I cannot express deeply enough our gratitude to all those who enabled our Easter ceremonies to be as beautiful last weekend. So many people worked in the background and during our liturgies to render them as meaningful – our flower people, our musicians and singers, our altar servers, readers, wardens, our hospitality team. To them all we say a very big **THANK YOU!** How encouraging it was to have such large numbers join us for each of our events: between the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday morning alone we had in excess of 2000 people with us. And again, we thank our younger members for the magnificent presentation of the Stations of the Cross on the Chatswood Concourse on the morning of Good Friday. This was the first time we had done this, and all agreed it was so very effective. We will now do this annually. May the light of Easter not dim as we go forward into its Season culminating in Pentecost in May!

On Monday 8 April, we are piloting a new initiative – a parish retreat day for the Catholic children in our parish primary school. Our parish team has been working with the school leadership and staff to offer our Catholic children at the school a

unique opportunity to come to know our parish and for our parish to contribute more directly to the children's religious formation. After a late morning session over 2 hours of religious activity and education, we will celebrate Mass with our students in our church in the early afternoon. We hope to offer such a day once a term as we go forward.

This week Brendan Tertini, one of our parish leaders, and I will be presenting at the Sydney Archdiocesan clergy conference in Wollongong on the invitation of Archbishop Fisher. We will present our journey as a parish over these last years and particularly our practice of being a Parish-in-Council. We have a 90-minute segment, repeated three times over the Tuesday and Wednesday. Do keep us in prayer that what we have to offer may inspire others too in the journey of developing a shared discernment of mission. Our own next session of Parish-in-Council will be on Saturday 18 May 2024. Do keep the date free! We are also working with Mercy College and Pius X College in the formation of a "Students-in-Council" that might contribute and feed into our Parish-in-Council. So, we continue to grow and renew – a sure sign of the power of Resurrection.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

"Guess what, Thomas? Jesus isn't dead anymore! In fact, he showed up here, wounds and all, while you were out!"

It is said that truth is stranger than fiction, and the disciples' story to Thomas is a classic example. And for poor old Thomas, he had to see before he could believe.

And to make matters worse a week went by with nothing—no sign of Jesus. If you were Thomas, would you have believed such a tall tale?

Thomas wasn't asked only to believe that Jesus rose from the dead, but he had to base his belief upon the testimony of others.

No wonder Thomas asked for more evidence. Thomas was no coward. In fact, he seems to have been the only disciple to go beyond their locked doors to face a hostile world. No, he had to be sure about his choice to risk his life for a crucified Messiah. Some of the other disciples also had doubts, but Thomas was the only one bold enough to ask to touch Jesus' wounds.

We often focus on the way Jesus chided Thomas for his unbelief, but we also need to remember that Jesus answered Thomas' request! He revealed himself, and ultimately Thomas believed. Jesus showed mercy to Thomas. This story about Thomas tells the story of every believer in the history of the Church. Thomas represents each of us when we say, "I find it hard to believe."

Just as Jesus rejuvenated Thomas' faith, he wants to rejuvenate ours when we are caught up in doubt. He wants us to be like Thomas—a people who overcome our very human and very natural doubts. He wants to help each one of us say, "Jesus, you are my Lord and my God."

Today we celebrate Jesus' loving kindness. On this day, one week after Easter, we are reminded why Jesus rose from the dead: to shower the world with divine mercy.

Now, unless we reject him outright, he will never deny us. In a way, we are in a similar position as Thomas. We too have to trust other people's ancient testimony about Jesus. Such trust is important, but it is not enough. We also need to "see" Jesus for ourselves so that our faith will spring to life in a transforming way. We need to be convinced in our hearts as well as in our heads.

In the second reading John tells us that "Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ has been begotten by God." Last week you, and your relatives, showed that even though you haven't seen Jesus in the flesh, you were filled with the joy of Easter so that all our liturgies were filled to overflowing. So remember that Jesus is eager to reveal himself to us, even if it is not in the physical way he did for Thomas. If we unlock our minds and hearts, he can show himself to us through his creation or through Scripture and prayer or through the kindness of others. Anything is possible when we are open to his presence!

This is the miracle of divine mercy: It is available to all of us right now. It is a free and boundless gift from our Father. He has prepared a banquet hall for us, and he invites us all to come. With bold and eager hearts, not allowing unbelief to keep us away, we can enter in and receive all that he has for us. God's mercy is a fresh, ever-rushing river.

Jesus is inviting us today to immerse ourselves in his cleansing tide. How great is the love that God lavishes on his children! His mercy is given freely.

So today and all week long, proclaim these four precious words. "My Lord and my God." Then watch to see how his grace will help you believe even more.

VINNIES CHATSWOOD MARCH REPORT

In March we addressed 8 requests for help of which 3 were from people previously unknown to us. Two of the new cases involved furnishing of new accommodation. The third was more difficult involving family breakup, abuse and financial difficulties-assistance of advice, food and clothing was provided.



The remainder of the requests were for removal assistance, food, furniture and medical expenses.

We declined to assist one person who has been frequently helped in the past and should be able to meet his own needs; he had refused budgeting advice. Expenditure of some \$1400 was incurred.

A reading from the first letter of St John Anyone begotten by God has already overcome the world.

We can be sure that we love God's children if we love God himself and do what he has commanded us; this is what loving God is – keeping his commandments; and his commandments are not difficult, because anyone who has been begotten by God has already overcome the world; this is the victory over the world – our faith. Who can overcome the world? Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God; Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only, but with water and blood; with the Spirit as another witness – since the Spirit is the truth.

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me,

so am I sending you,'

After saying this he breathed on them and

said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord,' he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you,' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him;

'You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

RADICAL TRANSFORMATION

As we bask in the light of resurrection, today we see two witnesses to the resurrection, and the transformation of lives.

The first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles, the second volume attributed to Luke, and it presents to us a changed way of living. Firstly, the whole group of believers are described as 'of one heart and soul' (v. 32). The apostles appear as testifying with great power to the resurrection and 'great grace was upon them all' (v. 33). The remarkable addition here is that they shared everything in common, sold property and distributed funds so no-one was in need (v. 34-35). This radical transformation of their way of life is not a defining feature of our communities today, even though adopted by many religious congregations throughout the Church's history. While not diminishing the great charitable works operating today, this way of life remains a challenge to us in a world where rich become richer and poor increase in number and poverty.

In juxtaposition to the Acts account, the Gospel outlines the appearance of Jesus among the apostles and the repetition of 'Peace be with you' (vv.19, 21). In this gathering behind closed doors, Jesus tells the apostles that he is sending them out. He breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, commissioning them. Eight days later in the same room Jesus arrives saying once again 'Peace be with you' (v. 26) and here is the experience of the doubting Thomas, forever recorded for anyone who might doubt that the resurrection happened and is real.

How will our lives be transformed by the resurrection?
