



#### Dear friends,

As I share last week our much-loved Olivia Lee has concluded her current role with us last Friday. I am delighted to share that Olivia will continue to exercise a presence with us as in Communications and Marketing. This ensures we continue to benefit from her tremendous creativity and passion. Olivia will continue publishing for us our posters and promotional literature as requested and required, as well as, in time, the parish bulletin, and managing our social media presence and electronic noticeboards etc. I express my immense gratitude to Olivia for her continuing involvement with us, for her generosity and vitality have been such a significant part of our growth over the last several years. 
Mission Broken Bay has provided us with a great resource: <u>2025 Lenten Resource</u> | <u>A Promise of Hope</u>. The resource is designed to be used individually and within a group setting. The Lenten booklets are now available.

We celebrate Lent this time, in a Year of Jubilee—a year that invites us to focus on Hope. Again, Mission Broken Bay has produced now some beautiful resources for the Year. A prayer and resource journal is now available in the church foyer. There is so much wonderful information and ideas in the booklet, including a Pilgrim's Passport that can be used in visiting the two other shrines of Hope in our diocese: St Patricks, East Gosford, a Shrine of Hope for Families, and St Mary Immaculate, Manly, a Shrine of Hope for clergy and vocations. Please feel welcome to take one of the booklets, and to use the stamp now in the foyer to mark our own Parish.

On this weekend, we welcome over 70 children preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. Over the next four weekends they will be learning about Jesus' invitation to love more fully in our lives, yet how we often do not love as we might. Then, we have the need to seek forgiveness and to begin again. We come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation with a desire to live in the way Jesus invites us. We hear his word of forgiveness and mercy which become for us our inspiration to sin no more. Our children's example of these coming weeks is an inspiration to us to examine our own lives, and to engage the Sacrament of Reconciliation ourselves in a new and deeper way this Lent. All of us sin; all of us fail to love as we might; all of us need forgiveness from others and from God.

Others who inspire us this Lent are our 41 Catechumens, those preparing for Baptism at Easter this year. On this Sunday afternoon, 9 March they will be presented at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara, to Bishop Randazzo in the ancient Rite of Election with their names inscribed in the Book of the Elect. Then, from the Third Sunday of Lent to the Fifth Sunday they will be presented to our 10.30am Mass for what are called "The Scrutinies" - ancient prayers encouraging them in their final preparation to be washed in the waters of baptism. We keep them all in our prayer, along with several others who have already been baptized but are to be received into the Church this Easter.



#### This Weekend 8-9 March is the Jubilee for Volunteers

This weekend is the Jubilee of Volunteering. In the words of the US Catholic Bishops Conference, "volunteers are stewards of the gifts God has given them to advance the work of the Church, to alleviate human suffering, or to contribute to the transformation of the world." At Our Lady of Sorrows we have many avenues for volunteering, whether in service to the liturgy or to the life of the parish, whether by being a catechist or a Vinnies member, a participant in our Freedom Feast or an organiser of Alpha, whether as a leader of a community group or a teacher of conversational English, generous-hearted volunteers are the heartbeat of our parish. This weekend we celebrate them. And what better time than at the start of Lent in this Jubilee Year to think what this means for you. Where may Jesus be calling you to use your gifts to help others? In the resource developed by the United States Bishops Conference for the Jubilee of Volunteering, they include the following reflection:

When confronted about true righteousness and asked, "who is my neighbour?" (Lk 10:29), Jesus shared the timeless parable of the Good Samaritan, "the one who treated (the victim) with mercy," and concluded by simply saying, "Go and do likewise" (Lk 10:37). This is the cornerstone of volunteering, to extend mercy and love to others in imitation of Christ, who "did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mk 10:45). The Christian volunteer is the one who fulfils the Lord's great commandment to "love your neighbour as yourself" (Mt 22:39) and who follows Jesus' golden rule to "do to others as you would have them do to you" (Lk 6:31). 



Twice a year, we run a preparation program for children between the ages of 6 and 12 who would like to be baptised.


This program includes the parents and child attending preparation sessions together in a small group with other children and families.



# Our Sunday Celebration

#### FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT / C

TEMPTED BY THE DEVIL. The temptations experienced by Jesus in the wilderness were not temptations to moral evil as we usually understand it. They were not temptations to steal or murder or commit adultery. They were far more subtle: to give priority to material comfort, to have power over others, to test God. During Lent, let us take some time to examine our own attitudes: are we giving priority to God or in subtle ways putting ourselves first and God second?

#### **BREAKING OPEN THE WORD**

#### **FIDELITY TESTED**


Today we begin our journey through Lent, the liturgical season leading to the holiest week of the Church's year and Easter. We begin with Luke's story of Jesus' temptation initiated by the Holy Spirit. Jesus is in the wilderness, the place of solitude, the place of 'no place'. Jesus is here for forty days, alone with God.

The scene is reminiscent of Israel's 40year wilderness sojourn in which its own covenant fidelity to God is tested. The parallel between Israel and Jesus is unmistakable. Moreso, given the three encounters with Satan that Jesus has. Each is found in Deuteronomy in which Israel fails in its covenantal loyalty and trust in God. By contrast, Jesus is not seduced by food, power or status. He remains loyal to God despite Satan's best efforts to seduce, tempt and manipulate Scripture to woo him into reconfiguring his loyalty away from God.

Satan was originally a member of the heavenly court (as, for example, in the Book of Job) whose principal task was to test the loyalty of God's people. Later, under the influence of Near Eastern myths and traditions about winged beings separate from and warring against the gods, Gospel writers have Satan take on a more sinister mission-to tempt people away from God. Jesus is Satan's focus here and, though he leaves the scene completely disempowered by Jesus' commitment to God, will return at the time of Jesus' passion and death. Lent becomes our time to be with Jesus, to enter our Lenten wilderness, to identify what seduces and draws us away from God.

#### January Report of our Chatswood St Vincent de Paul Conference

Chatswood OLOS Vinnies received 14 calls for help in Jan-the highest monthly total yet. All but two were from families previously known to us. One new case concerned a family presently homeless, seeking help to move to recently allocated gov housing. We provided essentials , beds , fridge and eating facilities and referred them to our No Interest Loan Scheme whereby they could arrange other needs themselves. The other Newby was referred by Catholic Care and needed food and clothing. Both these families had children with difficulties. Of the other 12 cases, some also had personal difficulties, some had suffered DV and for some we were completing afore-started actions such as supplying delayed white-goods. Generally assistance with food and bills was sought. One particular ongoing case, with 3 children is particularly worrying, involving , DV, legal actions, potential rent arrears, financial hardship, need for transport and health issues. (Your prayers are requested for this family all those we assist). Over \$2000 of assistance was provided.

Over \$7500 was generously given in our Summer Appeal so we can continue to help those who seek our help. Thanks to those who helped.

The format of Alpha is always the same. We begin each Alpha gathering by sharing a meal, we watch a video and then have a small group discussion.








