Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

Even while facing terrible cruelty, Jesus remains consistent with his mission to spread God's forgiveness. In verse 35, Luke gives us this unique image: "And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him." Luke wants his audience to know that Jesus's death is due mainly to the jealousy and hostility of the Jewish leaders. The people do not mock Jesus but are instead described as spectators (see verse 48). The soldiers join in mocking Jesus—even offering him cheap sour wine. Offering Jesus something to drink might be considered an act of kindness. But the soldiers' words about Jesus being the King of the Jews mock Jesus because no one would offer a king such a poor quality wine.

Verse 38 tells us that the inscription "This is the King of the Jews" was hung on the crucifix over Jesus's head. Inscriptions were placed on most crucifixes to announce the crime of the person being crucified.

Unlike the Crucifixion accounts, Luke's includes the good thief, who says, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (verse 42). Jesus promises him a place in paradise (see verse 43). In accordance with Luke's theology, Jesus's death marks the beginning of the exodus spoken about at the Transfiguration (see Luke 9:31). That exodus includes the death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus. Those events open the new way of salvation to all people.

Starting with verse 44, Luke tells us that an eclipse of the sun causes the darkness that falls from noon until 3:00 p.m. During this time, the curtain in the Temple that separates the holy place from the holy of holies is torn in two. Perhaps the torn curtain is a symbol that in Jesus, all people have access to God's presence, Jews and Gentiles alike. Jesus's death follows the torn-curtain incident. "Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, says, 'Father, into your hands I commend my Spirit.' Having said this, he breathed his last" (46). Jesus's words are from Psalm 31:5 and signify his acceptance of his Father's will. Luke's account of Jesus's death implies that the disciples helplessly and fearfully watch the events of the Passion and death from a distance. Crucifixion is considered one of the worst possible forms of execution because it combines torture and slow asphyxiation. Perhaps the Gospel writers leave out the details because, at the time the Gospels are written, everyone is familiar with the details of crucifixion. Another reason could be that the writers do not want people to focus on only that part of Jesus's life.

also blessed through our Filipino Community to have two new installations in the niches on either side of the church. These are wooden panels depicting on the south side, the child Jesus, *Sto Ninu Cebu*, and on the right side *Madonna della Leche*. The Madonna panel hails form the 19th century. We will create plaques to accompany the installations to record their context, history and donation. A very special thank you to Fr Marek whose engineering and carpentry skills have enabled the installations.

Ordinarily, we would host an Appeal for Streetwork during Lent. This is a local community based organization that assists young people in difficulty (www.streetwork.org.au). Given various factors it was not possible to hold the appeal this year. However, I am very happy to share that we have been able to provide **Streetwork with a \$6000 donation**, made possible through the remarkable effort of Gillian Hawkins and her fabulous team staging BBQs at Bunnings. We are so grateful to everyone's generosity which makes a real difference in the lives of those not as advantaged as ourselves.

Just a reminder about our practice of requesting Mass Intentions. The request for such is most welcome and is an honoured practice. Requests can be left directly with a priest or through the parish office. Given that a priest may only accept one Mass Intention request per Mass, it is not possible to ask for a specific time for the Mass to be celebrated unless this has been negotiated directly with one of the priests. The priest may already have a Mass Intention for a specific time. However, be assured that the Mass will be celebrated at the earliest opportunity.



Presbytery Renovation—Stage 1 Completed!

Do you remember the project we initiated last June 2021 to renovate the presbtyey? We had scheduled an inspection day on which everyone could come and see what needed to be done. However, two days earlier we went into Covid lockdown!

Nonetheless, the project has indeed unfolded step by step, and we are happy to share that through all the challenges of COVID we have now completed the interior renovation of the house! We would love to show you what we have achieved and how the house has been transformed into a warm and inviting home.

We are especially grateful to Mr Glen Worne who has seen the project through as

our primary builder, and to Michael Mercer our parish Finance and Facilities Manager who has overseen and guided the project so generously. **Come along on the afternoon of Saturday 23 April from 12 noon to 5pm or on Sunday 1 May from 12noon to 5pm to have a look.** Everyone is most welcome to call in to say hello and enjoy a cuppa!

We have now begun planning on the second stage of the project which is to build an extension at the rear of the house to provide more adequate living space for our Assistant Priests. We will then repaint the exterior of the house and re-landscape the front of the house. This has been a major undertaking for the long term benefit of our parish and its important assets.

OUR PARISH PASTORAL AND MISSIONARY COUNCIL

met on Tuesday 5th April in the Magnificat Meeting Room. After reflecting how Pope Francis' address for the opening of the Synod in October 2021 might inform and guide our own synodal journey of being church in the city, we turned our attention to updates in our parish, including the approval by the Bishop Anthony and the College of Consultors for the establishment of a Parish Investment Policy.

The main focus of the meeting was to discuss the journey timeline and dreams that have so far been submitted as part of our parish renewal initiative 'Being Church in the City, our Journey together'. There are six stages leading up to July 2023 before we will release and enact a five year action plan. We are currently in the Dreams phase (stage two). Extracts and samples of the hopes and dreams submitted will be continually shared in the parish bulletin, and online. Over the course of the next two months, we will also...

