

### FROM FR DAVID

### Dear friends

We have come now to the end of our Season of Easter. Pentecost is the great Amen to all that we have been celebrating from Easter. Christ lives! And in his resurrected life Christ sends us the Spirit, the Spirit that enables us both to remember him and to provide us always with new opportunities of encounter and discipleship.

For this reason it is my great joy to write a special Pastoral Letter to you all this Pentecost. I first wrote a Pastoral Letter for our parish at Pentecost 2021. Now, two years later our journey, Being Church in the City, has unfolded to that point where we can boldly and confidently proclaim our Parish Mission: "Bringing the Light of Christ to the City: We love, we grow, we share." My Pastoral Letter seeks to give our Mission

context but I also share some exciting new implications about how we might continue to journey forward from this point. This has been possible only because of the remarkable contribution of so many – throughout our process of listening and discernment an incredible 1500 submissions were received through all the various stages. This is a sure sign of the Spirit's vitality which demonstrates the remarkable good will and commitment in our community of faith. As can be seen in the Pastoral Letter, though we had to discern what formulation of our Mission finally to adopt, the intention of other formulations has not been lost and wonderfully is now captured in other parts of our parish framework.

I invite us all to celebrate the moment to which the Spirit has led us!

Please do take a copy of our Pastoral Letter, read and pray on what we have to share.

We are especially mindful of our Men Alive conference occurring in Harrington Hall this weekend. May this weekend be one of great blessing for all our participants.

We continue through until June our Pastoral Works Broken Bay Appeal, the pastoral charity of our Diocese of Broken Bay. Our Pastoral works are at the forefront of our community, serving those in need, helping to rebuild and renew families and parish communities and introducing our children in state schools to the wonder and beauty of our faith. The appeal mainly supports two key Diocesan ministries which get little or no government funding. They are:

• The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) – around 650 volunteer catechists taking the Gospel to approximately 14,000 state school children during the school terms. CCD provides a large range of online resources for the students plus newsletters, training, and workshops for the volunteers.

• Hospital Chaplaincy & Pastoral Care Program – again Chaplain and care practitioners visit more than 3,000 individual hospital patients each year. Some are end-of-life patients, many may feel isolated, lonely or fearful; others will recover but are grateful to receive the sacraments; while some are parents trying to come to terms with very sick children or babies. There are probably many

amongst us who have or are facing similar circumstances and are very aware of the time, care and attention offered by this ministry.

Funds raised during the appeal go directly to these ministries. It is a difficult time to be asking people to be generous. We are all facing cost-of-living challenges in many ways. However, our support and generosity are vitally important. It has made a huge difference in the past to many people. All donations over \$2 are tax deductable. These donations contribute to our Parish target. Our own Parish is committed to raising some \$70,000 annually for the Appeal, and by the end of June we have some \$40,000 remaining to raise. Everyone's gift makes a difference.

Recently, we have had cameras and systems installed in our church to provide us with a very professional capacity for live-streaming. Though most people have now re-joined us (last weekend we had over 1200 people join us for our Masses), our capacity to broadcast will ensure our outreach even further – across the world! The capacity gives us opportunity, especially, for significant events – such as School Graduations – and also for weddings and funerals. The equipment, software, and systems now installed are 'state-of-the-art' with remarkable functionality to make the experience of watching what is livestreamed very professional and first class. The operating system is now in the corner of the choir loft. And now we are looking for operators! Might there be people who would be interested in becoming first class operators of the cameras and film makers? This is something open to people of all ages! It may be, however that some senior students, in particular, would really enjoy engaging this ministry? If anyone is excited and interested by this possibility, do let me or Olivia in our parish office know, and we will arrange training with Ben Thrum, our sound engineer who has installed the system for us and to whom we are very grateful.

