# A message from Fr David.

Dear Friends,

A very special Mother's Day wish to all our mothers! We give God thanks for all that you are to us, and we ask his blessing upon you! May this day be a very special one for you.

It is now only a week before our ninth session of Parish-in-Council. These occasions are extraordinarily rich in opportunity: they bring us together as a community, deepening our bonds of connection with another, strengthening our faith and discipleship, and enabling us with deeper insight into the way in which the Spirit of God might be leading us in mission. They are a meeting like none other by which everyone's voice can be heard and everyone can participate in the vision and direction of our parish. This time, Saturday 16 May, we have many new people registered. This is very encouraging as it underscores our hope to be as inclusive as we can. We also have some 20 observers from various parishes across NSW who will be present with us, given that what we have pioneered is gaining traction across the State. We give God thanks for the way in which the Spirit has been leading us is reflected also internationally through the Church's magisterial invitation for us to grow synodally, which means growing by walking together. It is not too late to register for next Saturday. Registrations close on Monday 11 May. Do see the details in our bulletin.

We rejoice that this Sunday we celebrate in our parish our first Mass in Mandarin! This will take place at 2.00pm on Sunday 10 May and then will be celebrated at the same time on the second Sunday of each month henceforth. Our Chatswood Catholic Chinese Association has worked very hard in preparing for this inaugural celebration.

This Sunday our annual May Mass attendance count continues. Last week we had over 1700 people with us for our Sunday Masses which demonstrates the vibrancy of our community. A special thank you to our Welcomers who undertake the count.

We also return to our Pastoral Works Fund Appeal from this weekend until the end of June. This is the diocesan fund that supports particularly the wonderful ministry of our parish catechists and the over 700 Catholic students they visit in our six government schools. It also supports our CatholicCare pastoral carers at the hospitals throughout our diocese. Over the next two months, we need to raise an additional \$20,000 to meet our annual target of \$90,000. Your generosity is deeply appreciated.

This coming week, all our priests will be away: Monday to Friday. Fr Anselm is currently on annual leave, and Fr Hien and I are travelling to Vietnam to be present with Fr Tan Nguyen and Fr Huy Tran for their Masses of Thanksgiving in their family parishes. There will, therefore, be only the one weekday Mass celebrated each day through the week, Monday to Friday at 12.30pm. I am very grateful to Fr Andrew Feng for his generous availability to us in celebrating this daily Mass. Thanks to all for your patience during these days. Do pray for a safe trip for both Fr Hien and me.

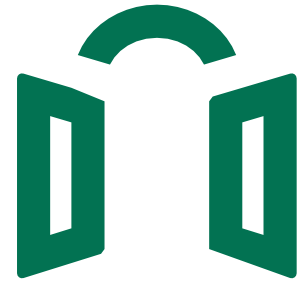


## Family Rosary

A booklet of prayers will be provided to help you venerate the Blessed Virgin Mary during her visit.

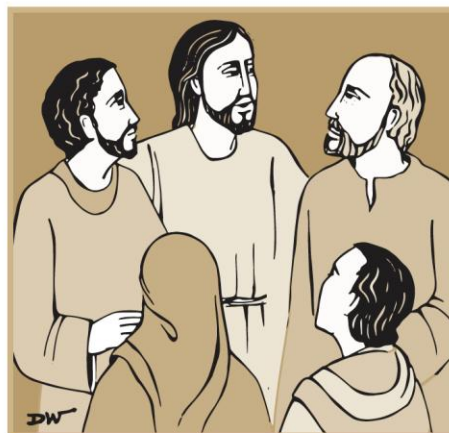

### BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

#### THE SPIRIT IS WITH US

Last week it was worry. Today it is  
about loneliness. We know loneliness.  
We know what it feels like, for example,  
when someone close to us dies. Grief,  
sadness and loneliness can be palpable.  
In today's Gospel, John invites us again  
to draw closer to Jesus who addresses the  
loneliness which the disciples (and, at  
times, ourselves) can experience. When  
we feel God's apparent silence or absence,  
when we deal with death or tragedy, Jesus  
promises 'another Advocate'. This is the  
promise of his very Spirit that will remain  
with the disciples when he physically  
leaves them.

By the time John writes, this is already  
a reality and Jesus' spirit, the Advocate,  
the 'Spirit of Truth', is with them and  
'forever'. They will not be left orphaned  
as the Spirit accompanies them in every  
generation to experience his eternal and  
real, though non-physical, presence.  
But there is a second promise that Jesus  
makes. He will return as he offers an  
eschatological vision, an insight into  
the final days, in which the disciples  
will experience their communion and  
intimacy with God restored. They will  
discover a love that is eternal and carry  
them through those days of loneliness.

This is the promise that we need to  
hear, especially as we grapple with our  
experiences of loneliness brought on by  
grief of our beloved dead or the persistent  
loneliness of life that surrounds us. Jesus'  
Advocate, his Spirit, is with us.



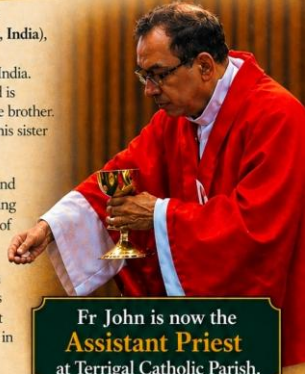
