A message from Fr David.

Dear Friends,

On this Father's Day we extend blessings to all our fathers and our remembrance to all fathers deceased. May this weekend be one in which we appreciate the vocation of fatherhood to protect, to sustain, and to guide. May the Spirit of God strengthen all our fathers in their love and duty.

We also have commenced our annual Season of Creation which extends through to 4 October, the Feast of St Francis Assisi. This is the season given to us by the Church each year to focus on our responsibility of stewardship for the gift entrusted to our care: our world. We are invited to listen again to the "cry of the earth" and to "the cry of the poor", understanding the essential link between the two. Together, let us think through how we might live more simply and thus more sustainably.

As we will see on page 20 of our bulletin, we are ready now to take forward the outcomes of our Parish-in-Council X which focused on the theme of 'beauty' in the restoration of our church. On Sunday 20 September at 1.30pm there will be the opportunity to hear of those outcomes, and also to meet with our project director, Stuart Cunningham from Project Strategies Australia in order to learn about the practicalities of the project. The project will extend from now until the end of November 2027. It will be a disruptive time as scaffolding and the like move from section to section of the church whilst repairs, installations and painting are all undertaken. For this reason, we will not be able to receive bookings for events such as weddings through the coming year 2027.

Thankfully, we will be able to avail of St Leonard's church in Narrabeen for such occasions, as we might from time to time for funerals as well, depending on the progress of the project. Notwithstanding we are hopeful that even with the restoration occurring we will be able to keep our church mainly open.

However, there is one particular exception to this and it will occur at the end of September. The first thing that we need to do as part of the restoration is to remove any hazardous material on the site. Studies have revealed that such exists under the carpet, in the sacristy linoleum, and extensively under the church floor. This must all be removed before any other works can commence. To this end, **we must close both our church and our office from Monday 28 September to Thursday 8 October.** This period has been chosen given it coincides with school holidays. There will be no access to the church or to the office during this time. Our meeting rooms, however, will still be available, and we will set up a temporary parish office in St Peter's Meeting room during this period. On the weekend of 3/4 October (the long weekend), we will celebrate Sunday Masses in Harrington Hall.

Over the coming weeks we will be able to share more details on the arrangements we will put in place to support us over this particular period. We are now ready to embark upon this very significant project which is very exciting! However, it will also require our patience and forbearance over the coming twelve months or so, and I express my gratitude to us all in anticipation.



We acknowledge the Cammeraygal People of the Eora Nation, custodians of the land on which our parish stands and we commit ourselves to the ongoing journey of national reconciliation.

As a Parish of Catholic Faith we are committed to ensuring always a community of safety and care for all, especially for children, and those who are vulnerable.

