Our much-loved Gillian Hawkins passed away peacefully on the morning of Monday 1 June at Neringah Hospice Wahroonga, surrounded by her family. Eternal rest grant unto her O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon her. How we will miss her! Gillian was so generous in so many areas of the life of our community. As Brendan wrote on the news of Gillian's passing: "Gillian was an absolutely incredible person in every way, incredibly loving, caring, generous, hardworking, passionate, giving and spirit filled. She made an immense and lasting impact in the lives of so many people, from those who came to know Jesus in Alpha, the kids she taught in schools who will pass on these learnings to their own children, the young people who were lost and at risk but saved by StreetWorks, and of course in all of us who were blessed enough to have spent any time with her. What an impactful life, very well spent, God bless you Gillian and rest in peace, you are already missed so very much." And from Mizuki: "Gillian was such a beautiful, kind-hearted person and a truly wonderful Scripture teacher. My daughter, Sophie, was blessed to have her as her Year 4 teacher and absolutely adored her. Gillian's warmth, gentle spirit, and genuine care touched Sophie's heart and left a lasting impression that she will always cherish." A book has been organised for her family for everyone to leave a message similarly as a tribute to one of our finest parishioners. We farewell our beautiful friend on Friday 19 June at 11.00am. (Please note that we will not have a 12.30pm Mass on that day).

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ - and attend to the centrality of the Eucharist in our Catholic life. It will be a joy to welcome many children to the Sacrament at our Vigil and 10.30am Masses this weekend and next. As well we have the opportunity for Eucharistic Adoration through the night following our Vigil Mass through to Sunday 7.30am Mass. And then on Sunday afternoon the opportunity for Adoration, Procession and Benediction from 2.30pm. A special thank you to Fr Hien for organising these events.

Next Saturday 13 June our Eucharistic Ministers are invited to a seminar afternoon from 3pm to review and refine our practices at Communion time. It is important that we promote and sustain every reverence at the time of receiving the Eucharist, such a sacred moment that it is.

Our beloved Angela Hague will soon be leaving us given her forthcoming retirement. We will hold a special farewell Morning Tea for Angela on the morning of Sunday 21 June in the OLOD School playground following our 9.30am Family Mass. Do come along to express our deepest gratitude to Angela for her many years of service to us. As we have shared, thankfully Angela, however, will remain a part of our Atrium team going forward. We have now commenced recruitment for Angela's replacement. The details are further in the bulletin. Applications close on Friday 26 June.

Lastly we have almost our extraordinary target for our annual Pastoral Works Fund Appeal! We are now just under \$5000 off our target, which is really quite exceptional given that our quota for this year amounts to some \$92,000. Every donation is tax deductible. Might we make that little bit of extra effort in the coming weeks to close the gap? We are deeply appreciative and be assured that your generosity directly assists our Catholic children in our local government schools. And so your donation becomes a very real act of evangelisation.

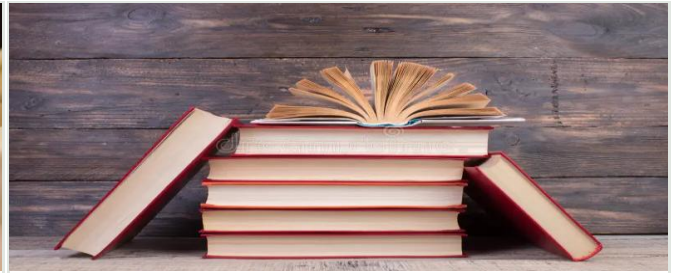

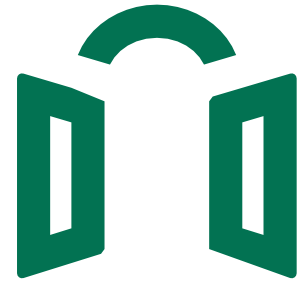

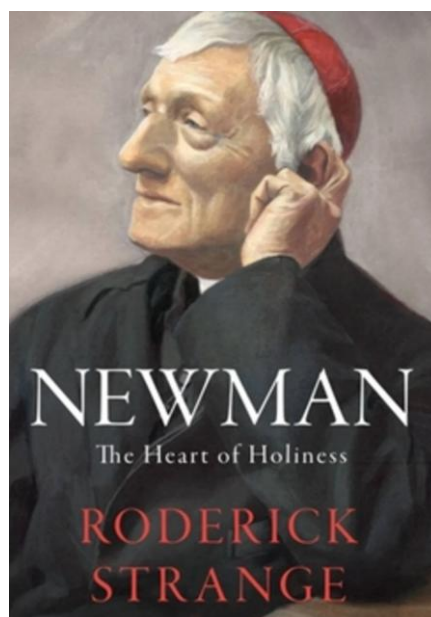
Spiritual Growth Book Club (with Fr David)

