You are warmly invited to join a combined celebration of the feasts of St Patrick and St Joseph on 19 March 2022 after the 5:30 PM Mass.

For the first time in the parish we are celebrating the tradition of the "St. Joseph Table" of food (" Tavola di San Giuseppe") has its origins from Italy, in particular Sicily, and is celebrated on Saint Joseph's Day, March 19 in Italy which is also Father's Day. Legends from the Middle Ages attributed the end of a devastating drought to a prayer-devotion that the Sicilian people made to St. Joseph. This celebration is a symbolic "thank you" and renewal of the Sicilian people's devotion to Saint Joseph.

The bread on "St Joseph Table" will be blessed in Church after the Mass and then shared at the forecourt. If you own statues of St Patrick and/or St Joseph, you can bring them to be blessed as well.

After the blessing, we proceed to the forecourt to continue the celebration with live music (maybe dancing) and sharing of Irish and Italian food.

# Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

As the passage opens, Jesus takes Peter, John, and James off by themselves to the top of a mountain to pray. During Jesus's prayer, "the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white" (9:29). In the Scriptures, white garments often symbolize joy and celebration. The disciples next observe Jesus's conversing with Moses and Elijah about the future events in Jerusalem. As the one who had received the Ten Commandments on the top of Mount Sinai, Moses symbolizes the Law. Elijah, represents the prophets (see 1 Kings 19:8–13.) The Transfiguration shows us Jesus as the successor of Moses and Elijah; he is the ultimate fulfillment of the Law and of the prophets. Luke makes another important point: the conversation Jesus has with Moses and Elijah is about how Jesus will have to suffer and die in Jerusalem. Jesus's Passion, death, and Resurrection in Jerusalem are the center of this story of Jesus, the Son of God.

As Moses and Elijah leave, Peter speaks out, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" (9:33). Peter wants to prolong the glorious moment. The story continues, "While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them" (9:34). Luke makes the connection between that moment and the cloud that had shrouded Mount Sinai when Moses received the Ten Commandments. The voice of God the Father proclaims, "This is my Son, my Chosen, listen to him!" (9:35). God's words make it clear that Jesus, the Son of God, is higher in stature than even Moses or Elijah. In a dynamic way, God is revealing the true nature of Jesus, both God and human, to the three disciples. Luke tells us that Peter, John, and James do not tell anyone about their experience at that time. Only after the death and Resurrection of Jesus do they have a context for sharing that experience of Jesus.

# From Fr David cont'd

It is rather remarkable that our own parish site sustained next to no damage through the torrential rain of last week. However, we did get water damage in the northern transept through open windows. We have had to remove the carpet along the northern windows and return the area to floorboards until such time as the timber dries out. It is unlikely that we will recarpet this area, given that carpet underneath windows is not such a good idea. However, how we might address this area in the longer term will be something for us to consider as we think through our best we can refurbish our church in its 2nd century.

In the meantime, we ask that in heavy rain the windows in both the northern and southern transepts on either side of the sanctuary remain closed.

Emerging from COVID, our parish has become very active, reflected in our 16 page bulletin! Hopefully one of the opportunities will present to you with possibility. Do keep in mind our celebration of Saints Patrick (17 March) and Saint Joseph (19 March) with a celebration on our Forecourt following our Saturday Vigil Mass at 5.30pm next weekend. Then on Saturday 26 March we have the wonderful opportunity to come together for dinner again in Harrington Hall, with a Feast for Freedom. The details of both these great occasions are throughout our bulletin.

We might also keep in our diaries, Sunday 10 April. The Bach Akademie is coming to perform in our church. It will be a very special way of celebrating Palm Sunday and entering into Holy Week.

All of these activities are only possible due to the extraordinary initiative and leadership of so many people in our community. We give thanks for their energy and passion which enable us to be Church in the City.

### WHAT IS THE FEAST FOR FREEDOM?

Members of our Church and their friends from Afghanistan, Persia, India and elsewhere are coming together to create an amazing feast of dishes from their own country for you to enjoy.

They will also give you details on how to cook them yourselves at home. You will sit with friends old and new and hear the stories of refugees and how they are making a new life in Australia.

#### WHY COME?

This is a fundraiser for the Asylum Seekers Resource Centre (ASRC), an organisation that helps to feed, clothe, find accommodation for and give training in English and work skills to asylum seekers and refugees in Australia. The ASRC also provides legal representation and advocacy. It is run by paid staff and over 1000 volunteers and relies on donations. It was started in 2001 and has been publicly recognised and awarded for its work in assisting asylum seekers.

### WHY NOW?

Australia has said it will offer additional places to refugees from the war in the Ukraine but only on temporary visas without access to Medicare and without the right to work. They will be without community, without the right to earn income, without legal aid, without the means to learn English and without mental health support after the trauma they will have undergone. The ASRC is the organisation that provides all these services and support through the work of their volunteers. We are helpless in the face of the tragedy that is unfolding in the Ukraine just as we were helpless in the face of the arrests, torture and killing of our Afghan allies after Australia's military withdrawal there. But this is something we CAN do.

# Our Launch Might




On Saturday 5th of March, we hosted a launch night where we officially inaugurated our youth groups (Cornerstone Youth Group and Keystone Youth Group)!




#### The Pastoral Mission of our Diocese