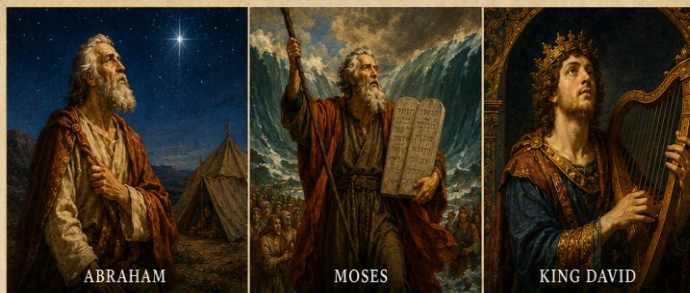

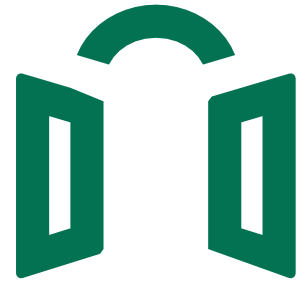

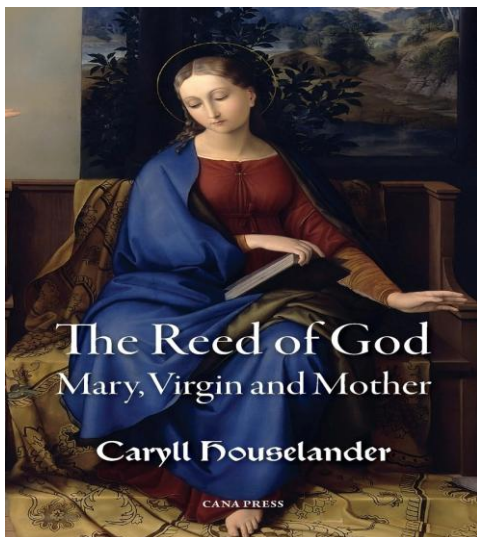


Book Club

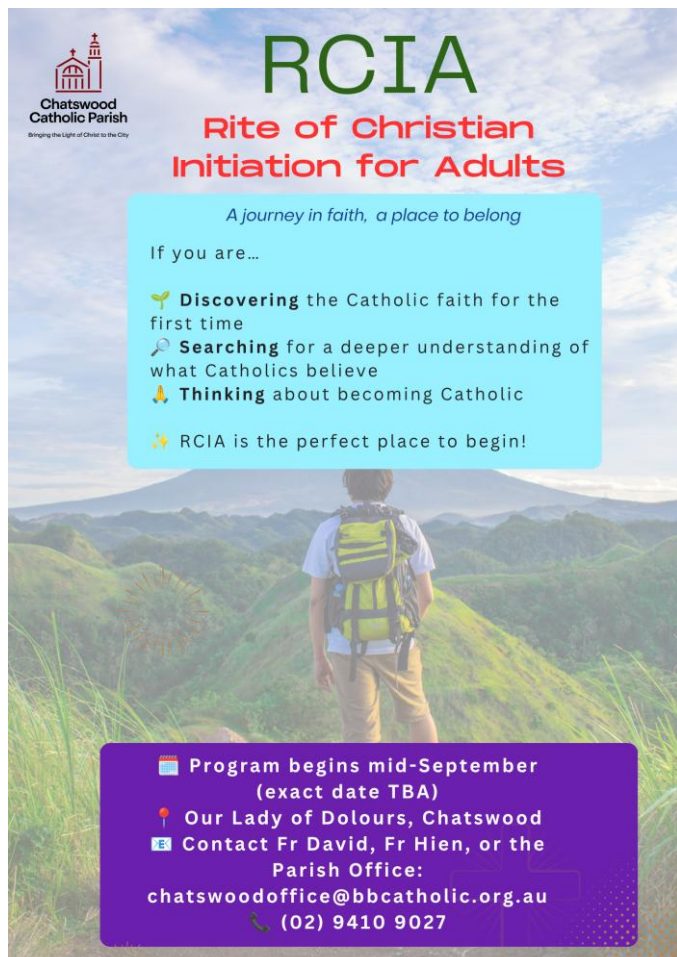

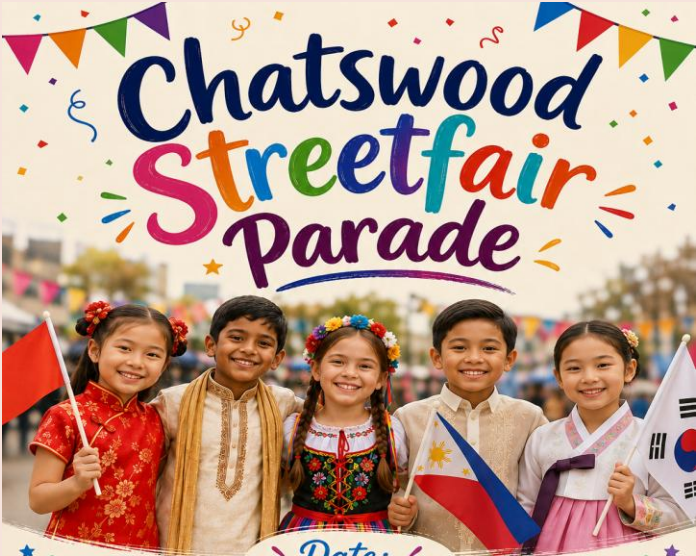

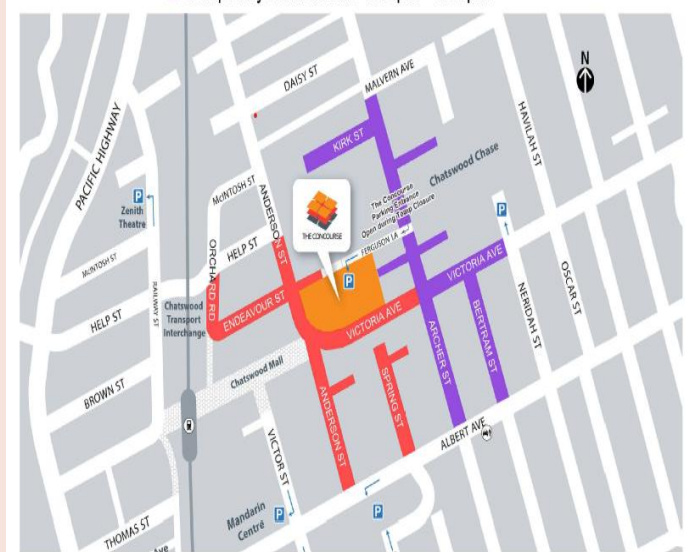

OUR SUNDAY CELEBRATION

TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME / A

6 SEPTEMBER 2026

I SHALL BE THERE WITH THEM. Every Christian community experiences difficulties in one form or another. Misunderstandings occur, divisions arise. Today's Gospel reminds us that Christ is present in our communities even when they are broken, when only two or three meet in his name. Healing occurs when we seek to embody in our communities the qualities of Christ, especially forgiveness and mutual love.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

SEEK RECONCILIATION

Last Sunday reminded us that following Jesus is not free from struggle. Challenges, even misunderstandings, will be part of the disciple's vocation. This Sunday, the evangelist moves deeper to highlight further concerns that beset the community of disciples—internal struggles, tensions, even rejection.

The evangelist draws on the wisdom of Jesus to address these realities and suggests a three-step process towards reconciliation. It begins with personal dialogue. The one wronged seeks to invite the wrongdoer to reconciliation. If this fails, witnesses to what has happened verify the authenticity of the issues and encourage resolution. If this fails then the whole faith community, the *ekklesia*, witness to the wrong that has created the division, inviting the wrong doer to a change of heart and reconciliation.

Even if this third step fails then Matthew advises to treat the wrong doer 'like a pagan or tax collector.' In other words, as Jesus welcomed strangers and invited a tax collector to become one of his disciples, the door must always be left open. The final words of the Gospel contain Jesus' assurance that he is always present to even a small discipleship gathering, of even two or three, no matter what they are dealing with.

