Reflection on the Gospel this Sunday

Luke writes that Jesus is carried up into heaven. As Catholics, we believe Jesus ascends and takes his rightful seat at the right hand of God. Have you ever wondered why the Nicene Creed specifically says that Jesus is seated at the right hand of the Father? Taking a look at a few scriptural references may help us understand this idea better.

In Psalm 110, the psalmist portrays God inviting the king of Israel to take his throne at God's right hand. To the one who sits upon that throne, God gives the power to judge nations. So Jesus, who knows the human condition because he has taken on human form and has been crucified for our sake, has been given the power to judge human-kind.

We read in Romans 8:34 that Jesus, "who is at the right hand of God, . . . intercedes for us" with the Father. During Mass, the priest often says, "We ask this through our Lord, Jesus Christ," or something similar. Jesus is the great intercessor. An intercessor is one who intercedes or acts as a mediator on behalf of another. Jesus is a mediator on behalf of all humanity because he is both human and divine. Jesus understands what we experience as humans, but because Jesus is also divine, he can stand in our place before God. Jesus is the absolute mediator in a way no one else can be.

In Hebrews 1:3, we read that Jesus "sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high [God]." This enthronement at God's right hand establishes Jesus as the true Messiah and his Kingdom as a messianic Kingdom. Jesus is not only the great intercessor but also the one who will judge all humankind.

Listening with the Ear of the Heart





Facilitated by Elizabeth Lee

"Listening is the oldest and perhaps the most powerful tool of healing. It is often through the quality of our listening and not the wisdom of our words that we are able to effect the most profound changes in the people around us". Rachel Naomi Remen.

Loneliness, disconnection, isolation are common experiences for all of us. And we can do something about this. Elizabeth Lee has a passion for fostering human connection through deep listening and for being a listening presence. This program will explore how we can all cultivate human connection one conversation at a time, by sitting and talking with another. Liz will conduct three sessions to develop our intentional empathic listening skills.

Chronic loneliness and disconnection lead to heart disease and early death, increases in depression and anxiety, social polarization, and increases in impulsive and violent behaviour. We are all touched directly and indirectly by the effects of loneliness. This is particularly the case for those on the edges of our families, communities and nation.

While these sessions are designed for supporting vulnerable people – a person living with homelessness, a struggling teenager, a friend with mental ill-health, a parent with dementia – they will of benefit for anyone who wishes to acquire skills in deep listening.

Week 1: Starting with the Why: listening to foster human connection and well-being

Week 2: Being Fully Present: present to self, present to the other

Week 3: Well-being for All: navigating difficult encounters



NATIONAL CHURCH LIFE SURVEY RESULTS

The National Church Life Survey

In February our Chatswood parish participated in the National Church Life Survey (NCLS), an Australia wide research initiative run every five years. In total, 439 of our parishioners aged 15+ and 62 children aged between 8 to 14, completed the survey.

Following on from last week's bulletin, part two of the summary profile survey results of our parish are below. Later this year, once the full NCLS results are produced, we will be able to share with you how our Chatswood parish has evolved over the past 21 years (since we participated in our first NCLS in 2001) and how our results compare with the Diocese of Broken Bay.

Exploring the Faith Course


Congratulations to the participants of the Exploring the Faith 2021-2022 group who have recently completed the course. After getting together (initially on zoom) almost every week for the last eight months, we have come to know the Father, Son and Spirit more personally - through Scripture, through the Sacraments and through sharing with each other. The first part of the course, we reviewed and compared experiences of God through the many faith histories written in the Old Testament. We could recognise some of our own similar experiences in this time! In the second part of the course, we explored how Jesus' ministry is the foundation for Catholic teaching and importantly unpack reasons for why we believe what we believe. We also discussed the role of the Holy Spirit and how it continues to assist us in providing the graces we need. This led us to explore the basis of morality and the nature of sin. In the third part of the course, we explored prayer - our living, loving, inter-active relationship with God. Finally, in the fourth part of the course, we looked at our life within our parish community, and the ministry of the wider Church as part of the universal Church. Thanks to all who participated this season - there is much joy to celebrate in our faith.

The next course, Exploring the Faith 2022-2023, will commence on Wednesday 31st August.

Learning more about our St Vincent de Paul Conference

There are several groups in the Parish doing "good works", and providing opportunities for parishioner involvement.

-Justice Ecology and Peace Ministry (JEPM, formerly Social Justice Group) strives to increase knowledge and application of Catholic Social Teaching; it supports Bourke and Brewarrina Parishes, Streetwork, Maubara Orphanage in Timor Leste, Jesuit Refugee Services and is an advocate for the Uluru Statement from the Heart. It raises funds through Bunnings BBQs and appeals.

-Community Action supports the work of other organisations in the Parish, and has a focus on needs of people with disabilities and those from troubled backgrounds. In conjunction with he Sydney Alliance it promotes better, more Christian decisions by authorities.



-Men Alive promotes the spiritual development of its members and assists the clergy eg with erection of the large Xmas crib..

The aims of these groups are consonant with those advocated by of the St Vincent De Paul Society (SVP) listed in last weeks notices.

What the local Chatswood SVP Conference brings to the Parish is a resource to address requests for urgent help from individuals , families, and organisations such as RNSH, Dept of Health and Lifeline. Emergency help is usually due to some legal, medical , dental or accommodation need, provision of essential furniture and whitegoods. Most requests come from pensioners and visa holders, many of whom suffer from some disadvantage including lack of life skills. Help provided is usually in the form of food, clothing , furniture , assistance with acquisition/repair of household goods, help with bills, advocacy with authorities and referral to more appropriate agency such as Catholic Care , Lifeline and the local Member.

Our main method of operation is through home visitations which is an effective way assessing genuineness.

The Conference draws its resources from the larger Society which is dependent on the Winter and Summer appeals held in parishes statewide and donations of saleable goods to its stores. Chatswood Winter Appeal is on 18/19 June. The Chatswood Conference comprises 5 members, 2F and 3M. Three are ageing and the youngest member is leaving the parish. There is a need for new members (as is also the case with the JEPM)

St Vincent De Paul Youth Conference, established 2020 has a loose relation to the Local Conference. It provides for young people/students to volunteer post high school. Its activities include ad hoc fundraising and working bees for worthy causes and it plans to assist with a Brecky Van for Sydney homeless and visiting nursing homes

From a local Conference member: "I joined SVDP simply because I wanted to contribute back to the community and to help those who are in need. I feel fulfillment and happiness when I find myself being able to help people in need, which encourages me to continue my volunteer work. Of course sometimes I also struggled when I faced difficult or aggressive clients. But this is part of the work and also the reality that we need to face in our daily lives. The good thing is that we can always learn from our experienced conference members rather than working alone."



Join Gai-mariagal Elder and Traditional Knowledge Holder, Professor Dennis Foley





The talk will be held in the Creator Space. Light refreshments will be provided

Professor Dennis Foley will discuss his most recent book, What the Colonists Never Knew—A History of Aboriginal Sydney. He will paint a vivid picture of what it was like for Sydney's Aboriginal peoples to coexist alongside the colonists from 1788 to the present. He will share perspectives and stories of the Gai-mariagal Country, today known as the Northern Sydney Region.

Professor Dennis Foley is a Fulbright Scholar, a dual Endeavour Fellow and a member of the Business Government and Law Faculty at the University of Canberra.

Dennis' matrilineal connection is Gai-mariagal of Northern Sydney, and his patrilineal connection is to the Wirajuri people of the Turon River region.


For our Group Leaders and People using our Meeting Rooms