- carry out a census to better understand and connect with our parish community
- feedback results from the recent National Church Life Survey
- discern which aspects of our parish we may wish to explore deeper with further research
- create conversation circles with Fr David in which we can ask questions related to our Parish, our Diocese, the Plenary Council
- form intentional sharing groups in which to share our hopes, dreams and ideas with each other



Divine Mercy Sunday-Sunday 24 April



Divine Mercy Sunday Prayer & Worship Service – 24 April 2022 (2.00 pm – 4.00 pm)

The Feast of Divine Mercy is celebrated on the Sunday following Easter Sunday expressing the association between the two feasts. Easter marks the salvation won by Jesus' atoning sacrifice on the cross and His victory over death. The Feast of Divine Mercy celebrates God's loving forgiveness.

On Divine Mercy Sunday 24 April, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at 2.00 pm with the praying and singing of the Chaplet, blessing of Divine Mercy images etc. Benediction at around 4 pm. Reconciliation is available from 2.00 - 4.00 pm.

The 9-day Divine Mercy Novena starts on Good Friday 15 April and ends on Easter Saturday 23 April.

Feast of the Divine Mercy

The Feast of Divine Mercy is celebrated on the Sunday following Easter Sunday expressing the association between the two feasts. Easter marks the salvation won by Jesus' atoning sacrifice on the cross and His victory over death. The Feast of Divine Mercy celebrates God's loving forgiveness to all who have sinned.

The Gospels are rich with accounts of the forgiveness extended by Jesus. Even from the cross itself Jesus spoke words of forgiveness "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do". The Feast of Divine Mercy beckons a sinful world to avail of that excessive loving forgiveness of God.

Origin of the Feast

The Feast of Divine Mercy emanates from the extraordinary messages from Jesus to a poor uneducated Polish nun, Sr Faustina, in the 1930's. Amongst those messages received by Sr Faustina and recorded in her *Diary* is the promise of Our Lord to grant complete pardon of sins and remission of punishment due to them to the soul that makes a good confession and receives Holy Communion on the Feast of Divine Mercy. Jesus also requested that Sr Faustina have an image painted depicting Jesus as He appeared to her. This is known as the image of Divine Mercy. Jesus revealed to Sr Faustina the formula of prayer specially invoking Divine Mercy and asked that she promote this prayer which is known as the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

For many years however the messages received by Sr Faustina remained largely unknown until extensive investigations instigated by Pope John Paul II while still a Cardinal established the veracity of Sr Faustina's accounts of Jesus' messages to her. The cause of the canonization of Sr Faustina was opened and she was finally declared a saint by John Paul II in 2000. It was on this occasion that John Paul II declared the Sunday following Easter Sunday the Feast of Divine Mercy.

Response to the Invitation of Divine Mercy

Devotion to the Divine Mercy has spread rapidly and this feast is celebrated in many parishes around the world. In 2005 Chatswood became one of those parishes that celebrated Divine Mercy Sunday and it will again celebrate the feast this year on Sunday 24 April with prayers and worship from 2.00 pm to 4pm.



Supporting our parishioner, Stephanie Ho in a wonderful initiative

20 year old Stephanie Ho (one of the senior altar servers) is preparing to run 320km from Canberra to Sydney this July - the equivalent of a marathon every day for a week - to raise funds for a school in rural Nepal. She taught English at this school in 2019 and saw with her own eyes the lack of resources available to the students. She noticed that even though the students enjoyed learning, there was much room for improvement. Over the past few months, she has collaborated with the school and identified its priorities to facilitate its improvement. Her Canberra to Sydney run will raise funds to:

1. Build a mini science lab equipped with beakers, crucibles, bunsen burners, test tubes etc.

2. Install some computers and a projector

3. Provide more cookery to allow for a larger variety of meals (meals were provided to the students during school time)

Every cent raised through the fundraiser will go towards acquiring equipment for the school. After the run, Stephanie will fly over to Nepal to buy the equipment to deliver to the school, while also assisting in its installation. 

The Five First Saturdays Devotion

From our Marian Catholic Action Group

Jesus and His Mother Made a Special Request for the Five First Saturdays

The First Saturdays Devotion, also known as the "Five First Saturdays" is a special request by Our Lord and Our Lady to make reparation for all the sins against the Immaculate Heart of Mary. We should continue to fulfill them every month to console the Hearts of Jesus and Mary and make reparation for the sins of others. The continued practice of the First Saturdays will help bring about a period of peace and the salvation of many souls as Our Lady promised (Fatima, July 13, 1917). On December 10th, 1925, The Child Jesus and Mary came to Sister Lucia. The Child Jesus spoke first saying: "Have compassion on the Heart of your Most Holy Mother covered with the thorns with which ungrateful men pierce it at every moment, and there is no one to remove them with an act of reparation". What does the Child Jesus mean by "compassion"? Compassion is another word for "mercy". In fact, the practice of mercy begins with having mercy on the Sacred Heart of Jesus who beheld our every act during His Passion and is in need of being consoled too.



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Four Practices in Reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

We now know that in order to make reparation for these sins, we are asked to receive the Holy Communion of Reparation, but we should not forget that Our Lady ALSO asked for other practices to be done to fulfill her request. The four practices that have to be fulfilled on the First Saturday, each with the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, as Our Lady asked in 1925, are the following:

Confession* Receive Holy Communion* Pray the Rosary* Keep her company for 15 minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary*

* Each of these practices need to be done with the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Further explanation on how to make the Five First Saturdays is found in the pamphlet left in the church foyer or in the parish library.