Today's Gospel is as relevant for our day as it was in the time of Matthew. No faith community is tension free. Disagreements arise and, sometimes, are not easily resolved by faith leaders. Rather than gossiping or character assassination, personal approaches that invite conflict resolution and community building are essential. In everything, Jesus is present.

Renewing our Church Building

Q&A Session | Sunday 20 September

Since its opening in August 1921, our church building has experienced two renewals – a significant expansion in 1961, and repainting and carpeting in 1978. Now, 48 years later we are those who have discovered ourselves with the opportunity for its further renewal.

Does our church need renewing? It could be said, it's beautiful as it is, why change it? However, renewal doesn't mean changing things radically. It means seeking to make our church as beautiful as it can be, not just for now but for the next 50 years when a new generation will be faced with the same question again.

The renewal of our church building is both significant and necessary; indeed there is much to turn our attention to over the coming 15 months, including...

- After 48 years, the walls need repainting.
- The electrical wiring through the building is chaotic and dangerous.
- Both our lighting and sound need great improvement.
- The fans (cooling and heating) don't work well.
- The window frames need much cleaning and repair.
- The green carpet and some flooring has come to the end of its life.
- The projectors and screens in the church can be greatly improved.
- The physical accessibility of our church's interior needs to be improved.
- And beyond these much needed functional building improvements, we will be considering how we might make our church's interior even more beautiful.

