A message from Fr David.

Dear Friends,

On Wednesday evening it was announced that Bishop Anthony had been appointed by Pope Leo XIV as Prefect of the Vatican's Dicastery for Legislative Texts, and elevated to the rank of Archbishop. We congratulate Archbishop Randazzo on this most significant appointment. It is truly a tremendous honour for him. However, the appointment also honours us – our own Diocese of Broken Bay which Archbishop Anthony has shepherded as enthusiastically and energetically over the last six and a half years. We wish Archbishop Anthony every blessing as he takes up this new ministry of service to the Church. Archbishop Anthony will relocate to Rome around the end of June. In the meantime, the Holy Father has appointed him in the role of Apostolic Administrator for the Diocese. This means that, though the See is now Vacant, Archbishop Anthony can still act with all the authority of a bishop for the good of our local Church. My own role as Vicar General will continue over this period as I assist Archbishop Anthony in this transitional time for our Diocese.

We now come to the greatest of weeks in our Christian Year. Step by step over this week we will journey together in our remembrance of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection. There will be special moments through these days: the Mass of the Oils with the Archbishop Anthony, for the last time, at 7.00pm on Tuesday 31 March at Our Lady of The Rosary Cathedral Waitara; our Parish Stations of the Cross beginning in our church on Wednesday 1 April at

7.00pm; our annual Stations of the Cross on the Chatswood Concourse at 10.30am on Good Friday, Friday 3 April.

We gather for the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday 2 April at 7.00pm. Please note that this is the only Mass celebrated on that day. There will be no 9.00am or 12.30pm Mass on Thursday 2 April. On Good Friday at 3.00pm we come to the church for the Solemn Celebration of the Lord's Passion. Then the great climax of our week is our Easter Vigil at 7.00pm on Saturday 4 April at which we will welcome our Elect and Candidates into the Church. We will do this also at our 9.00am and 10.30am Masses on Easter Sunday morning. Please note there is no Sunday 5.30pm Mass on Easter Sunday.

Let us keep each other in our prayer through the days ahead, praying that what we celebrate in our liturgies will be lived out in our daily lives.

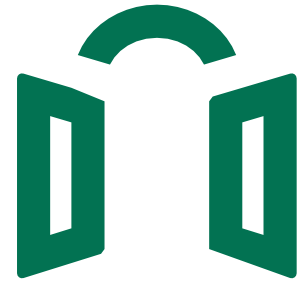

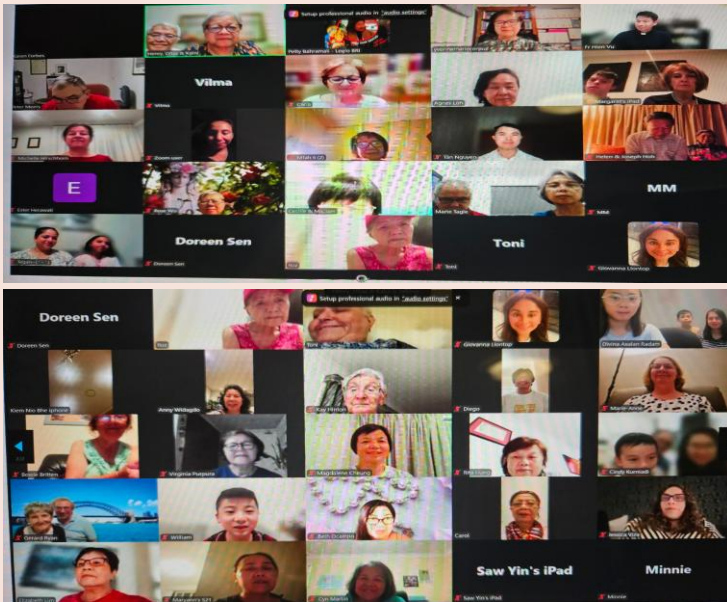

OUR SUNDAY CELEBRATION

PASSION (PALM) SUNDAY / A

29 MARCH 2026

THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. We see ourselves in the crowds who cried 'Hosanna to the Son of David' one day and 'Crucify him' just a few days later. Like Peter and the other disciples we can be fickle followers of Jesus. We should not, however, imitate Judas and despair at our infidelity. Rather, we should look to Jesus who allowed his blood to be poured out for many 'for the forgiveness of sins'. Let us praise him with grateful hearts.

COMMEMORATION OF THE LORD'S ENTRANCE INTO JERUSALEM

THE PROCESSION

The faithful, carrying palm branches, assemble either in front of the church or inside the church.

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON cf. Jn 12:1; Ps 23:9-10

Six days before the Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out:

Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy! O gates, lift high your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory! Who is this king of glory? He, the Lord of hosts, he is the king of glory.

Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy!

The Gloria is omitted.

COLLECT

P. Almighty ever-living God, who as an example of humility for the human race to follow caused our Saviour to take flesh and submit to the Cross, graciously grant that we may heed his lesson of patient suffering and so merit a share in his Resurrection. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

R. Amen.

Isa 50:4-7

A reading from the prophet Isaiah
I did not cover my face against insult and I know I will not be ashamed.

