met. We are especially moved to help her through this last hurdle, so that she may complete her studies and use her gifts in service of others.

While we highlight Oktaviana's story, we also ask your support for the other four students—Noiza, Rosario, Rovalia and Zenedia—who are also facing financial hardship and are at risk of not completing their studies. 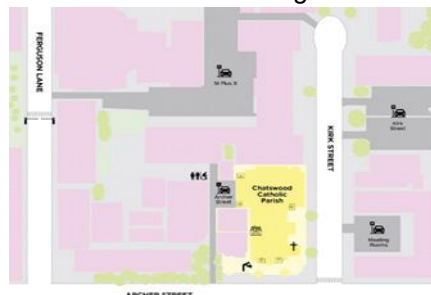