Finally, Bishop Anthony invites us to a very special Mass and gathering at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara at 5.30pm on Tuesday 30 May, the eve of the Feast of Mary, Star of the Sea, Patroness of our Diocese. Following Mass, Bishop Anthony invites everyone to the Light of Christ Centre to share with us his vision of a Cathedral precinct. He wishes to open this consideration to all of us in the Diocese. Please do feel welcome to join us at the Cathedral for this auspicious evening.

Amazingly, we had 1,447 parishioner responses through a variety of discernment activities. And so, on this great Festival of Pentecost, we are excited to share the Parish Mission that we have discerned together is...

### Bringing the light of Christ to the city

You call me Teacher and Lord - and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you." *John 13:12–15* 

### GOSPEL REFLECTION

One of my philosophy professors told me there were two sets of alternatives at the heart of philosophy, which is another way of saying that there are two fundamental choices between two different ways at the heart of understanding life. The years have proven, at least as far as I am concerned, just how insightful this observation was. The two sets of alternatives are one and many, and being and flux. The solemn feast of Pentecost, the last day of our Easter season, gives us the opportunity to reflect on the first set: one and many. When we look out at the world, are we the kind of persons who see what we have in common with others and see what unites us, or are we the kind of persons who first notice the differences between us and other people: either our gender, or our skin colour, or our language, or our religion, or our social status, or our nationality, or our education, or our occupation? There are so many things that make us different from one another that it is a rare person who is able to focus on what makes us one.

Yet, it is our Christian vocation, given to each of us in baptism, to be people of oneness and unity. Being one is a key concept in John's Gospel, as we see in the great prayer of Jesus, which we find inserted into the Last Supper narrative. That unity is brought about by the Spirit. In John's Gospel the giving of the Spirit to the disciples occurs not at Pentecost, as we hear in Acts of the Apostles, but on the evening of Easter Sunday itself. While the various texts of the New Testament may not agree on their chronology, they do agree on the important point about the significance and purpose of the Spirit being given.

Augustine of Hippo expressed this significance well in one of his homilies preached to his congregation in the early years of the fifth century about how the disunity symbolised by the tower of Babel was reversed by the conferring of the Spirit:

At Pentecost, by contrast, the humble piety of believers brought all these diverse languages into the unity of the church. What discord had scattered, love was to gather together. Like the limbs of a single body, the separated members of the human race would be restored to unity by being joined to Christ, their common head, and welded into the oneness of a holy body by the fire of love. Anyone therefore who rejects the gift of peace and withdraws from the fellowship of this unity cuts himself off from the gift of the Holy Spirit. (Sermo 271) [Footnote: The excerpts from the translations of Augustine's sermons that appear in these reflections come from Augustine, Sermons, trans. Edmund Hill, 11 vols in The Works of Saint Augustine: A Translation for the 21st Century series (New York: New City Press, and Augustinian Heritage Institute, 1991-1997).]

Acts of the Apostles shows us how the earliest Christians attempted to live this unity: it was a unity in diversity, not a unity based on uniformity. Theirs was a unity based on a common experience of the love, forgiveness, and peace of Jesus. In a fractured world, we, as Christian people, must be living beacons of unity. We know we have the Spirit when our actions lead to reconciliation, not division; when they lead to understanding, not anger; when they lead to hope, not despair. We are thankful today for the gift of the Spirit, who inflames our hearts and makes us one.

We open our hearts to the Spirit of God poured out on us. It is the Spirit that renews and re-creates. It is the Spirit that keeps giving birth to the Church. In that Spirit we celebrate what God is doing in us, and what God will always do in us, through us, and for us. In the Spirit, it is never the time for despair. It is always the time to celebrate possibility.

### **3 SAINTS PILGRIMAGE**

Having not yet been on any of the great pilgrimages – think of The Holy Land/Jerusalem, Camino de Santiago – the Three Saints Pilgrimage sounded like a more accessible alternative and thus I signed up, not really knowing what to expect. Meanwhile, as I realised later on, there was a large team of parishioners led by Fr Marek, who were busy organising all the logistics to make the pilgrimage day possible.

