Dear friends

It was very sad to farewell Michael Tjong from our community last Tuesday morning. Michael's family, especially his daughter, Martina Lee and son, Joseph Widjajo, contribute immensely to our community and we offer them our deepest sympathy at this time of their loss of their much loved father. Eternal rest grant unto Michael O Lord and may perpetual light shine upon him.

Last weekend we completed our annual May Mass count and I am pleased to share with you that over the month, on average, we welcomed 1189 people to our community each weekend. That is almost a 200 increase on last year, when our average number was 1010. So this is very encouraging for us as we continue to grow as a community of

faith. Thank you to all our Welcomers who assisted in the task of the count at each Mass through May.

We welcome Anita Biddle into our community this week. Anita has recently been appointed as Parent Engagement Coordinator for Mercy College. This is a new role in Catholic Schools Broken Bay which seeks to facilitate the engagement of parents in the teaching and learning of the students and that might also act as a liaison between the College and our parish. So we look forward to working with Anita to strengthen the connection between our worshipping and pastoral community and the educational community of Mercy College, both dedicated to the one Mission. Shortly, we will enjoy having a similar role for our Lady of Dolours Primary School, too.

Next weekend, on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) seventy of our children will receive the Eucharist for the very first time. This is an exciting moment in their journey of friendship with Jesus, and for us as a community of faith who now welcome our children as fully initiated into our Catholic Faith. Thank you to all those who have prepared them as well. Our children and their families will be present at the Saturday 5.30pm Vigil Mass and the Sunday 9.00am and 10.30am Masses.

Also next Sunday, being Corpus Christi, we will have a special Eucharistic Hour on Sunday 11 June at 4.00pm. Do see the details in the bulletin. And at our 5.30pm Mass we will be joined by Fr Sam French in his capacity as diocesan Director for Vocations. Fr Sam will join us for the 5.30pm on each of 11 June, 18 June and 25 June.

We are always deeply grateful to those who can support our parish in our planned giving program which supports the financial operation of our busy community. One of the various ways people can support our parish financially is through pledging a weekly donation through a planned giving envelope. For those who contribute in this way, envelopes for the forthcoming financial year are now available in the foyer of our church. Our Lady of Dolours, Pray for Us

O Lord, my God, help me to lift my eyes to you as you are the source of all help. In my sadness of heart, may I know that you are closer than the closest friend to me. Help me to walk with you on the path of light and life. Keep me close to you. Take me eyes off the fleeting pleasures of the world and fix them on your eternal joy. Help me have an eternal perspective on my life, to remember that my circumstances are light and temporary afflictions when compared to the weight of glory that awaits me. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord, Amen.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Only in chapter 3 of John's Gospel do we find the story of the encounter between Jesus and Nicodemus, a Pharisee. Jesus tells Nicodemus of the need to be born again or from above. That encounter ends with the words we hear today: God loves the world, God gave his only Son, God wants us to have eternal life, God does not condemn the world, God wants to save the world. This is some of the richest theological reflection on the divine will and human destiny in the Scriptures. These words go well together with those found in Exodus: God is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in steadfast love, forgiving sin. We are reading these passages, however, in the context of Trinity Sunday.

This is another of those Sundays that perhaps should not exist. Every Sunday is a Trinity Sunday, every action of God is an action of the Trinity, every prayer we make is made to a triune God. Yet, it is all too easy for us to think only of the Son and the Father, as we find in the passage from John about Father and Son loving and wanting to save the world.

In the earliest Christian centuries, there was strong debate about the relationship between Son and Father, as Christian thinkers grappled with seemingly contradictory passages of Scripture: 'the Father and I are one' (John 10:30) and 'the Father is greater than I' (John 14:28). Christians believed in Father, Son, and Spirit because they are mentioned in the New Testament, but just how to preserve there being only one God, and also Father, Son, and Spirit, taxed their ingenuity. Was Jesus truly God? Was Jesus just the Father in human form? Eventually some outstanding thinkers, including Augustine of Hippo, who wrote ten books on the Trinity, would talk about one God in three persons, each person being distinct but not separate from the other in terms of internal relationships: the quality of the Father is to be unbegotten, the quality of the Son is to be begotten (but eternally, such that God has never existed apart from being Father and Son), and the quality of the Spirit is to proceed from the Father (and from the Son, although this would cause disagreement with Christians in the East).

