A message from Fr David.

Dear Friends,

What a joy our Holy Week and Easter Celebrations were! Thank you to everyone who make the ceremonies as beautiful and as meaningful as they were. From our Stations of the Cross on the Wednesday of Holy Week through to our Stations on the Concourse on the morning of Good Friday, and through our principal liturgies so many people contributed. Again, the warmest thank you to everyone. Again, too, a very special word of welcome and congratulations to our newly baptised, and our 5 adults received into full Communion with our Catholic Church, along with those receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. We look forward to continuing the journey of faith together.

We welcome Fr Anselam home after his time in India farewelling his beloved mother, Scholastica. We continue to keep her and Fr Anselam's family in our prayer.

Next weekend, Sunday 19 April will be the final weekend of Deacon Tan Nguyen with us since his Ordination to the Diaconate last September. Deacon Tan has been appointed as Assistant Priest to the Parish of St Ives, effective 21 April, to be ordained to the Priesthood on Wednesday 29 April. However, we welcome Fr Tan back with us on the morning of Thursday 30 April for his Mass of Thanksgiving at 10am (please note that this Mass will be the only Mass celebrated in our church that day). We thank Deacon Tan for his service to us over the past six months, for his facilitation of our Advent and Lenten reflection groups, his participation in our RCIA program and for his

regular sharing of the Word for us. We wish him every blessing as he now begins his priestly ministry.

On Wednesday 22 April for our 6.30pm Mass we will be joined by Archbishop Ryan Jiminez, Archbishop of Guam and Vice-President of the Federation of the Catholic Bishops Conferences of Oceania. Archbishop Jiminez is lecturing in Sydney and he will be hosted in our own parish by our Filipino Community. Everyone is welcome to come to the celebration.

ANZAC Day this year is on Saturday 25 April. We will celebrate Mass for ANZAC Day at 10.00am. Please note that this will replace our usual 9am Mass and Saturday devotions on that day.

Looking ahead, preparation for our Parish-in-Council on Saturday 16 May are now underway. Please do consider joining us on this day as we discern together the way in which the Spirit of God is leading our parish community. On the weekends prior, we will release the outcomes of our Parish Pulse Survey that we undertook towards the end of last year. Registrations for our Parish-in-Council 9th session are now open. We encourage everyone to be a part of this important expression of our community life.

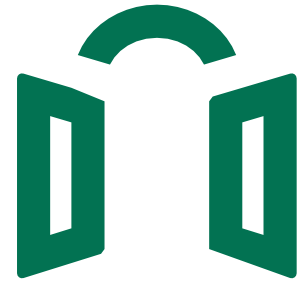

OUR SUNDAY CELEBRATION

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER (DIVINE MERCY) / A

12 APRIL 2026

I AM SENDING YOU. When we gather for Eucharist each Sunday the risen Christ comes among us and offers us his gift of peace. Our celebration gives us joy and strengthens our faith. But we cannot stay inside the church with its doors locked. At the end of Mass we are sent out, commissioned to bring the love and mercy of Christ to all who continue to bear in their bodies the wounds of crucifixion.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING Acts 2:42-47

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

The faithful lived together and owned everything in common.

The whole community remained faithful to the teaching of the apostles, to the brotherhood, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers.

The many miracles and signs worked through the apostles made a deep impression on everyone.

The faithful all lived together and owned everything in common; they sold their goods and possessions and shared out the proceeds among themselves according to what each one needed.

They went as a body to the Temple every day but met in their houses for the breaking of bread; they shared their food gladly and generously; they praised God and were looked up to by everyone. Day by day the Lord added to their community those destined to be saved.

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

He has given us a new birth as his children, by raising Jesus Christ from the dead.



Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy has given us a new birth as his sons, by raising Jesus Christ from the dead, so that we have a sure hope and the promise of an inheritance that can never be spoilt or soiled and never fade away, because it is being kept for you in the heavens. Through your faith, God's power will guard you until the salvation which had been prepared is revealed at the end of time. This is a cause of great joy for you, even though you may for a short time have to bear being plagued by all sorts of trials; so that, when Jesus Christ is revealed, your faith will have been tested and proved like gold – only it is more precious than gold, which is corruptible even though it bears testing by fire – and then you will have praise and glory and honour. You did not see him, yet you love him; and still without seeing him, you are already filled with joy so glorious that it cannot be described, because you believe; and you are sure of the end to which your faith looks forward, that is, the salvation of your souls.

After eight days, Jesus came in and stood among them.

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to

them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me,
so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:
'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,
they are forgiven;
for those whose sins you retain,
they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord,' he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you,' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him;

'You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

THE GIFT OF PEACE

Today is the extension of Easter Sunday. It is such an important and central feast in our Liturgical calendar that we celebrate it for a whole week, and Easter itself, over six weeks. Today's Gospel from John is the appearance of the Risen Jesus to his frightened disciples. They have locked themselves in a room for fear of the religious authorities, that what happened to Jesus might also happen to them. To their surprise, the Risen One stands in their midst.

Three things now take place. First, Jesus speaks. His first words are 'Peace be with you.' These words gifted to John's audience are also gifted to us: the gift of peace, of 'shalom', heals all division. Second, Jesus sends his frightened disciples, now filled with joy, John notes, on mission. Their mission is the same as that of Jesus, 'As the Father sent me, so I send you.' And third, he breathes on the disciples. Jesus' breath, the symbolic presence of God's life and Holy Spirit, empowers the disciples to accomplish their Easter mission.

The final part of the Gospel is taken up with Thomas, his incredulity at the presence of the Risen Jesus reported to him by the others. When he is finally reconnected to the community of disciples—and this is the point of the story—Thomas, too, comes to Easter faith, declaring Jesus, 'My Lord and my God'. This beautiful Gospel underscores for us the presence of the Risen One amid our fears, his empowering of us, and our need to be always connected to our discipleship communities.

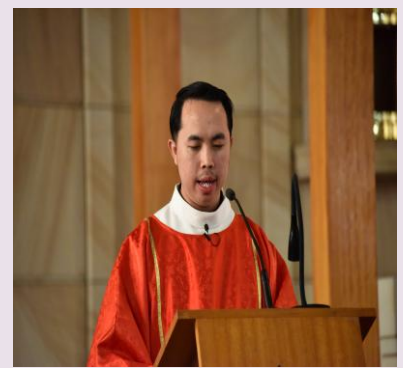

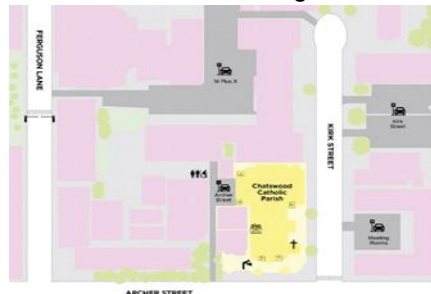