The day began early on Saturday morning with a group of 58 disparate parishioners and friends gathered on the coach at Chatswood; it was a cold morning, however, the clear blue sky was promising, as Fr David waved us off with a smile. The first leg of our coach trip was interspersed with a Pilgrim's prayer for the day's encounters in faith; then some hymn singing, and a friendly three saints quiz, which was blitzed by Cheryl on Team-2. Team-1 redeemed themselves in the second quiz, later in the day, perhaps with a bit of prompting by the Quizmaster.

Our first stop was at the lovely little sandstone Church of the Holy Cross, Kincumber, where our group of pilgrims meditated on the travails of Saint Mary Mackillop and the Stations of the Cross. "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom".

The second stop was a short distance away at St Patrick's, Gosford, where we had both a morning tea break and lunch at the visitor's centre there. What a surprise it was when Fr David and Deacon Rosario joined us for mass, during which our private petitions were gathered in a basket and presented with the offertory bread and wine; we were also reminded that the pilgrim's journey is an ongoing one, where we will often wonder, "Are we there yet?". After mass, there was the opportunity to venerate the relic of Saint John Paul II, which is situated at the left of the main altar.

Somehow, the day was both getting colder and time was getting away, and so our driver took us to the Divine Retreat Centre, Somersby. After another comfort break, everyone was ready for the Divine Mercy Hour with Veneration of the Sr Faustina relic. Sr Faustina Kowalska was a Polish nun, who had visions of Jesus and was given the Divine Mercy devotion. She was canonised on 30th April, 2000, by Pope John Paul II. We were all surprised and delighted to see that we also had the opportunity to venerate the relic of St Mother Teresa (canonised 4th September, 2016 by Pope Francis).

The Divine Mercy Hour was very moving, with prayer, hymn singing and veneration of the relics. So, it was a big day for this group of pilgrims from the suburbs of Sydney; new friends were made, food was shared, petitions were made, and blessings were given. It was an enjoyable day, and moreover, it was another few "miles" travelled on the pilgrim's journey of faith.

Thank you to Fr Marek and all the team, who organised everything including transport, hospitality, music, social media, and liturgy.

### Needs a New Home


There are two beautiful wooden bookshelves that have been taken out of the office to make free up some space. They are currently resting outside the PEW area if you would like to have a look.

### COMMUNITY ACTION GROUP

Once again, on Saturday 3rd June, our parish Community Action group is holding a Freedom Feast in support of refugees and asylum seekers. The Feast will include tasty dishes from the countries from which refugees come to Australia seeking refuge from imprisonment, fear and poverty, for themselves and their children. Our guest speaker will be James Atanasious from the Australian Catholic University and the Parramatta Diocese's Peace, Justice and Ecology ministry of which he is the facilitator. James will speak of his own experience as a refugee from South Sudan via refugee camps in Africa to first Tasmania and then Sydney. Last year we raised \$6000 from this event and we hope to do the same this year. The money raised will be shared between the Jesuit Refugee Service and the House of Welcome. # I AM JESUS

When Jesus came down to earth two thousand years ago, He changed the world more than any other person and all of our lives forever. Despite this, Jesus escaped the attention of most writers and historians of His own time and even the four people who wrote the Gospels skipped over nine-tenths of His life.

In an exciting new short course - I AM Jesus - through movie clips and discussion, we'll be taken back 2,000 years to the dusty roads of Galilee, to meet Jesus and discover who He really was on earth.

By using movies, we will come much closer to Jesus' life as it happened. The movies will help us think about Jesus in a new way and challenge our assumptions of who Jesus is.

As we watch the movie clips, we will imagine ourselves standing there, on the edges of the crowd, listening, watching - what do we see? what impresses us? what confuses us? how would we have responded to this son of a carpenter from Nazareth?



And so we need to go to continue to go to meetings. We need to spend time together waiting for God, waiting for a new outflow of heavenly fire that will give us the courage, language, and power we need to make happen in the world what our faith and love envision.