In Sermo 71 Augustine reflects on the nature of the Trinity for his community: 'the property of the Father is to be the author and origin of the others, the property of the Son is to be born, the property of the Holy Spirit is to be the communion of Father and Son, and the property of all three is to be equal to each other'. If that is all there is to it, then it would merely be a dry and abstract theological puzzle without much significance. However, as Augustine points out, the true meaning of the Trinity is that we are invited to be part of it. 'So by what is common to them both the Father and the Son wished us to have communion both with them and among ourselves; by this gift which they both possess as one, they wished to gather us together and make us one, that is to say, by the Holy Spirit who is God and the gift of God. By this gift we are reconciled to the godhead, and by this gift we enjoy the godhead. After all, what use would it be to us to know any kind of good if we didn't also love it?' (Sermo 71).

We are thankful today for a God who is love, for a Father whose love begets the Son, for a Son who loves totally and completely, for a Spirit who unites them in perfect harmony. We are thankful today for the invitation to share in this life. We begin to experience the life of the Trinity through our sharing in eucharist. We taste what it is to love totally and we begin to realise the great promise God holds before us.

I AM JESUS

When Jesus came down to earth two thousand years ago, He changed the world more than any other person and all of our lives forever. Despite this, Jesus escaped the attention of most writers and historians of His own time and even the four people who wrote the Gospels skipped over nine-tenths of His life.

In an exciting new short course - I AM Jesus - through movie clips and discussion, we'll be taken back 2,000 years to the dusty roads of Galilee, to meet Jesus and discover who He really was on earth.

By using movies, we will come much closer to Jesus' life as it happened. The movies will help us think about Jesus in a new way and challenge our assumptions of who Jesus is.

As we watch the movie clips, we will imagine ourselves standing there, on the edges of the crowd, listening, watching - what do we see? what impresses us? what confuses us? how would we have responded to this son of a carpenter from Nazareth?

Starting with what Jesus may have looked like and what it would have been like to meet him on the shores of the Sea of Galilee, we'll then look at His birth, messages and miracles, coming to better know Jesus and taking away lessons to apply in our lives.

I AM Jesus starts this Thursday, the 8th of June and runs for four weeks on Thursday evenings from 7pm in the Magnificat Room. The course is for anyone, all ages and backgrounds, interested in learning more about Jesus in a relaxed, thought provoking and down to earth setting.

VINNIES MAY REPORT



During May the Chatswood Conference of the St Vincent de Paul received 11 requests for help; 7 of these were from people previously unknown to the Conference. The most urgent was from a well educated asylum seeker, ineligible for Centre Link Benefits, who had lost his job, fallen behind in rent and was not eating regularly.. We assisted with rent and provided funds for food and job seeking. Two others were Job Seekers whose

benefits had been suspended; we helped with food to cover the period till pensions were restored. Two others had to change their accommodation; we helped these with food, appliances, clothing and bedding. The other requests involved food, medical treatment and transport. Over \$1800 of assistance was given.

The St Vincent de Paul 2023 Chatswood Winter appeal will be held on 1/2 July. The local appeal is part of the State appeal which began in Mayand will last till end of August.

An invitation for Parishioners to assist will be made on 27/28 June with a reminder on 1/2 July. A QR code and website have been set up to facilitate card donations, details will be available shortly.

The Holy Trinity

Today we are celebrating the feast of the Holy Trinity. "Trinity" means "three" and tells us that there are three Persons in God. There is only one God, but God is a relationship of the Father and the Son (Jesus) and the Holy Spirit.

Each of the Persons in the Holy Trinity is really God, so the Father is really God, and Jesus is really God, and the Holy Spirit is really God. But they are not all the same Person.