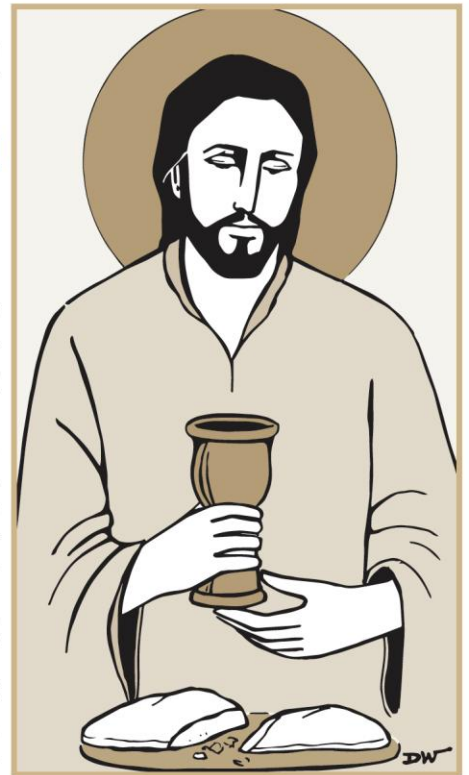

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

THE LIVING BREAD

Have you ever sat at the deathbed of someone you love, or looked at media reports of destruction of people's houses and living quarters in parts of the world dominated by violence, or realised the effects of global warming, or seen the tragedy of life in the faces of the young that flash across our TV screens? In our depths, we desire life; life for those who are dying, for those close to us, for those whose lives are tragically shortened by war, for our natural world, for the young. This very theme is the focus of today's Gospel text from John 6. Called the 'bread of life discourse', this chapter unpacks John's theology of the Eucharist. The final section of this long Chapter is about the life that Jesus offers. This life comes from the 'living bread which has come down from heaven'. This is a rich theological symbol at many levels: it is the life, the 'bread', given to the Jews through God's gift to them in the Torah (the first 5 books of the Bible). There they find how to live in covenantal partnership with God; it is the wisdom that comes from Jesus' teaching; it is the Eucharistic bread received into the community in the celebration of the Lord's Supper.

The reality of this symbol is underscored using the word 'flesh'—another rich symbol emphasising Jesus' presence in its abundance. To eat this eucharistic bread and drink his blood offers communion with him in his fullness, and the promise of a life that will outlive the grave and any suffering and tragedy that confronts. Communion with him brings us true life.

Mass Explained Series by Fr Hien

Week 1 of the Mass Explained Series started on Tuesday 2 June with 40 people gathered to learn closely the meaning of the Mass presented by Fr Hien.



Some of the features covered included:

What is the Mass?

The word **Mass** comes from the Latin dismissal at the end of the celebration:

"Ite, missa est" – "Go forth, the Mass is ended."

The Mass is not only about gathering to worship God. It also sends us forth to live and proclaim the Gospel in our daily lives.

What is Liturgy?

The word **liturgy** comes from the Greek *leitourgia*, meaning "public work" or "public service."

The Catechism teaches that liturgy is "the participation of the People of God in the work of God" (CCC 1069). The Mass is therefore the Church's highest act of worship.

What Happens at Mass?

The Mass is much more than a remembrance of the Last Supper.

When Jesus said, *"Do this in memory of me"* (Luke 22:19), He invited His disciples into a living memorial. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, the mystery of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection becomes present to us.

The Mass makes present:

- The Last Supper
- The Sacrifice of Calvary
- The Resurrection of Christ

For this reason, the Church calls the Eucharist "the source and summit of the Christian life" (CCC 1324).

Who Celebrates the Mass?

Jesus Christ is the principal celebrant of every Mass. The priest presides in the person of Christ, but the whole assembly participates in the liturgy.

We are not spectators. Through prayer, singing, listening, silence, and offering ourselves with Christ, we share actively in the Church's worship.

Preparing for Mass

Before Mass begins:

- Enter prayerfully.
- Bless yourself with holy water.
- Genuflect toward the tabernacle.
- Spend a moment in silence.
- Bring your intentions to God.