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied, he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

GOSPEL

Mt 27:11-54

N. The passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

(N. Narrator J. Jesus O. Other single speaker C. Crowd, or more than one other speaker)

N. Jesus, then, was brought before the governor, and the governor put to him this question:

O. Are you the king of the Jews?

N. Jesus replied:

J. It is you who say it.

N. But when he was accused by the chief priests and the elders he refused to answer at all. Pilate then said to him:

O. Do you not hear how many charges they have brought against you?

N. But to the governor's complete amazement, he offered no reply to any of the charges.

At festival time it was the governor's practice to release a prisoner for the people, anyone they chose. Now there was at that time a notorious prisoner whose name was Barabbas. So when the crowd gathered, Pilate said to them,

O. Which do you want me to release for you: Barabbas or Jesus who is called Christ?

N. For Pilate knew it was out of jealousy that they had handed him over. Now as he was seated in the chair of judgement, his wife sent him a message,

O. Have nothing to do with that man; I have been upset all day by a dream I had about him.

N. The chief priests and the elders, however, had persuaded the crowd to demand the release of Barabbas and the execution of Jesus. So when the governor spoke and asked them:

O. Which of the two do you want me to release for you?

N. They said:

C. Barabbas.

N. Pilate said to them:

O. What am I to do with Jesus who is called Christ?

N. They all said:

C. Let him be crucified!

N. Pilate asked:

O. Why? What harm has he done?

N. But they shouted all the louder,

C. Let him be crucified!

N. Then Pilate saw that he was making no impression, that in fact a riot was imminent. So he took some water, washed his hands in front of the crowd and said:

O. I am innocent of this man's blood. It is your concern.

N. And the people, to a man, shouted back:

C. His blood be on us and on our children!

N. Then he released Barabbas for them. He ordered Jesus to be first scourged and then handed over to be crucified.

The governor's soldiers took Jesus with them into the Praetorium and collected the whole cohort round him. Then they stripped him and made him wear a scarlet cloak, and having twisted some thorns into a crown they put this on his head and placed a reed in his right hand. To make fun of him they knelt to him saying:

C. Hail, king of the Jews!

N. And they spat on him and took the reed and struck him on the head with it. And when they had finished making fun of him, they took off the cloak and dressed him in his own clothes and led him away to crucify him.

On their way out, they came across a man from Cyrene, Simon by name, and enlisted him to carry his cross. When they had reached a place called Golgotha, that is, the place of the skull, they gave him wine to drink. When they had finished crucifying him they shared out his clothing by casting lots, and then sat down and stayed there keeping guard over him. Above his head was placed

the charge against him; it read: 'This is Jesus, the King of the Jews'. At the same time two robbers were crucified with him, one on the right and one on the left.

The passers-by jeered at him; they shook their heads and said:

C. So you would destroy the Temple and rebuild it in three days! Then save yourself! If you are God's son, come down from the cross!

N. The chief priests with the scribes and elders mocked him in the same way, saying:

C. He saved others; he cannot save himself. He is the King of Israel; let him come down from the cross now, and we will believe in him. He put his trust in God; now let God rescue him if he wants him. For he did say, 'I am the son of God'.

N. Even the robbers who were crucified with him taunted him in the same way.

From the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. And about the ninth hour, Jesus cried out in a loud voice:

J. Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?

N. That is: 'My God, my God, why have you deserted me?' When some of those who stood there heard this, they said:

C. The man is calling on Elijah,

N. and one of them quickly ran to get a sponge which he dipped in vinegar and, putting it on a reed, gave it him to drink. The rest of them said:

C. Wait! See if Elijah will come to save him.

N. But Jesus, again crying out in a loud voice, yielded up his spirit.

All kneel and pause a moment.

N. At that, the veil of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom; the earth quaked; the rocks were split; the tombs opened and the bodies of many holy men rose from the dead, and these, after his resurrection, came out of the tombs, entered the Holy City and appeared to a number of people.

Meanwhile the centurion, together with the others guarding Jesus, had seen the earthquake and all that was taking place, and they were terrified and said:

C. In truth this was a son of God.

St Vincent De Paul February Report

OLD Vinnies received 11 requests for help in February with three of them are new. The first new request is a homeless couple referred by the Parish and who appeared to have lost all their possessions after being expelled from their last squat at the Botanical Gardens, were rekkitted out.

The second new request was from a Persian mother who had been living in the area for some time but who had suffered a motor accident last year, which has caused financial and medical difficulties. (She was also suffering concern for her family in Iran.) The third was a young person, referred by a youth services organisation concerned with vulnerable youth, was given food, clothing and info on local services.

There were three requests who are struggling to maintain themselves whilst waiting for partners to be able to contribute to rent and housekeeping. Another three were suffering with depression. Three of our small "family" of people needing longer term assistance to keep afloat until things turn around for them, were in this February group.

Lack of affordable accommodation was a constant problem for those not in public housing. Some \$5,000 of resources were utilised.

Update – Timor Leste Tertiary Scholarship Program

Through the generosity of some of our parishioners we have been able to extend our Timor Leste Tertiary Scholarship Program. In addition to our two continuing students Palmira and Ana, this year we will approve three new students: Caterina (teaching), Mariana (Nursing), Anastacia (Nursing), and possibly a fourth in Public Administration.

Two weeks ago, we received a request from a parish priest in Dili asking if we could help five students who were having to drop out of university because they couldn't afford to continue. These four girls and one boy were part way through their studies in nursing (3), accounting and pharmacy. Their families are subsistence farmers struggling to make a living. That same week a generous parishioner donated an amount that met our shortfall for this semester and allowed us to approve Fr Guil's request:

*“Dear Our Lady of Dolours Support Committee,
Peace and blessings to you.*

I, Father Guilhermino da Silva, write this letter to respectfully recommend five students who are in serious need of financial assistance in order to continue their schooling. These students personally approached me to ask for help. Before responding to their request, I confirmed their situation with their teachers, who affirmed that all five are academically capable, disciplined, and motivated to study, but face financial hardship.

Some of them have not yet been able to pay their school fees at all, while others have only made partial

payments. Without assistance, they are at risk of interrupting their education...(He then gives a brief description of each student's circumstance and course of study.)”

By giving our support to these students now, we are providing life changing opportunities for them and their families and in doing so we are helping to build a stronger future for this new nation.