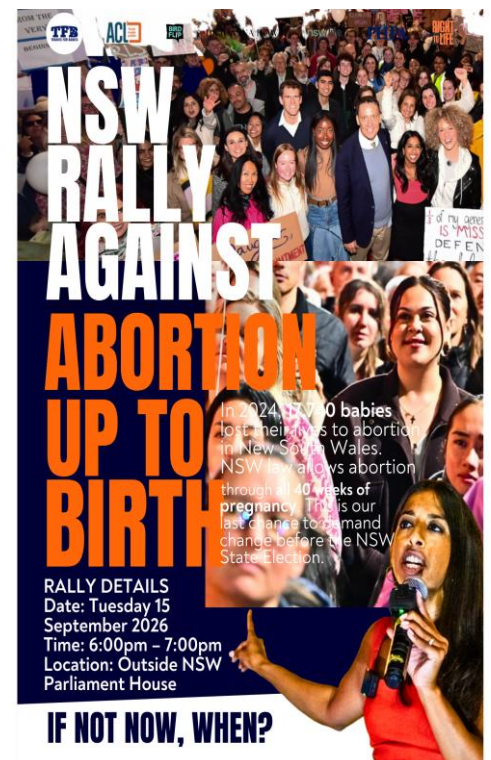

Our Lady of Dolours: A Four-part Series

Walking with Mary Through Her Seven Sorrows: The Sixth and Seventh Sorrows

Last week, we walked with Mary as **she met Jesus on the way to Calvary and stood at the foot of the Cross** through his Crucifixion and Death.

And when Jesus died, **Mary was still there.**

Now, in the final two Sorrows, the Cross has fallen silent. Mary receives the body of Jesus and accompanies him to the tomb.

The Sixth Sorrow: Mary Receives the Body of Jesus

In our own church of Our Lady of Dolours, the beautiful *Pietà* shows Mary holding Jesus after he is taken down from the Cross.

Imagine Mary holding her Son once more.

The Mother who welcomed his first breath has now witnessed his last.

Mary takes her Son into her arms and looks upon the face she knows so well.

This is her Son.

And Mary holds him.

There is no need to hurry this moment. Before Jesus is taken to the tomb, Mary has these final moments with her Son. Soon she will have to let him go. But not yet.

For some of us, this image may touch a grief of our own. We have sat beside someone nearing death, or said goodbye to someone we loved.

Grief has its own time. We may need to mourn, to remember and, in time, to place the person we love into God's hands.

The next time we pass the *Pietà* in our church, perhaps we might pause for a moment. Mary knows what it is to grieve someone she loves. We can bring our grief to her too.

The Seventh Sorrow: Jesus Is Laid in the Tomb

The Gospel tells us:

"Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth and laid it in his own new tomb."

Matthew 27:59–60

The stone is rolled into place. Jesus is on the other side. Mary has accompanied her Son as far as she can, and now she must leave him there.

And Mary lets go.

We too have had to say goodbye to people we love, and sometimes to hopes or dreams we had quietly imagined for ourselves.

Letting go does not mean we loved less. Often it hurts so much because we loved so deeply.

But the tomb will not have the final word.

But the story of Jesus does not end here. Beyond the tomb lies Resurrection and new life.

The Mother whose name we carry has known deep sorrow herself. Perhaps that is why we can bring our own sorrows to her so naturally.

Our Lady of Dolours, stay close to us in our times of sorrow. Be with us when we grieve and give us hope when we must let go. Lead us always to Jesus, our hope beyond the tomb.

As We Prepare for Our Parish Feast

As our journey through Mary's Seven Sorrows comes to a close, we are invited now to pray them together.

In preparation for her feast day on 15 September, we will pray a **Novena to Our Lady of Sorrows** from 6 September through 14 September at 8 p.m., via Zoom.

May these days of prayer draw us closer to the Mother whose name our parish carries and with her, ever closer to Jesus, our hope and our life.

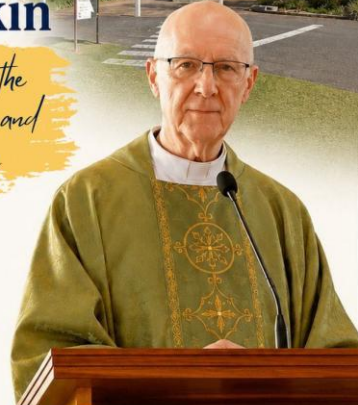