The Four Parts of the Mass

1. **Introductory Rites** – We gather and prepare our hearts.
2. **Liturgy of the Word** – God speaks to us through Scripture.
3. **Liturgy of the Eucharist** – Bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.
4. **Concluding Rites** – We are sent forth to live what we have celebrated.

Next Week: The Liturgy of the Word

Week 2 will be on Tuesday 9 June from 7pm in Magnificat Room.

Pope Leo XIV at his General Audience giving Catechesis on Sacrosanctum Concilium.

'The rite of the Christian liturgy is the ecclesial mediation through which the divine gift reaches us. In the liturgy, we are invited to participate — body, mind, and heart — and enter into a dimension inhabited by the Holy Spirit. In order to enter into this dimension, the liturgy is woven with signs and symbols that have a performative and transformative dimension. For example, kneeling is a sign of our worship of God while exchanging the sign of peace points to our ecclesial communion. Further, signs help us to recall the constitutive acts of the Sacraments as when we are sprinkled with holy water we remember our commitment to Christ. As we prepare for the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, may each of us reawaken our openness to an encounter with God by rediscovering the signs and symbols of the sacred liturgy.'

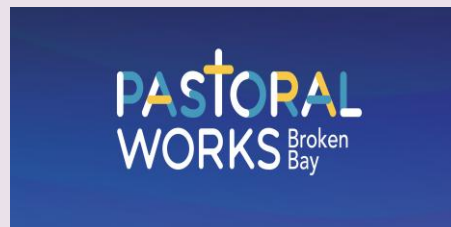

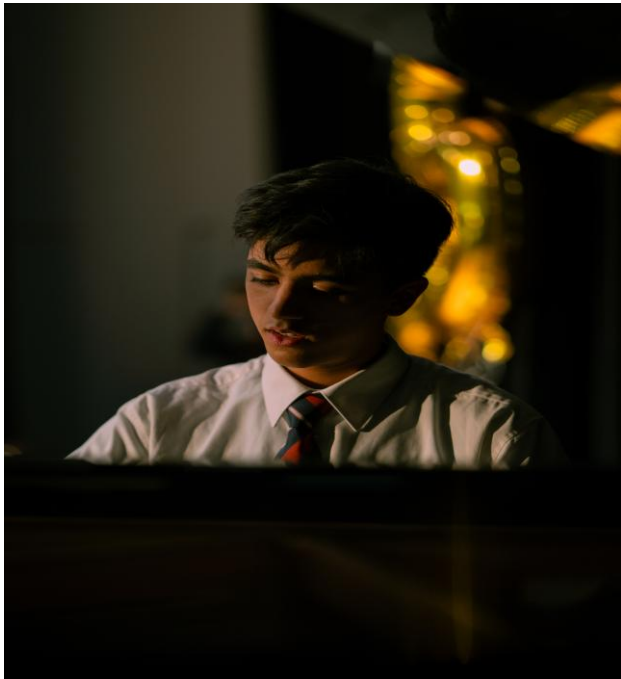

What makes the Sunday 9am Family Mass so special is the people. When you look around, you see everyone, little

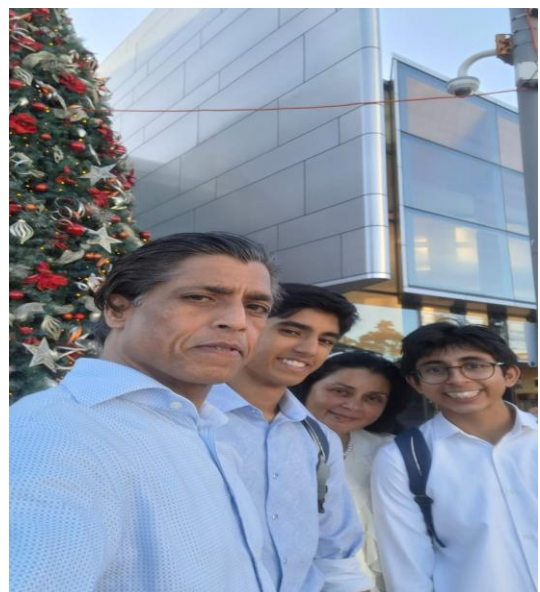
children, parents, grandparents, friends, and familiar faces, all gathered together in the same place for the same reason. It truly feels like one big family.
